A BILL

- FOR AN ACT relating to the Veterinary Medicine and Surgery Practice

 Act; to amend section 38-3321, Revised Statutes

 Cumulative Supplement, 2010; to provide exceptions for transplantation of bovine embryos; and to repeal the original section.
- Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 38-3321, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2010, is amended to read:
- 3 38-3321 No person may practice veterinary medicine and
- 4 surgery in the state who is not a licensed veterinarian, no person
- 5 may perform delegated animal health care tasks in the state who is
- 6 not a licensed veterinary technician or an unlicensed assistant
- 7 performing such tasks within the limits established under subdivision
- 8 (2) of section 38-3326, and no person may perform health care therapy
- 9 on animals in the state who is not a licensed animal therapist. The
- 10 Veterinary Medicine and Surgery Practice Act shall not be construed
- 11 to prohibit:
- 12 (1) An employee of the federal, state, or local
- 13 government from performing his or her official duties;
- 14 (2) A person who is a student in a veterinary school from
- 15 performing duties or actions assigned by his or her instructors or
- 16 from working under the direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian;
- 17 (3) A person who is a student in an approved veterinary
- 18 technician program from performing duties or actions assigned by his
- 19 or her instructors or from working under the direct supervision of a
- 20 licensed veterinarian or a licensed veterinary technician;
- 21 (4) Any merchant or manufacturer from selling feed or
- 22 feeds whether medicated or nonmedicated;
- 23 (5) A veterinarian regularly licensed in another state
- 24 from consulting with a licensed veterinarian in this state;
- 25 (6) Any merchant or manufacturer from selling from his or

1 her established place of business medicines, appliances, or other

- 2 products used in the prevention or treatment of animal diseases or
- 3 any merchant or manufacturer's representative from conducting
- 4 educational meetings to explain the use of his or her products or
- 5 from investigating and advising on problems developing from the use
- 6 of his or her products;
- 7 (7) An owner of livestock or a bona fide farm or ranch
- 8 employee from performing any act of vaccination, surgery, pregnancy
- 9 testing, retrievable transplantation of embryos on bovine, including
- 10 recovering, freezing, and transferring embryos on bovine, or the
- 11 administration of drugs in the treatment of domestic animals under
- 12 his or her custody or ownership nor the exchange of services between
- 13 persons or bona fide employees who are principally farm or ranch
- 14 operators or employees in the performance of these acts;
- 15 (8) A member of the faculty of a veterinary school or
- 16 veterinary science department from performing his or her regular
- 17 functions, or a person lecturing or giving instructions or
- 18 demonstrations at a veterinary school or veterinary science
- 19 department or in connection with a continuing competency activity;
- 20 (9) Any person from selling or applying any pesticide,
- 21 insecticide, or herbicide;
- 22 (10) Any person from engaging in bona fide scientific
- 23 research which reasonably requires experimentation involving animals;
- 24 (11) Any person from treating or in any manner caring for
- 25 domestic chickens, turkeys, or waterfowl, which are specifically

- 1 exempted from the Veterinary Medicine and Surgery Practice Act;
- 2 (12) Any person from performing dehorning or castrating
- 3 livestock, not to include equidae.
- 4 For purposes of the Veterinary Medicine and Surgery
- 5 Practice Act, castration shall be limited to the removal or
- 6 destruction of male testes; or
- 7 (13) Any person who holds a valid credential in the State
- 8 of Nebraska in a health care profession or occupation regulated under
- 9 the Uniform Credentialing Act from consulting with a licensed
- 10 veterinarian or performing collaborative animal health care tasks on
- 11 an animal under the care of such veterinarian if all such tasks are
- 12 performed under the immediate supervision of such veterinarian; or -
- 13 (14) A person from performing a retrievable
- 14 transplantation of embryos on bovine, including recovering, freezing,
- 15 and transferring embryos on bovine, if the procedure is being
- 16 performed by a person who (a) holds a doctorate degree in animal
- 17 science with an emphasis in reproductive physiology from an
- 18 accredited college or university and (b) has and can show proof of
- 19 <u>valid professional liability insurance.</u>
