1 Section 1. Section 79-318, Revised Statutes Cumulative 2 Supplement, 2010, is amended to read: 3 79-318 The State Board of Education shall: 4 (1) Appoint and fix the compensation of the Commissioner 5 of Education; (2) Remove the commissioner from office at any time for 6 7 conviction of any crime involving moral turpitude or felonious act, 8 for inefficiency, or for willful and continuous disregard of his or her duties as commissioner or of the directives of the board; 9 10 (3) Upon recommendation of the commissioner, appoint and fix the compensation of a deputy commissioner and all professional 11 12 employees of the board; 13 (4) Organize the State Department of Education into such divisions, branches, or sections as may be necessary or desirable to 14 15 perform all its proper functions and to render maximum service to the 16 board and to the state school system; 17 (5) Provide, through the commissioner and his or her professional staff, enlightened professional leadership, guidance, 18 and supervision of the state school system, including educational 19 20 service units. In order that the commissioner and his or her staff 21 may carry out their duties, the board shall, through the commissioner: (a) Provide supervisory and consultation services to 22 23 the schools of the state; (b) issue materials helpful in the development, maintenance, and improvement of educational facilities 24 and programs; (c) establish rules and regulations which govern 25

standards and procedures for the approval and legal operation of all 1 2 schools in the state and for the accreditation of all schools 3 requesting state accreditation. All public, private, denominational, or parochial schools shall either comply with the accreditation or 4 5 approval requirements prescribed in this section and section 79-703 or, for those schools which elect not to meet accreditation or 6 7 approval requirements, the requirements prescribed in subsections (2) 8 through (6) of section 79-1601. Standards and procedures for approval and accreditation shall be based upon the program of studies, 9 guidance services, the number and preparation of teachers in relation 10 11 to the curriculum and enrollment, instructional materials and 12 equipment, science facilities and equipment, library facilities and materials, and health and safety factors in buildings and grounds. 13 14 Rules and regulations which govern standards and procedures for private, denominational, and parochial schools which elect, pursuant 15 to the procedures prescribed in subsections (2) through (6) of 16 17 section 79-1601, not to meet state accreditation or approval requirements shall be as described in such section; (d) institute a 18 statewide system of testing to determine the degree of achievement 19 20 and accomplishment of all the students within the state's school 21 systems if it determines such testing would be advisable; (e) prescribe a uniform system of records and accounting for keeping 22 23 adequate educational and financial records, for gathering and reporting necessary educational data, and for evaluating educational 24 progress; (f) cause to be published laws, rules, and regulations 25

1 governing the schools and the school lands and funds with explanatory 2 notes for the guidance of those charged with the administration of 3 the schools of the state; (g) approve teacher education programs conducted in Nebraska postsecondary educational institutions designed 4 5 for the purpose of certificating teachers and administrators; (h) approve certificated-employee evaluation policies and procedures 6 7 developed by school districts and educational service units; and (i) approve general plans and adopt educational policies, standards, 8 9 rules, and regulations for carrying out the board's responsibilities 10 and those assigned to the State Department of Education by the Legislature; 11

12 (6) Adopt and promulgate rules and regulations for the 13 guidance, supervision, accreditation, and coordination of educational service units. Such rules and regulations for accreditation shall 14 15 include, but not be limited to, (a) a requirement that programs and 16 services offered to school districts by each educational service unit shall be evaluated on a regular basis, but not less than every seven 17 years, to assure that educational service units remain responsive to 18 school district needs and (b) guidelines for the use and management 19 20 of funds generated from the property tax levy and from other sources 21 of revenue as may be available to the educational service units, to assure that public funds are used to accomplish the purposes and 22 23 goals assigned to the educational service units by section 79-1204. 24 The State Board of Education shall establish procedures to encourage 25 the coordination of activities among educational service units and to

3 (7) Submit a biennial report to the Governor and the 4 Clerk of the Legislature covering the actions of the board, the 5 operations of the State Department of Education, and the progress and 6 needs of the schools and recommend such legislation as may be 7 necessary to satisfy these needs;

8 (8) Prepare and distribute reports designed to acquaint
9 school district officers, teachers, and patrons of the schools with
10 the conditions and needs of the schools;

(9) Provide for consultation with professional educators and lay leaders for the purpose of securing advice deemed necessary in the formulation of policies and in the effectual discharge of its duties;

(10) Make studies, investigations, and reports and assemble information as necessary for the formulation of policies, for making plans, for evaluating the state school program, and for making essential and adequate reports;

19 (11) Submit to the Governor and the Legislature a budget 20 necessary to finance the state school program under its jurisdiction, 21 including the internal operation and maintenance of the State 22 Department of Education;

23 (12) Interpret its own policies, standards, rules, and 24 regulations and, upon reasonable request, hear complaints and 25 disputes arising therefrom;

1 (13) With the advice of the Department of Motor Vehicles, 2 adopt and promulgate rules and regulations containing reasonable 3 standards, not inconsistent with existing statutes, governing: (a) The general design, equipment, color, operation, and maintenance of 4 5 any vehicle with a manufacturer's rated seating capacity of eleven or 6 more passengers used for the transportation of public, private, 7 denominational, or parochial school students; and (b) the equipment, 8 operation, and maintenance of any vehicle with a capacity of ten or 9 less passengers used for the transportation of public, private, denominational, or parochial school students, when such vehicles are 10 11 owned, operated, or owned and operated by any public, private, 12 denominational, or parochial school or privately owned or operated 13 under contract with any such school in this state, except for vehicles owned by individuals operating a school which elects 14 pursuant to section 79-1601 not to meet accreditation or approval 15 16 requirements. Similar rules and regulations shall be adopted and promulgated for operators of such vehicles as provided in section 17 79-607; 18

