6	(a) Be present in a school, on school grounds, or at

11	<u>or her designee; or</u>
12	(b) Be present on or in any vehicle or other conveyance
13	owned, leased, or contracted by a school without the written
14	permission of the principal of the school or his or her designee
15	when the vehicle is in use to transport students to or from a
16	school or school-sponsored activity or school-sponsored athletic
17	event, unless the vehicle is simultaneously made available to the

20	(a) School means a public, private, denominational, or

22	(b) Sexual predator means an individual who is required
23	to register under the Sex Offender Registration Act, who has
24	committed an aggravated offense as defined in section 29-4001.01,
25	and who has victimized a person eighteen years of age or younger.
