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60-1515 (1) The Legislature hereby finds and declares

2 that a statewide system for the collection, storage, and transfer 3 of data on vehicle titles and registration and the cooperation of state and local government in implementing such a system is 4 5 essential to the efficient operation of state and local government 6 in vehicle titling and registration.
