A BILL

1	FOR AN ACT relating to the government; to amend section 71-6405,
2	Revised Statutes Supplement, 2011; to create the Building
3	Code Advisory Committee; to provide for membership; to
4	provide powers and duties; to provide for expenses; to
5	change and eliminate provisions relating to compliance
6	with and amendments to the state building code by state
7	agencies; and to repeal the original section.
8	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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- 2 created. The State Fire Marshal or his or her designee shall serve as
- 3 a voting member of the advisory committee. The Governor shall appoint
- 4 the following members to the advisory committee, subject to the
- 5 approval of the Legislature:
- 6 (a) A representative of the heating, ventilation, and air
- 7 <u>conditioning industry;</u>
- 8 <u>(b) A representative of home builders;</u>
- 9 (c) An architect who has been involved with projects
- 10 certified by the United States Green Building Council as meeting the
- 11 <u>criteria for Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design</u>
- 12 <u>certification;</u>
- 13 (d) A member of a union for plumbing and building
- 14 laborers;
- (e) A representative of the sustainability industry;
- 16 (f) A representative of the building and planning
- 17 department of city of the primary class;
- 18 (g) A representative of the building and planning
- 19 department of a city of the metropolitan class;
- 20 (h) A representative of the plumbing board of a city of
- 21 the primary class;
- 22 (i) A representative of the plumbing board of a city of
- 23 the metropolitan class;
- 24 (j) A representative of the Nebraska Code Officials
- 25 Association; and

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(k) Three representatives of cities of the first and 1 second class and villages which have adopted the state building code. 2 3 (2) The Governor shall appoint the initial members of the 4 advisory committee by September 1, 2012, and shall designate one-half 5 of the initial members to serve a two-year term. All other appointments shall be for three-year terms. Terms shall begin on 6 7 October 1. The members of the advisory committee shall annually elect 8 one of the voting members as chairperson of the advisory committee. 9 The Governor shall appoint a member to serve in case of a vacancy in 10 the membership of the advisory committee, subject to the approval of the Legislature. Any person appointed to fill a vacancy shall meet 11 12 the same eligibility requirements as the person whose position is 13 vacant and shall be appointed for the unexpired term. 14 (3) The advisory committee shall meet at least once each calendar quarter at the call of the chairperson of the advisory 15 16 committee. The chairperson shall cause notice of any meeting to be delivered to each member of the advisory committee. A quorum of more 17 than one-half of the members shall be required at any meeting at 18 19 which recommendations are adopted or at which an annual report is 20 discussed or adopted. 21 (4) The advisory committee may consult with experts in 22 the fields of plumbing, home building, commercial construction, energy efficiency, architecture, mechanical engineering, structural 23 engineering, electrical engineering, insurance, sustainability, fire 24 suppression, heating, ventilation, and air conditioning and other 25

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1 relevant fields as necessary. The advisory committee shall review and

- 2 make recommendations to the Legislature regarding adoption of new
- 3 <u>editions of construction</u>, plumbing, energy, and other statutorily
- 4 referenced codes. The advisory committee shall review other codes as
- 5 requested by the Legislature.
- 6 (5) The members of the advisory committee shall receive
- 7 no compensation for their services on the advisory committee but may
- 8 be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses incurred in
- 9 performing their duties as provided in sections 81-1174 to 81-1177.
- 10 The State Fire Marshal shall provide staff support for the advisory
- 11 committee. The expenses of the advisory committee shall be part of
- 12 <u>the budget of the State Fire Marshal.</u>
- Sec. 2. Section 71-6405, Revised Statutes Supplement,
- 14 2011, is amended to read:
- 15 71-6405 All state agencies, including all state
- 16 constitutional offices, state administrative departments, and state
- 17 boards and commissions, the University of Nebraska, and the Nebraska
- 18 state colleges, shall comply with the state building code, except
- 19 that state agencies shall comply with applicable local building or
- 20 construction codes if the codes meet or exceed the standards of the
- 21 state building code and if the political subdivision regularly
- 22 updates its local building or construction code under a program of
- 23 periodic review and adoption as permitted under section 71-6406. No
- 24 state agency may adopt, promulgate, or enforce any rule or regulation
- 25 in conflict with the state building code unless otherwise

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specifically authorized by statute to adopt or enforce a building or 1 2 construction code other than the state building code. Nothing in the 3 Building Construction Act shall authorize any state agency to apply such act to manufactured homes or recreational vehicles regulated by 4 5 the Uniform Standard Code for Manufactured Homes and Recreational 6 Vehicles or to modular housing units regulated by the Nebraska 7 Uniform Standards for Modular Housing Units Act. A state agency may, 8 by rule or regulation, amend the state building code by adopting any 9 supplement or appendix of the International Building Code (IBC), 2009 10 edition, International Residential Code (IRC), 2009 edition, or the 11 International Existing Building Code, 2009 edition, referred to in 12 section 71 6403, except that all amendments shall be approved in 13 advance by the Director of Administrative Services. Amendments to the 14 state building code may also include variations from the code which 15 will reduce unnecessary costs of construction, increase safety, 16 durability, or efficiency, or address special local conditions within the state and may include adoption of section R313 of the 2009 17 edition of the International Residential Code. 18 3. Original section 71-6405, Revised Statutes 19 20 Supplement, 2011, is repealed.
