## A BILL

1	OR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Pure Food Act; to amend sections
2	81-2,239, 81-2,244.01, 81-2,257, 81-2,259, 81-2,270,
3	81-2,271, and 81-2,277, Reissue Revised Statutes of
4	Nebraska; to change and eliminate food establishment and
5	food safety provisions; to harmonize provisions; to
6	repeal the original sections; to outright repeal sections
7	81-2,272.02, 81-2,272.17, and 81-2,272.36, Reissue
8	Revised Statutes of Nebraska; and to declare an
9	emergency.

10 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 81-2,239, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 15 operation, without a valid permit which sets forth the types of
- 16 operation occurring within the establishment.
- 17 (2) Application for a permit shall be made to the
- 18 director on forms prescribed and furnished by the department. Such
- 19 application shall include the applicant's full name and mailing
- 20 address, the names and addresses of any partners, members, or
- 21 corporate officers, the name and address of the person authorized by
- 22 the applicant to receive the notices and orders of the department as
- 23 provided in the Nebraska Pure Food Act, whether the applicant is an
- 24 individual, partnership, limited liability company, corporation, or
- 25 other legal entity, the location and type of proposed establishment

1 or operation, and the signature of the applicant. Application for a

- 2 permit shall be made prior to the operation of a food establishment,
- 3 food processing plant, or salvage operation. The application shall be
- 4 accompanied by an initial permit fee and an initial inspection fee in
- 5 the same amount as the annual inspection fee if inspections are
- 6 required to be done by the department. If the food establishment,
- 7 food processing plant, or salvage operation has been in operation
- 8 prior to applying for a permit or notifying the regulatory authority,
- 9 the applicant shall pay an additional fee of sixty dollars.
- 10 (3) Payment of the initial permit fee, the initial
- 11 inspection fee, and the fee for failing to apply for a permit prior
- 12 to operation shall not preclude payment of the annual inspection fees
- due on August 1 of each year. Except as provided in subsections (7)
- 14 through (10) of this section and subsection (1) of section 81-2,281,
- 15 a permitholder shall pay annual inspection fees on or before August 1
- 16 of each year regardless of when the initial permit was obtained.
- 17 (4)(a) The director shall set the initial permit fee and
- 18 the annual inspection fees on or before July 1 of each fiscal year to
- 19 meet the criteria in this subsection. The director may raise or lower
- 20 the fees each year, but the fees shall not exceed the maximum fees
- 21 listed in subdivision (4)(b) of this section. The director shall
- 22 determine the fees based on estimated annual revenue and fiscal year-
- 23 end cash fund balance as follows:
- 24 (i) The estimated annual revenue shall not be greater
- 25 than one hundred seven percent of program cash fund appropriations

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- 2 (ii) The estimated fiscal year-end cash fund balance
- 3 shall not be greater than seventeen percent of program cash fund
- 4 appropriations allocated for the act; and
- 5 (iii) All fee increases or decreases shall be equally
- 6 distributed between all categories.

- 2 (5) If a food establishment is engaged in more than one
- 3 food handling activity listed in subsection (4) of this section, the
- 4 inspection fee charged shall be based upon the primary activity
- 5 conducted within the food establishment as determined by the
- 6 department and any fees assessed for each additional food preparation
- 7 area within the primary establishment as determined by the
- 8 department.
- 9 (6) If a person fails to pay the inspection fee for more
- 10 than one month after the fee is due, such person shall pay a late fee
- 11 equal to fifty percent of the total fee for the first month that the
- 12 fee is late and one hundred percent for the second month that the fee
- 13 is late. The purpose of the late fee is to cover the administrative
- 14 costs associated with collecting fees. All money collected as a late
- 15 fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the Pure
- 16 Food Cash Fund.
- 17 (7) An educational institution, health care facility,
- 18 nursing home, or governmental organization operating any type of food
- 19 establishment, other than a mobile food unit or pushcart, is exempt
- 20 from the requirements in subsections (1) through (6) of this section.
- 21 (8) A person whose primary food-related business activity
- 22 is determined by the department to be egg handling within the meaning
- 23 of the Nebraska Graded Egg Act and who is validly licensed and paying
- 24 fees pursuant to such act is exempt from the permit and inspection
- 25 fee requirements of the Nebraska Pure Food Act.

