A BILL

- FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to amend section 79-703, Reissue
 Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to adopt the Classrooms
 First Act; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 6 of this act shall be known and 2 may be cited as the Classrooms First Act. 3 Sec. 2. For purposes of the Classrooms First Act: 4 (1) Direct classroom instruction means the total amount 5 of funds expended by a school district related to: Regular instructional programs; English language learners' instructional 6 7 programs; poverty programs; early childhood education programs; and 8 special education instructional programs. Direct classroom 9 instruction does not include amounts expended by a school district 10 related to: Support services for pupils; support services for safety and security; regular pupil transportation; school-age special 11 12 education pupil transportation; support services for staff; support 13 services for school improvement; support services for implementation of standards; the school board or board of education and its members; 14 executive administration services; general administration business 15 16 services; vehicle acquisition and maintenance for vehicles other than 17 pupil transportation vehicles; any principal or his or her office; 18 support services for maintenance and operation of building and sites; 19 any federal programs; categorical grants from corporations and other 20 private interests; community services; state categorical programs; 21 debt service; summer school; adult education; and transfers of funds; 22 (2) School fiscal year means the fiscal year designated in section 79-1091 for school districts; and 23 24 (3) Total operating expenditures means the amount of funds expended by a school district for direct classroom instruction 25

and: Support services for pupils; support services for safety and 1 security; regular pupil transportation; school-age special education 2 3 pupil transportation; support services for staff; support services 4 for school improvement; support services for implementation of 5 standards; the school board or board of education and its members; executive administration services; general administration business 6 7 services; vehicle acquisition and maintenance for vehicles other than 8 pupil transportation vehicles; any principal or his or her office; 9 support services for maintenance and operation of building and sites; 10 any federal programs; categorical grants from corporations and other 11 private interests; community services; state categorical programs; 12 debt service; summer school; adult education; and transfers of funds. 13 Sec. 3. Beginning with school fiscal year 2012-13, no public school district shall spend less than sixty-five percent of 14 its total operating expenditures on direct classroom instruction in 15 16 any school fiscal year. Sec. 4. The Commissioner of Education shall establish an 17 intervention team to be assigned to any school district that does not 18 meet the requirements of section 3 of this act within two months 19 20 after the completion of any school fiscal year. Members of the team 21 shall be appointed by the commissioner and shall serve at the 22 pleasure of the Commissioner. The intervention team shall consist of: (1) Staff of the State Department of Education; (2) representatives 23 of the educational service unit serving the public school district; 24 and (3) any other individuals appointed by the commissioner. 1 intervention team shall work with the school board or board of

- 2 education of the district, the superintendent, and other employees of
- 3 the district to assist the district in meeting the requirements of
- 4 section 3 of this act for ensuing school fiscal year and each school
- 5 fiscal year thereafter.
- 6 Sec. 5. (1) Beginning with school fiscal year 2013-14,
- 7 any school district that does not meet the requirements of section 3
- 8 of this act for three consecutive school fiscal years shall not be
- 9 <u>eligible for accreditation under section 79-703.</u>
- 10 <u>(2) The Commissioner of Education may waive the</u>
- 11 provisions of subsection (1) of this section if the school district
- 12 <u>adopts a plan that demonstrates to the commissioner's satisfaction</u>
- 13 that the plan will move the district back into compliance with
- 14 section 3 of this act for the ensuing school fiscal year and each
- 15 <u>school fiscal year thereafter.</u>
- 16 Sec. 6. The State Department of Education shall adopt and
- 17 promulgate rules and regulations to carry out the Classrooms First
- 18 <u>Act.</u>
- 19 Sec. 7. Section 79-703, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 20 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 21 79-703 (1) To ensure both equality of opportunity and
- 22 quality of programs offered, all public schools in the state shall be
- 23 required to meet quality and performance-based approval or
- 24 accreditation standards as prescribed by the State Board of
- 25 Education. The board shall establish a core curriculum standard,

1 which shall include multicultural education and vocational education

- 2 courses, for all public schools in the state. Accreditation and
- 3 approval standards shall be designed to assure effective schooling
- 4 and quality of instructional programs regardless of school size,
- 5 wealth, or geographic location. The board shall recognize and
- 6 encourage the maximum use of cooperative programs and may provide for
- 7 approval or accreditation of programs on a cooperative basis,
- 8 including the sharing of administrative and instructional staff,
- 9 between school districts for the purpose of meeting the approval and
- 10 accreditation requirements established pursuant to this section and
- 11 section 79-318.
- 12 (2) The Commissioner of Education shall appoint an
- 13 accreditation committee which shall be representative of the
- 14 educational institutions and agencies of the state and shall include
- 15 as a member the director of admissions of the University of Nebraska.
- 16 (3) The accreditation committee shall be responsible for:
- 17 (a) Recommending appropriate standards and policies with respect to
- 18 the accreditation and classification of schools; and (b) making
- 19 recommendations annually to the commissioner relative to the
- 20 accreditation and classification of individual schools. No school
- 21 shall be considered for accreditation status which has not first
- 22 fulfilled all requirements for an approved school.
- 23 (4) By school year 1993-94 all public schools in the
- 24 state shall be accredited.
- 25 (5) It is the intent of the Legislature that all public

- 1 school students shall have access to all educational services
- 2 required of accredited schools. Such services may be provided through
- 3 cooperative programs or alternative methods of delivery.
- 4 (6) Any school district which does not comply with the
- 5 Classrooms First Act is not eligible for accreditation pursuant to
- 6 this section.
- 7 Sec. 8. Original section 79-703, Reissue Revised Statutes
- 8 of Nebraska, is repealed.
