A BILL

1 FOR AN ACT relating to motor carriers; to amend sections 75-302,
2 75-303, and 75-311, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska;
3 to define and redefine terms; to provide exemptions from
4 regulation for certain transportation service providers;
5 to harmonize provisions; to repeal the original sections;
6 and to declare an emergency.
7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 75-302, Reissue Revised Statutes of
2 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 75-302 For purposes of sections 75-301 to 75-322 and in
4 all rules and regulations adopted and promulgated by the commission
5 pursuant to such sections, unless the context otherwise requires:

6 (1) Attended services means an attendant or caregiver
7 accompanying a minor or persons who are physically, mentally, or
8 developmentally disabled and unable to travel or wait without
9 assistance or supervision;

10 ~~(1)~~(2) Carrier enforcement division means the carrier
11 enforcement division of the Nebraska State Patrol or the Nebraska
12 State Patrol;

13 ~~(2)~~(3) Certificate means a certificate of public
14 convenience and necessity issued under Chapter 75, article 3, to
15 common carriers by motor vehicle;

16 ~~(3)~~(4) Civil penalty means any monetary penalty assessed
17 by the commission or carrier enforcement division due to a violation
18 of Chapter 75, article 3, or section 75-126 as such section applies
19 to any person or carrier specified in Chapter 75, article 3; any
20 term, condition, or limitation of any certificate or permit issued
21 pursuant to Chapter 75, article 3; or any rule, regulation, or order
22 of the commission, the Division of Motor Carrier Services, or the
23 carrier enforcement division issued pursuant to Chapter 75, article
24 3;

25 ~~(4)~~(5) Commission means the Public Service Commission;

1 ~~(5)~~-(6) Common carrier means any person who or which
 2 undertakes to transport passengers or household goods for the general
 3 public in intrastate commerce by motor vehicle for hire, whether over
 4 regular or irregular routes, upon the highways of this state;

5 ~~(6)~~-(7) Contract carrier means any motor carrier which
 6 transports passengers or household goods for hire other than as a
 7 common carrier designed to meet the distinct needs of each individual
 8 customer or a specifically designated class of customers without any
 9 limitation as to the number of customers it can serve within the
 10 class;

11 ~~(7)~~-(8) Division of Motor Carrier Services means the
 12 Division of Motor Carrier Services of the Department of Motor
 13 Vehicles;

14 ~~(8) Escort services means an attendant or caregiver~~
 15 ~~accompanying a minor or persons who are physically, mentally, or~~
 16 ~~developmentally disabled and unable to travel or wait without~~
 17 ~~assistance or supervision;~~

18 (9) Highway means the roads, highways, streets, and ways
 19 in this state;

20 (10) Household goods means personal effects and property
 21 used or to be used in a dwelling, when a part of the equipment or
 22 supply of such dwelling, and similar property as the commission may
 23 provide by regulation if the transportation of such effects or
 24 property, is:

25 (a) Arranged and paid for by the householder, including

1 transportation of property from a factory or store when the property
2 is purchased by the householder with the intent to use in his or her
3 dwelling; or

4 (b) Arranged and paid for by another party;

5 (11) Intrastate commerce means commerce between any place
6 in this state and any other place in this state and not in part
7 through any other state;

8 (12) Licensed care transportation services means
9 transportation provided by an entity licensed by the Department of
10 Health and Human Services as a child-caring agency as defined in
11 section 71-1902 or child-placing agency as defined in such section or
12 a child care facility licensed under the Child Care Licensing Act to
13 a client of the entity or facility when the person providing
14 transportation services also assists and supervises the passenger or,
15 if the client is a minor, to a family member of a minor when it is
16 necessary for agency or facility staff to accompany or facilitate the
17 transportation in order to provide necessary services and support to
18 the minor. Licensed care transportation services must be incidental
19 to and in furtherance of the social services provided by the entity
20 or facility to the transported client;

21 ~~(12)~~-(13) Motor carrier means any person other than a
22 regulated motor carrier who or which owns, controls, manages,
23 operates, or causes to be operated any motor vehicle used to
24 transport passengers or property over any public highway in this
25 state;

