FOR AN ACT relating to trust deeds; to amend section 76-1005, Reissue
Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change provisions
relating to power of sale conferred on a trustee; to
provide for retroactive application; to repeal the
original section; and to declare an emergency.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 76-1005, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 76-1005 (1) A power of sale may be conferred upon the
- 4 trustee which the trustee may exercise and under which the trust
- 5 property may be sold in the manner provided in the Nebraska Trust
- 6 Deeds Act after a breach of an obligation for which the trust
- 7 property is conveyed as security, or at the option of the beneficiary
- 8 a trust deed may be foreclosed in the manner provided by law for the
- 9 foreclosure of mortgages on real property. The power of sale shall be
- 10 expressly provided for in the trust deed. The person selling the
- 11 trust property under a power of sale need not be named in the trust
- 12 <u>deed. An error or omission in a trust deed concerning the designation</u>
- 13 of the trustee authorized to exercise a power of sale does not
- 14 invalidate the trust deed or the ability of the beneficiary of the
- 15 trust deed to appoint a successor trustee to exercise the power of
- 16 <u>sale.</u>
- 17 (2) The changes made by this legislative bill shall be
- 18 construed to apply retroactively and shall be applied to and
- 19 interpreted to affect any trust deed filed of record before, on, or
- 20 after the effective date of this act.
- 21 Sec. 2. Original section 76-1005, Reissue Revised
- 22 Statutes of Nebraska, is repealed.
- Sec. 3. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
- 24 when passed and approved according to law.
