A BILL

- FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Liquor Control Act; to
 amend section 53-123.15, Revised Statutes Cumulative
 Supplement, 2008; to provide for a special shipping
 permit; to provide for a fee; and to repeal the original
 section.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 53-123.15, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:
- 3 53-123.15 (1) No person shall order or receive alcoholic
- 4 liquor in this state which has been shipped directly to him or her
- 5 from outside this state by any person other than a holder of a
- 6 shipping license issued by the commission, except that a licensed
- 7 wholesaler may receive not more than three gallons of wine in any
- 8 calendar year from any person who is not a holder of a shipping
- 9 license.
- 10 (2) The commission may issue a shipping license to
- 11 a manufacturer. Such license shall allow the licensee to ship
- 12 alcoholic liquor only to a licensed wholesaler, except that a
- 13 licensed wholesaler may, without a shipping license and for the
- 14 purposes of subdivision (2) of section 53-161, receive beer in
- 15 this state which has been shipped from outside the state by a
- 16 manufacturer in accordance with the Nebraska Liquor Control Act to
- 17 the wholesaler, then transported by the wholesaler to another state
- 18 for retail distribution, and then returned by the retailer to such
- 19 wholesaler.
- 20 (3) The commission may issue a shipping license to
- 21 any person who deals with vintage wines, which shipping license
- 22 shall allow the licensee to distribute such wines to a licensed
- 23 wholesaler in the state. For purposes of distributing vintage
- 24 wines, a licensed shipper must utilize a designated wholesaler if
- 25 the manufacturer has a designated wholesaler. For purposes of this

1 section, vintage wine shall mean a wine verified to be ten years

- 2 of age or older and not available from a primary American source
- 3 of supply.
- 4 (4) The commission may issue a shipping license to any
- 5 person who sells and ships alcoholic liquor from another state
- 6 directly to a consumer in this state. A person who receives a
- 7 license pursuant to this subsection shall pay the fee required in
- 8 subdivision (11) of section 53-124. Until April 30, 2012, such fee
- 9 shall be collected by the commission and remitted to the State
- 10 Treasurer for credit to the Winery and Grape Producers Promotional
- 11 Fund.
- 12 (5) The commission may issue a special shipping permit to
- 13 a manufacturer located outside of the State of Nebraska which does
- 14 not hold any other license under the Nebraska Liquor Control Act.
- 15 Such permit shall allow the holder to ship wine, beer, or spirits
- 16 from outside of the state only to a holder of a special designated
- 17 license pursuant to section 53-124.11. The permitholder is liable
- 18 for taxes due on the wine, beer, or spirits under sections 53-160
- 19 and 53-164.01. The commission shall issue the permit only for the
- 20 purpose of allowing a special designated license holder to import
- 21 wine, beer, or spirits for a special event, such as a tasting or
- 22 a festival. The permit shall be valid only for a period of time
- 23 designated by the commission to allow the shipment of the wine,
- 24 beer, or spirits to the special designated license holder for the
- 25 duration of the special event. The commission shall set the fee

1 for the permit at an amount which covers the expense of processing

- 2 the application for the permit, not to exceed fifty dollars. The
- 3 commission shall remit the fee to the State Treasurer for credit to
- 4 the General Fund.
- 5 (6) The application for a shipping license or special
- 6 shipping permit shall be in such form as the commission prescribes.
- 7 The application shall contain all provisions the commission deems
- 8 proper and necessary to effectuate the purpose of any section
- 9 of the act and the rules and regulations of the commission that
- 10 apply to manufacturers and shall include, but not be limited to,
- 11 provisions that the applicant, in consideration of the issuance of
- 12 such shipping license or special shipping permit, agrees:
- 13 (a) To comply with and be bound by section 53-164.01 in
- 14 making and filing reports, paying taxes, penalties, and interest,
- 15 and keeping records;
- 16 (b) To permit and be subject to all of the powers granted
- 17 by section 53-164.01 to the commission or its duly authorized
- 18 employees or agents for inspection and examination of the
- 19 applicant's premises and records and to pay the actual expenses,
- 20 excluding salary, reasonably attributable to such inspections and
- 21 examinations made by duly authorized employees of the commission
- 22 if within the United States; and
- 23 (c) That if the applicant violates any of the provisions
- 24 of the application, or the license or permit, any section of the
- 25 act, or any of the rules and regulations of the commission that

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1 apply to manufacturers, the commission may revoke or suspend such

- 2 shipping license or special shipping permit for such period of time
- 3 as it may determine.