1 ~~(13)~~(14) Motor vehicle means any vehicle, machine,
2 tractor, trailer, or semitrailer propelled or drawn by mechanical
3 power and used upon the highways in the transportation of passengers
4 or property but does not include any vehicle, locomotive, or car
5 operated exclusively on a rail or rails;

6 ~~(14)~~(15) Permit means a permit issued under Chapter 75,
7 article 3, to contract carriers by motor vehicle;

8 ~~(15)~~(16) Person means any individual, firm, partnership,
9 limited liability company, corporation, company, association, or
10 joint-stock association and includes any trustee, receiver, assignee,
11 or personal representative thereof;

12 ~~(16)~~(17) Private carrier means any motor carrier which
13 owns, controls, manages, operates, or causes to be operated a motor
14 vehicle to transport passengers or property to or from its facility,
15 plant, or place of business or to deliver to purchasers its products,
16 supplies, or raw materials (a) when such transportation is within the
17 scope of and furthers a primary business of the carrier other than
18 transportation and (b) when not for hire. Nothing in sections 75-301
19 to 75-322 shall apply to private carriers; ~~and~~

20 ~~(17)~~(18) Regulated motor carrier means any person who or
21 which owns, controls, manages, operates, or causes to be operated any
22 motor vehicle used to transport passengers, other than those excepted
23 under section 75-303, or household goods over any public highway in
24 this state; -

25 (19) Residential care means care for a minor or a person

1 who is physically, mentally, or developmentally disabled who resides
2 in a residential home or facility regulated by the Department of
3 Health and Human Services, including, but not limited to, a foster
4 home, treatment facility, group home, or shelter;

5 (20) Residential care transportation services means
6 transportation services to persons in residential care when such
7 residential care transportation services and residential care are
8 provided as part of a services contract with the Department of Health
9 and Human Services or pursuant to a subcontract entered into incident
10 to a services contract with the department; and

11 (21) Supported transportation services means
12 transportation services to a minor or for a person who is physically,
13 mentally, or developmentally disabled when the person providing
14 transportation services also assists and supervises the passenger or
15 transportation services to a family member of a minor when it is
16 necessary for provider staff to accompany or facilitate the
17 transportation in order to provide necessary services and support to
18 the minor. Supported transportation services must be provided as part
19 of a services contract with the Department of Health and Human
20 Services or pursuant to a subcontract entered into incident to a
21 services contract with the department, and the driver must meet
22 department requirements for (a) training or experience working with
23 minors or persons who are physically, mentally, or developmentally
24 disabled, (b) training with regard to the specific needs of the
25 client served, (c) reporting to the department, and (d) age.

1 Assisting and supervising the passenger shall not necessarily require
2 the person providing transportation services to stay with the
3 passenger after the transportation services have been provided.

4 Sec. 2. Section 75-303, Reissue Revised Statutes of
5 Nebraska, is amended to read:

6 75-303 Sections 75-301 to 75-322 shall apply to
7 transportation by a motor carrier or the transportation of passengers
8 and household goods by a regulated motor carrier for hire in
9 intrastate commerce except for the following:

10 (1) A motor carrier for hire in the transportation of
11 school children and teachers to and from school;

12 (2) A motor carrier for hire operated in connection with
13 a part of a streetcar system;

14 (3) An ambulance, ambulance owner, hearse, or automobile
15 used exclusively as an incident to conducting a funeral;

16 (4) A motor carrier exempt by subdivision (1) of this
17 section which hauls for hire (a) persons of a religious, fraternal,
18 educational, or charitable organization, (b) pupils of a school to
19 athletic events, (c) players of American Legion baseball teams when
20 the point of origin or termination is within five miles of the
21 domicile of the carrier, and (d) the elderly as defined in section
22 13-1203 and their spouses and dependents under a contract with a
23 municipality or county authorized in section 13-1208;

24 (5) A motor carrier operated by a city and engaged in the
25 transportation of passengers, and such exempt operations shall be no

1 broader than those authorized in intrastate commerce at the time the
2 city or other political subdivision assumed ownership of the
3 operation;

4 (6) A motor vehicle owned and operated by a nonprofit
5 organization which is exempt from payment of federal income taxes, as
6 provided by section 501(c)(4), Internal Revenue Code, transporting
7 solely persons over age sixty, persons who are spouses and dependents
8 of persons over age sixty, and handicapped persons;

