FOR AN ACT relating to the Welfare Reform Act; to amend section
68-1708, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change
provisions relating to education; to harmonize
provisions; to provide a termination date; and to repeal
the original section.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 68-1708, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 68-1708 Sections 68-1708 to 68-1734 and sections 2 to 4
- 4 of this act shall be known and may be cited as the Welfare Reform
- 5 Act.
- 6 Sec. 2. For purposes of creating the self-sufficiency
- 7 contract and meeting the applicant's work activity requirement, an
- 8 applicant who is under twenty years of age and is married or a single
- 9 head of household is deemed to have met the work activity requirement
- 10 <u>in a month if he or she:</u>
- 11 (1) Maintains satisfactory attendance during such month
- 12 at secondary school, a general education development program, or the
- 13 equivalent; or
- 14 (2) Participates in education directly related to
- 15 employment for an average of at least twenty hours per week during
- 16 such month. Education directly related to employment includes, but is
- 17 not limited to, Adult Basic Education, English as a Second Language,
- 18 and a general education development program.
- 19 Sec. 3. (1) For purposes of creating the self-sufficiency
- 20 contract and meeting the applicant's work activity requirement, an
- 21 applicant under twenty-four years of age shall be deemed to have met
- 22 the work activity requirement in a month if he or she is engaged in
- 23 <u>education directly related to employment for an average of at least</u>
- 24 twenty hours a week during such month. Education directly related to
- 25 employment includes, but is not limited to, Adult Basic Education,

1 English as a Second Language, and a general education development

- 2 program.
- 3 (2) If Nebraska's federally reported work participation
- 4 rate under the federal Temporary Assistance to Needy Families
- 5 program, 42 U.S.C. 601 et seq., reaches fifty-five percent, the
- 6 Department of Health and Human Services may set a reasonable limit
- 7 for the number of applicants that may engage in education directly
- 8 related to employment under subsection (1) of this section to ensure
- 9 that Nebraska remains in compliance with the federal work
- 10 participation rate requirements. If the department sets a limit
- 11 pursuant to this section, such limit shall be reviewed and adjusted
- 12 <u>annually to allow maximum participation in education directly related</u>
- 13 <u>to employment.</u>
- 14 Sec. 4. The Department of Health and Human Services shall
- 15 report annually to the Legislature on October 1 on the following:
- 16 (1) The number of persons on a quarterly basis
- 17 participating in a self-sufficiency contract who are engaged in one
- 18 of the following activities:
- 19 <u>(a) An associate degree program;</u>
- 20 (b) A vocational education program not leading to an
- 21 <u>associate degree;</u>
- 22 (c) Postsecondary education other than a program
- 23 described in subdivision (1)(a) or (b) of this section;
- 24 <u>(d) Adult Basic Education;</u>
- (e) English as a Second Language; or

- 1 (f) A general education development program; and
- 2 (2) The number of persons participating in a self-
- 3 sufficiency contract who obtain or maintain employment for six
- 4 months, twelve months, eighteen months, and twenty-four months after
- 5 such persons are no longer eligible for cash assistance due to
- 6 <u>obtaining employment.</u>
- 7 Sec. 5. This act terminates December 31, 2015.

- 9 Statutes of Nebraska, is repealed.
