This bill, as amended, would change provisions relating to protection orders.

The Supreme Court estimates no fiscal impact and their response follows:

LB 310, as amended by AM965, could have an impact on judicial caseload from an increase in protection orders, but any increase is not expected to be significant.

The Department of Correctional Services (DCS) stated that the fiscal impact cannot be determined and their response follows:

Fiscal Impact - Indeterminable.

The impact on NDCS related to future admissions is not determinable.

The FY 11 per diem (cost per day of feeding, clothing, housing, medical, etc.) for an individual inmate was \$5,799 per year.

IMPACT ON POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS: Lancaster County states that with the amendment, the costs of new court appointed attorneys have been eliminated. Lancaster County further states that this amended bill still increases penalties for Protection Order violations. Given the large volume of protection order cases, this change could have a significant financial impact on the Lancaster County's criminal justice system. They further state that higher penalties require more time and effort system-wide. While it is difficult to estimate precisely, whenever penalties are increased, counties have greater costs for jury trials and for prosecutors and defense attorney's time.

Explanation of Estimate: With the amendment, the costs of new court appointed attorneys have been eliminated. However, the bill still increases penalties for Protection Order violations from a Class 2 misdemeanor to a Class 1 misdemeanor for first offense and to a Class 4 Felony for a second offense. Given the large volume of protection order cases, this change will have significant financial impact on the counties' criminal justice systems. Class I misdemeanors require more time and effort system wide than Class 2 misdemeanors and Class 4 Felonies require more time and effort t system wide than a misdemeanor. While it is difficult to estimate precisely, whenever the Legislature increases penalties in this manner counties have greater costs for jury trials, prosecutors' time, and defense attorneys time. Increasing the penalties has the effect of increasing the overall cost of the case because greater effort must be expended to resolve the case.