9 (7) A motor carrier engaged in the transportation of
10 passengers operated by a transit authority created under and acting
11 pursuant to the laws of the State of Nebraska;

12 (8) A motor carrier operated by a municipality or county,
13 as authorized in section 13-1208, in the transportation of elderly
14 persons;

15 (9) A motor vehicle having a seating capacity of twenty
16 or less which is operated by a governmental subdivision or a
17 qualified public-purpose organization as defined in section 13-1203
18 engaged in the transportation of passengers in the state;

19 (10) A motor vehicle owned and operated by a nonprofit
20 entity organized for the purpose of furnishing electric service; ~~and~~

21 (11) A motor carrier engaged in ~~escort~~ attended services
22 ~~and~~ under contract or subcontract with the Department of Health and
23 Human Services or with any agency organized under the Nebraska
24 Community Aging Services Act; -

25 (12) A motor carrier engaged in residential care

1 transportation services if the motor carrier complies with the
2 requirements of the Department of Health and Human Services adopted,
3 promulgated, and enforced to protect the safety and well-being of the
4 passengers, including insurance, training, and age requirements;

5 (13) A motor carrier engaged in supported transportation
6 services if the motor carrier complies with the requirements of the
7 Department of Health and Human Services adopted, promulgated, and
8 enforced to protect the safety and well-being of the passengers,
9 including insurance, training, and age requirements; and

10 (14) A motor carrier engaged in licensed care
11 transportation services if the motor carrier files a certificate with
12 the commission that such provider meets the minimum driver standards,
13 insurance requirements, and equipment standards prescribed by the
14 commission. Insurance requirements established by the commission
15 shall be consistent with the insurance requirements established by
16 the Department of Health and Human Services for attended services,
17 residential care transportation services, and supported
18 transportation services.

19 Sec. 3. Section 75-311, Reissue Revised Statutes of
20 Nebraska, is amended to read:

21 75-311 (1) A certificate shall be issued to any qualified
22 applicant authorizing the whole or any part of the operations covered
23 by the application if it is found after notice and hearing that (a)
24 the applicant is fit, willing, and able properly to perform the
25 service proposed and to conform to the provisions of sections 75-301

1 to 75-322 and the requirements, rules, and regulations of the
2 commission under such sections and (b) the proposed service, to the
3 extent to be authorized by the certificate, whether regular or
4 irregular, passenger or household goods, is or will be required by
5 the present or future public convenience and necessity. Otherwise the
6 application shall be denied.

7 (2) A permit shall be issued to any qualified applicant
8 therefor authorizing in whole or in part the operations covered by
9 the application if it appears after notice and hearing from the
10 application or from any hearing held on the application that (a) the
11 applicant is fit, willing, and able properly to perform the service
12 of a contract carrier by motor vehicle and to conform to the
13 provisions of such sections and the lawful requirements, rules, and
14 regulations of the commission under such sections and (b) the
15 proposed operation, to the extent authorized by the permit, will be
16 consistent with the public interest by providing services designed to
17 meet the distinct needs of each individual customer or a specifically
18 designated class of customers as defined in subdivision ~~(6)~~(7) of
19 section 75-302. Otherwise the application shall be denied.

20 (3) No person shall at the same time hold a certificate
21 as a common carrier and a permit as a contract carrier for
22 transportation of household goods by motor vehicles over the same
23 route or within the same territory unless the commission finds that
24 it is consistent with the public interest and with the policy
25 declared in section 75-301.

1 (4) After the issuance of a certificate or permit, the
2 commission shall review the operations of all common or contract
3 carriers who hold authority from the commission to determine whether
4 there are insufficient operations in the transportation of household
5 goods to justify the commission's finding that such common or
6 contract carrier has willfully failed to perform transportation under
7 sections 75-301 to 75-322 and rules and regulations promulgated under
8 such sections. If the commission determines that there are
9 insufficient operations, then the commission shall commence
10 proceedings under section 75-315 to revoke the certificate or permit
11 involved.

12 (5) This section shall not apply to operations pursuant
13 to a contract authorized by sections 75-303.01 and 75-303.02.

14 Sec. 4. Original sections 75-302, 75-303, and 75-311,
15 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.

16 Sec. 5. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
17 when passed and approved according to law.
