1	FOR	AN	ACT relating to arrests; to amend sections 28-1473 and
2			28-1474, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and
3			sections 37-1201 and 60-601, Revised Statutes Supplement,
4			2009; to require information obtained pursuant to arrest
5			for any felony or for flying, boating, or driving
6			under the influence be forwarded to federal immigration
7			authorities as prescribed; and to repeal the original
8			sections.

9 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 28-1473, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 28-1473 Any person arrested pursuant to sections 28-1465
- 4 to 28-1474 and section 3 of this act may, upon the direction of a
- 5 law enforcement officer, be required to submit to a chemical test
- 6 of his or her blood or breath for a determination of the alcohol
- 7 content. Any person who refuses to submit to a chemical blood
- 8 or breath test required pursuant to sections 28-1465 to 28-1474
- 9 shall be guilty of a crime and, upon conviction thereof, shall be
- 10 punished in the same manner as he or she would be if convicted for
- 11 a violation of section 28-1465.
- 12 Sec. 2. Section 28-1474, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 13 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 14 28-1474 Any person who is required to submit to a
- 15 preliminary breath test, or to a chemical blood or breath test
- 16 pursuant to sections 28-1465 to 28-1474 and section 3 of this act
- 17 shall be advised of the consequences of refusing to submit to such
- 18 test.
- 19 Sec. 3. A law enforcement agency which is notified by
- 20 a peace officer employed by the agency that the peace officer
- 21 arrested an individual pursuant to sections 28-1465 to 28-1474
- 22 shall forward to the Bureau of United States Citizenship and
- 23 Immigration Services of the United States Department of Homeland
- 24 Security any identifying information collected by the peace officer
- 25 or agency regarding the individual if the agency cannot determine

1 the individual's status as a legal resident or citizen of the

- 2 United States or its territories or if the agency reasonably
- 3 believes the individual's documentation regarding his or her status
- 4 is fraudulent. The information may include, but not be limited to,
- 5 fingerprints.
- 6 Sec. 4. A law enforcement agency which is notified by
- 7 a peace officer employed by the agency that the peace officer
- 8 arrested an individual for a felony shall forward to the Bureau of
- 9 United States Citizenship and Immigration Services of the United
- 10 States Department of Homeland Security any identifying information
- 11 collected by the peace officer or agency regarding the individual
- 12 if the agency cannot determine the individual's status as a legal
- 13 resident or citizen of the United States or its territories or
- 14 if the agency reasonably believes the individual's documentation
- 15 regarding his or her status is fraudulent. The information may
- 16 include, but not be limited to, fingerprints.
- 17 Sec. 5. Section 37-1201, Revised Statutes Supplement,
- 18 2009, is amended to read:
- 19 37-1201 Sections 37-1201 to 37-12,110 and section 6 of
- 20 this act shall be known and may be cited as the State Boat Act.
- 21 It is the policy of this state to promote safety for persons and
- 22 property in and connected with the use, operation, and equipment of
- 23 vessels and to promote uniformity of laws relating thereto.

- 25 a peace officer employed by the agency that the peace officer

1 arrested an individual for a violation of section 37-1254.01 or

- 2 for refusing a chemical test under section 37-1254.02 or any
- 3 local ordinance regarding boating under the influence of alcohol
- 4 or of any controlled substance shall forward to the Bureau of
- 5 United States Citizenship and Immigration Services of the United
- 6 States Department of Homeland Security any identifying information
- 7 collected by the peace officer or agency regarding the individual
- 8 if the agency cannot determine the individual's status as a legal
- 9 resident or citizen of the United States or its territories or
- 10 if the agency reasonably believes the individual's documentation
- 11 regarding his or her status is fraudulent. The information may
- 12 <u>include</u>, but not be limited to, fingerprints.
- 13 Sec. 7. Section 60-601, Revised Statutes Supplement,
- 14 2009, is amended to read:
- 15 60-601 Sections 60-601 to 60-6,378 and section 8 of this
- 16 act shall be known and may be cited as the Nebraska Rules of the
- 17 Road.
- 18 Sec. 8. A law enforcement agency which is notified by
- 19 a peace officer employed by the agency that the peace officer
- 20 arrested an individual for a violation of section 60-6,196 or
- 21 for refusing a chemical test under section 60-6,197 or any local
- 22 ordinance regarding driving under the influence of alcohol or of
- 23 any drug shall forward to the Bureau of United States Citizenship
- 24 and Immigration Services of the United States Department of
- 25 Homeland Security any identifying information collected by the

1 peace officer or agency regarding the individual if the agency

- 2 cannot determine the individual's status as a legal resident or
- 3 citizen of the United States or its territories or if the agency
- 4 reasonably believes the individual's documentation regarding his or
- 5 her status is fraudulent. The information may include, but not be
- 6 <u>limited to, fingerprints.</u>
- 7 Sec. 9. Original sections 28-1473 and 28-1474, Reissue
- 8 Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and sections 37-1201 and 60-601,
- 9 Revised Statutes Supplement, 2009, are repealed.
