A BILL

FOR AN ACT relating to fires; to amend sections 81-520.01, 81-520.03, 81-520.04, and 81-520.05, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change provisions relating to burning permits and range-management burning; to provide for land-management burning; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original sections.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 81-520.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 81-520.01 (1) There shall be a statewide open burning ban
- 4 on all bonfires, outdoor rubbish fires, and fires for the purpose of
- 5 clearing land.
- 6 (2) The fire chief of a local fire department or his or
- 7 her designee may waive an open burning ban under subsection (1) of
- 8 this section for an area under his or her the local fire department's
- 9 jurisdiction by issuing an open burning permit to a person requesting
- 10 permission to conduct open burning. The permit issued by the fire
- 11 chief or his or her designee to a person desiring to conduct open
- 12 burning shall be in writing, signed by the fire chief, or his or her
- 13 designee, and on a form prescribed by the State Fire Marshal. The
- 14 State Fire Marshal shall provide local fire departments with such
- 15 forms.
- 16 (3) The fire chief of a local fire department or his or
- 17 her designee may waive the open burning ban in his or her the local
- 18 <u>fire department's</u> jurisdiction when conditions are acceptable to the
- 19 chief. or his or her designee. Anyone burning intending to burn in
- 20 such jurisdiction when the open burning ban has been waived shall
- 21 notify the fire department chief of his or her intention to burn
- 22 prior to starting the burn.
- 23 (4) The fire chief of a local fire department may adopt
- 24 and promulgate rules and regulations standards listing the conditions
- 25 acceptable for issuing a permit to conduct open burning under

- 1 subsection (2) of this section.
- 2 (5) The local fire department may charge a fee, not to
- 3 exceed ten dollars, for each such permit issued. This fee shall be
- 4 remitted to the governing body for inclusion in the general funds
- 5 allocated to the fire department. Such funds shall not reduce the tax
- 6 requirements for the fire department. No such fee shall be collected
- 7 from any state or political subdivision to which such a permit is
- 8 issued to conduct open burning under subsection (2) of this section
- 9 in the course of such state's or political subdivision's official
- 10 duties.
- 11 Sec. 2. Section 81-520.03, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 12 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 13 81-520.03 <u>(1) For purposes of sections 81-520.01 to</u>
- 14 81-520.05, the fire chief of a local fire department may designate a
- 15 member of the local fire department to share the powers and duties of
- 16 the fire chief under such sections, except adopting standards
- pursuant to subsection (4) of section 81-520.01.
- 18 <u>(2)</u> For purposes of sections 81-520.04 and 81-520.05,
- 20 controlled application of fire to existing vegetative matter on land
- 21 utilized for grazing, pasture, forests, or grassland to control
- 22 weeds, pests, insects, and disease, prevent wildland fires, manage
- 23 <u>watersheds</u>, care for windbreaks, and conduct scientific research.
- Sec. 3. Section 81-520.04, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 25 Nebraska, is amended to read:

1 81-520.04 The fire chief of a local fire department or

- 2 his or her designee may waive an open burning ban under subsection
- 3 (1) of section 81-520.01 by issuing a permit for range-management
- 4 land-management burning only if the range-management land-management
- 5 burning is to be conducted in accordance with section 81-520.05.
- 6 Sec. 4. Section 81-520.05, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 7 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 8 81-520.05 (1) A landowner, tenant, or other landowner's
- 9 agent of the land where range management_land-management_burning is
- 10 proposed shall file an application for a permit and a plan for
- 11 conducting such burning. The plan shall include:
- 12 (a) The name of the landowner of the land on which range-
- 13 <u>management_land-management_burning</u> is to occur;
- 14 (b) The name of the person who will supervise the range-
- 15 <u>management_land-management_burning</u> if such person is different than
- 16 the landowner;
- 17 (c) The land-management objective to be accomplished;
- 18 (d) A map showing the areas to be burned, including
- 19 natural and manmade firebreaks;
- 20 (e) Procedures to be used to confine the fire in boundary
- 21 areas without preexisting firebreaks;
- 22 (f) A list of equipment that will be on hand;
- 23 (g) The types and conditions of the vegetative matter to
- 24 be burned on the land and in adjacent areas;
- 25 (h) Identification of roads and habitations that may be

- 1 affected by smoke;
- 2 (i) A description of weather conditions believed to be
- 3 required to safely and successfully conduct the range-management
- 4 <u>land-management</u> burning, including wind speed and direction,
- 5 temperature, and relative humidity; and
- 6 (j) Such other information as may be prescribed by the
- 7 fire chief of a local fire department.
- 8 (2) The fire chief of a local fire department or his or
- 9 her designee shall evaluate each plan to determine its compliance
- 10 with subsection (1) of this section. If a plan fails to comply with
- 11 all provisions of such subsection, a permit for range-management
- 12 <u>land-management</u> burning shall not be issued.
- 13 (3) The fire chief of a local fire department or his or
- 14 her designee shall issue a permit for range-management land-
- 15 <u>management</u> burning if (a) the plan complies with subsection (1) of
- 16 this section and (b) the fire chief or his or her designee determines
- 17 that range management land-management burning conducted in accordance
- 18 with the plan would be conducted with due regard for the safety of
- 19 people and property outside the burning areas. No permit shall be
- 20 valid for more than thirty days.
- 21 Sec. 5. Original sections 81-520.01, 81-520.03,
- 22 81-520.04, and 81-520.05, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, are
- 23 repealed.
