## A BILL

1	FOR AN ACT relating to crimes and offenses; to amend sections
2	28-502, 28-503, and 28-504, Reissue Revised Statutes of
3	Nebraska; to change provisions relating to arson; and to
4	repeal the original sections.

5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 28-502, Reissue Revised Statutes of
 Nebraska, is amended to read:

LB 843

28-502 (1) A person commits arson in the first degree if he or she intentionally damages a building <u>or property contained</u> <u>within a building by starting a fire or causing an explosion</u> when another person is present in the building at the time and either (a) the actor knows that fact, or (b) the circumstances are such as to render the presence of a person therein a reasonable probability.

10 (2) A person commits arson in the first degree if a fire 11 is started or an explosion is caused in the perpetration of any 12 robbery, burglary, or felony criminal mischief when another person 13 is present in the building at the time and either (a) the actor 14 knows that fact, or (b) the circumstances are such as to render the 15 presence of a person therein a reasonable probability.

16 (3) Arson in the first degree is a Class II felony.
17 Sec. 2. Section 28-503, Reissue Revised Statutes of
18 Nebraska, is amended to read:

19 28-503 (1) A person commits arson in the second degree if 20 he or she intentionally damages a building <u>or property contained</u> 21 <u>within a building</u> by starting a fire or causing an explosion or if 22 a fire is started or an explosion is caused in the perpetration of 23 any robbery, burglary, or felony criminal mischief.

(2) The following affirmative defenses may be introducedinto evidence upon prosecution for a violation of this section:

1 (a) No person other than the accused has a security or 2 proprietary interest in the damaged building, or, if other persons 3 have such interests, all of them consented to his or her conduct; 4 or 5 (b) The accused's sole intent was to destroy or damage 6 the building for a lawful and proper purpose. 7 (3) Arson in the second degree is a Class III felony. 8 Sec. 3. Section 28-504, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read: 9 10 28-504 (1) A person commits arson in the third degree if 11 he or she intentionally sets fire to, burns, causes to be burned, 12 or by the use of any explosive, damages or destroys, or causes to 13 be damaged or destroyed, any property of another person without his 14 such other person's consent. Such property shall not be contained within a building and shall not be  $\tau$  other than a building or 15 16 occupied structure. 17 (2) Arson in the third degree is a Class IV felony if the 18 damages amount to one hundred dollars or more. 19 (3) Arson in the third degree is a Class I misdemeanor if 20 the damages are less than one hundred dollars. 21 Sec. 4. Original sections 28-502, 28-503, and 28-504, 22 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
