A BILL

1	FOR AN ACT relating to children; to create and provide duties for the
2	Children's Health Advisory Committee; to provide duties
3	for the chief executive officer of the Department of
4	Health and Human Services and the Commissioner of
5	Education; to provide for and require schools to
6	implement nutrition and physical activity standards; and
7	to provide for rules and regulations.
8	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1	Section 1.	(1)) The	Children's	Health	Advisory	Committee

- 2 is created. The committee's purpose is to research, identify, and
- 3 recommend policy standards aimed at reducing childhood obesity and
- 4 increasing healthful choices and lifestyles in the Nebraska public
- 5 school system. The committee shall consist of fourteen members
- 6 appointed not later than three months after the effective date of
- 7 this act, as provided in section 2 of this act.
- 8 Sec. 2. (1) The chief executive officer of the Department
- 9 of Health and Human Services shall appoint the following members to
- 10 <u>the Children's Health Advisory Committee:</u>
- 11 (a) One member from the Nebraska Medical Association;
- 12 <u>(b) One member from the Nebraska chapter of the American</u>
- 13 <u>Academy of Pediatrics</u>;
- 14 (c) One member from the Nebraska Dietetic Association;
- 15 <u>(d) One member from the Nebraska Academy of Family</u>
- 16 Physicians;
- 17 (e) One member from the administration or staff of the
- 18 <u>University of Nebraska Medical Center;</u>
- 19 (f) One member from the Division of Public Health of the
- 20 department; and
- 21 (g) One member from a nonprofit health association,
- 22 <u>foundation</u>, <u>or other relevant organization or individual</u>, <u>as</u>
- 23 determined by the chief executive officer.
- 24 (2) The Commissioner of Education shall appoint the
- 25 <u>following members to the Children's Health Advisory Committee:</u>

1 (a) One member from the Nebraska State Education

- 2 Association;
- 3 (b) One member from the Nebraska Council of School
- 4 Administrators;
- 5 (c) One member from the Nebraska Association of School
- 6 Boards;
- 7 (d) One member from the State Board of Education;
- 8 <u>(e) One member from the Nebraska School Nurses</u>
- 9 <u>Association;</u>
- 10 <u>(f) One member from the Nutrition Services division of</u>
- 11 <u>the State Department of Education; and</u>
- 12 (g) One member from a nonprofit children's association,
- 13 <u>foundation</u>, or other relevant organization or individual, as
- 14 determined by the commissioner.
- 15 (3) Members of the advisory committee shall each serve a
- 16 term of three years, except that of the initial appointments: (a) Two
- 17 members appointed pursuant to subsection (1) of this section, as
- 18 determined by the chief executive officer, and two members appointed
- 19 pursuant to subsection (2) of this section, as determined by the
- 20 commissioner, shall serve for terms of one year; and (b) two members
- 21 appointed pursuant to subsection (1) of this section, as determined
- 22 by the chief executive officer, and two members appointed pursuant to
- 23 subsection (2) of this section, as determined by the commissioner,
- 24 <u>shall</u> serve for terms of two years. Thereafter, all members shall
- 25 <u>serve for terms of three years.</u>

1 (4) If a vacancy occurs, the chief executive officer or

- 2 commissioner who made the original appointment shall appoint a person
- 3 who represents the same constituency as the member being replaced to
- 4 serve for the remaining term.
- 5 (5) Members of the committee shall serve without per
- 6 diems or expense reimbursement in 2011 and 2012 but may be reimbursed
- 7 <u>in 2013 and thereafter for their expenses as members of such</u>
- 8 committee as provided in sections 81-1174 to 81-1177 if funds are
- 9 appropriated by the Legislature.
- 10 Sec. 3. The Children's Health Advisory Committee shall
- 11 elect from among its members a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and a
- 12 secretary. Each of such officers shall serve for a term of one year
- and until his or her successor is elected and qualified.
- 14 The advisory committee shall meet at least quarterly or
- 15 more often at the call of the chairperson. The Department of Health
- 16 and Human Services and State Department of Education shall provide or
- 17 identify office space and meeting space for the advisory committee. A
- 18 majority of the members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction
- 19 of business. If an appointed member is unable to attend a meeting, he
- 20 or she may choose a designee to attend in his or her place but the
- 21 designee shall have no voting privileges. The Open Meetings Act and
- 22 sections 84-712 to 84-712.09 relating to public records apply to the
- 23 actions of the advisory committee. Staff support shall be provided by
- 24 the departments.
- 25 Sec. 4. (1) The Children's Health Advisory Committee