19 (14) Accept, on behalf of the Nebraska Center for the 20 Education of Children who are Blind or Visually Impaired, devises of 21 real property or donations or bequests of other property, or both, if 22 in its judgment any such devise, donation, or bequest is for the best 23 interest of the center or the students receiving services from the 24 center, or both, and irrigate or otherwise improve any such real 25 estate when in the board's judgment it would be advisable to do so;

2 (15) Upon acceptance of any devise, donation, or bequest 3 as provided in this section, administer and carry out such devise, donation, or bequest in accordance with the terms and conditions 4 5 thereof. If not prohibited by the terms and conditions of any such devise, donation, or bequest, the board may sell, convey, exchange, 6 7 or lease property so devised, donated, or bequeathed upon such terms 8 and conditions as it deems best and remit all money derived from any 9 such sale or lease to the State Treasurer for credit to the State Department of Education Trust Fund. 10

Each member of the Legislature shall receive a copy of the report required by subdivision (7) of this section by making a request for it to the commissioner.

14 None of the duties prescribed in this section shall 15 prevent the board from exercising such other duties as in its 16 judgment may be necessary for the proper and legal exercise of its 17 obligations.

18 Sec. 2. Section 79-1044, Reissue Revised Statutes of 19 Nebraska, is amended to read:

20 79-1044 The forest reserve funds, annually paid into the 21 state treasury by the United States Government under an act of 22 Congress approved June 30, 1906, shall be distributed among the 23 counties of the state entitled to the same for the benefit of the 24 public schools and the public roads of such counties, <u>based upon</u> 25 <u>information provided by the United States Department of the Interior</u>

1 under the direction of the Commissioner of Education. , in the 2 following manner:

3 (1) The State Treasurer shall annually on the first 4 Monday in July certify to the commissioner the amount of money 5 received from the United States Covernment as Nebraska's 6 proportionate share of the income from the forest reserves within the 7 state for the most recent complete fiscal year;

8 (2) The Board of Educational Lands and Funds shall 9 annually on the first Monday in July make and deliver to the 10 commissioner a certificate showing the counties entitled to share in 11 the Forest Reserve Fund, together with the number of acres of forest 12 reserves in each county; and

13 (3) The commissioner shall, on or before August 5, make 14 apportionment of such funds to such counties according to the number 15 of acres of forest reserve in each county and certify the 16 apportionment of each county to the county treasurer of the proper 17 county and to the Director of Administrative Services. The director 18 shall draw a warrant on the State Treasurer in favor of the various 19 counties for the amount specified by the commissioner.

20 Sec. 3. Section 79-1047, Reissue Revised Statutes of 21 Nebraska, is amended to read:

79-1047 The public grazing funds, annually paid to the state treasury by the United States Government under the federal Taylor Grazing Act, 43 U.S.C. 315i, as such act existed on May 8, 2001, shall be distributed among the counties of the state entitled

to the same for the benefit of the school districts of such counties₇
based upon information provided by the United States Department of
the Interior under the direction of the Commissioner of Education. 7
in the following manner:

5 (1) The State Treasurer shall annually on the first 6 Monday in July certify to the commissioner the amount of money 7 received from the United States Government as Nebraska's 8 proportionate share of the income from the grazing lands within the 9 state for the most recent complete fiscal year;

10 (2) The Board of Educational Lands and Funds shall 11 annually on the first Monday in July make and deliver to the 12 commissioner a certificate showing the counties entitled to share in 13 the grazing fund, together with the number of acres of grazing land 14 in each county; and

15 (3) The commissioner shall, on or before August 5, make 16 apportionment of such funds to such counties according to the number 17 of acres of grazing land in each county and certify the apportionment 18 of each county to the county treasurer of the proper county and to 19 the Director of Administrative Services. The director shall draw a 20 warrant on the State Treasurer in favor of the various counties for 21 the amount so specified by the Commissioner of Education.

Sec. 4. Section 79-1051, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

2479-1051 The distribution of the funds received by the25State Treasurer under section 79-1049 shall be made based upon

2 under the direction of the Commissioner of Education. in the

4 (1) The State Treasurer shall annually on the first 5 Monday in July certify to the commissioner the amount of money 6 received from the United States Government as Nebraska's 7 proportionate share of the income from the leasing of lands acquired 8 by the United States for flood control purposes;

9 (2) The commissioner shall ascertain by appropriate 10 inquiry in what counties the real estate on which lease rentals were 11 paid was situated; and

12 (3) The commissioner shall, on or before August 5, make 13 apportionment of such fund to the counties entitled thereto in 14 accordance with section 79-1050 and certify the apportionment of each 15 county to the county treasurer of the proper county and to the 16 Director of Administrative Services. The director shall draw a 17 warrant on the State Treasurer in favor of the various counties for 18 the amount specified by the commissioner.