1 (9) A person holding a permit or license and regulated

- 2 under the Nebraska Milk Act and an egg handler licensed and regulated
- 3 under the Nebraska Graded Egg Act are exempt from the Nebraska Pure
- 4 Food Act.
- 5 (10) A single event food vendor or a religious,
- 6 charitable, or fraternal organization operating any type of temporary
- 7 food establishment, mobile food unit, or pushcart is exempt from the
- 8 requirements of subsections (1) through (6) of this section. Any such
- 9 organization operating any nontemporary food establishment prior to
- 10 July 1, 1985, is exempt from the requirements of subsection (2) of
- 11 this section.
- 12 Sec. 6. Section 81-2,271, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 13 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 14 81-2,271 (1) The permit required by section 81-2,270
- 15 shall be posted in a location in the food establishment, food
- 16 processing plant, or salvage operation which is conspicuous to the
- 17 public. A salvage operation shall also have a copy of the permit in
- 18 each vehicle.
- 19 (2) The permit is not transferable to any other person or
- 20 location. Any permit issued lapses automatically upon a change of
- 21 ownership or location except as provided in subsection (3) of this
- 22 section. The permitholder shall notify the department in writing at
- 23 least thirty days prior to any change in ownership, name, or address.
- 24 The permitholder shall notify the department in writing before there
- 25 is a change of the name or address of the person authorized to

1 receive the notices and orders of the department. When an

- 2 establishment is to be permanently closed, the permitholder shall
- 3 return the permit to the department within one week after the
- 4 closing.
- 5 (3) A mobile food unit, pushcart, or vending machine may
- 6 be moved if the permitholder is able to provide the location of such
- 7 unit, pushcart, or machine to the regulatory authority upon request
- 8 and the person authorized by the permitholder to receive notices and
- 9 orders of the department maintains a permanent mailing address on
- 10 file with the department.
- 11 (4) Every mobile food unit or pushcart operator shall
- 12 have a copy of their permit to operate available at the mobile food
- 13 <u>unit or pushcart when in operation.</u>
- Sec. 7. (1) Except during preparation, cooking, or
- 15 <u>cooling or when time is used as the public health control as</u>
- 16 specified under the Nebraska Pure Food Act and except as specified
- 17 under subsection (2) of this section, potentially hazardous food
- 18 (time and temperature control for safety food) shall be maintained:
- 19 (a) At one hundred thirty-five degrees Fahrenheit (fifty-
- 20 <u>seven degrees Celsius) or above, except that roasts cooked to a</u>
- 21 temperature and for a time specified in the Nebraska Pure Food Act or
- 22 reheated as specified in the act may be held at a temperature of one
- 23 <u>hundred thirty degrees Fahrenheit (fifty-four degrees Celsius) or</u>
- 24 <u>above; or</u>
- 25 <u>(b) At:</u>

1 (i) Forty-one degrees Fahrenheit (five degrees Celsius)
2 or less; or

- 3 <u>(ii) Forty-five degrees Fahrenheit (seven degrees</u>
- 4 <u>Celsius</u>) or between forty-one degrees Fahrenheit (five degrees
- 5 <u>Celsius</u>) and forty-five degrees Fahrenheit (seven degrees Celsius) in
- 6 existing refrigeration equipment that is not capable of maintaining
- 7 the food at forty-one degrees Fahrenheit (five degrees Celsius) or
- 8 less if:
- 9 (A) The equipment is in place and in use in the food
- 10 <u>establishment; and</u>
- 11 (B) Refrigeration equipment that is not capable of
- 12 meeting a cold holding temperature of forty-one degrees Fahrenheit
- 13 (five degrees Celsius) that is in use on the effective date of this
- 14 act shall, upon replacement of the equipment or at a change of
- 15 ownership of the food establishment, be replaced with equipment that
- 16 is capable of maintaining foods at forty-one degrees Fahrenheit (five
- 17 degrees Celsius) or below.
- 18 (2) Eggs that have not been treated to destroy all viable
- 19 Salmonellae shall be stored in refrigerated equipment that maintains
- 20 an ambient air temperature of forty-five degrees Fahrenheit (seven
- 21 <u>degrees Celsius</u>) or less.
- 22 (3) Potentially hazardous food (time and temperature
- 23 control for safety food) in a homogenous liquid form may be
- 24 maintained outside of the temperature control requirements, as
- 25 specified under subsection (1) of this section, while contained

1 within specially designed equipment that complies with the design and

- 2 <u>construction requirements as specified in the act.</u>
- 3 Sec. 8. Section 81-2,277, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 4 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 5 81-2,277 Food processing plants shall comply with the
- 6 federal Current Good Manufacturing Practice In Manufacturing,
- 7 Packing, or Holding Human Food found in 21 C.F.R. part 110 as it
- 8 exists on August 28, 1999. existed on April 1, 2011.
- 9 Sec. 9. Original sections 81-2,239, 81-2,244.01,
- 10 81-2,257, 81-2,259, 81-2,270, 81-2,271, and 81-2,277, Reissue Revised
- 11 Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
- 12 Sec. 10. The following sections are outright repealed:

- Sec. 11. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