1 shall make recommendations to the State Department of Education and

- 2 the Department of Health and Human Services relating to the purposes
- 3 of decreasing childhood obesity and increasing healthful choices and
- 4 <u>lifestyles in the Nebraska public school system.</u>
- 5 (2) The advisory committee shall develop nutrition and
- 6 physical activity policy recommendations which shall relate to
- 7 <u>matters including</u>, but not limited to, the following:
- 8 (a) Foods sold individually in school cafeterias but
- 9 which are outside the regulated National School Lunch Program of the
- 10 <u>Food and Nutrition Service of the United States Department of</u>
- 11 Agriculture;
- 12 (b) Competitive foods. For purposes of this section,
- 13 competitive foods means any foods sold in competition with the
- 14 National School Lunch Program to children in any area on school
- 15 premises where National School Lunch Program meals are served or
- 16 eaten during lunch periods and offered at schools typically through
- 17 vending machines, students stores, school fundraisers, food carts, or
- 18 <u>food concessions;</u>
- 19 (c) Ongoing professional development of school food
- 20 service staff;
- 21 (d) The expenditure of funds derived from competitive
- 22 <u>food and beverage contracts;</u>
- (e) Physical education, availability of school-sanctioned
- 24 <u>after-school activities or sports;</u>
- 25 (f) Systems to ensure the implementation of nutrition and

- 1 physical activity standards; and
- 2 (g) Monitoring and evaluation of results and reporting of
- 3 <u>outcomes by individual school districts.</u>
- 4 Sec. 5. The State Department of Education, in
- 5 consultation with the Children's Health Advisory Committee and the
- 6 Department of Health and Human Services, shall adopt and promulgate
- 7 rules and regulations to ensure that nutrition and physical activity
- 8 standards are implemented to provide students with skills,
- 9 opportunities, and encouragement to adopt healthful lifestyles.
- 10 Sec. 6. <u>Beginning with school year 2012-13, each school</u>
- 11 district shall:
- 12 <u>(1) Implement the standards in the rules and regulations</u>
- 13 adopted by the State Department of Education pursuant to section 5 of
- 14 this act;
- 15 (2) Annually provide parents with a written explanation
- 16 of the possible health effects of body mass index, nutrition, and
- 17 physical activity; and
- 18 (3) Annually monitor and evaluate the implementation and
- 19 effectiveness of the nutrition and physical education standards.
- 20 Sec. 7. For school year 2012-13 and each school year
- 21 thereafter, each school district shall convene a school nutrition and
- 22 physical activity advisory committee which shall include members from
- 23 the board of education, school administrators, school food service
- 24 personnel, teacher organizations, parents, students, and local health
- 25 professionals to:

1	(1) Help raise awareness of the importance of nutrition
2	and physical activity; and
3	(2) Assist in implementing department-approved policies
4	that address the issues and goals of sections 1 to 6 of this act,
5	including, but not limited to, the following:
6	(a) Assisting with the implementation of nutrition and
7	physical activity standards of the department;
8	(b) Integrating nutrition and physical activity into the
9	overall curriculum;
10	(c) Ensuring that professional development opportunities
11	are available for food staff and handlers;
12	(d) Ensuring that students receive nutrition education
13	and engage in healthful levels of vigorous physical activity;
14	(e) Improving the quality of physical education
15	curriculum and increasing training of physical education teachers;
16	(f) Enforcing physical education requirements; and
17	(g) Pursuing competitive-food contracts that promote
18	healthful eating and reduce school dependence from sale of foods of
19	minimal nutritional value.
20	Sec. 8. The Children's Health Advisory Committee shall
21	provide a report to the Governor and Legislature no later than July 1
22	of each year. The report shall include, but not be limited to,
23	findings and recommendations relating to childhood obesity and
24	increasing healthful choices and lifestyles in the Nebraska public
