## A BILL

FOR AN ACT relating to state highways; to amend section 39-1359,

Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to allow for

encroachments on the state highway system for special

events held by counties, cities, or villages as

prescribed; to provide a duty for the Department of

Roads; and to repeal the original section.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 39-1359, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 39-1359 (1) The rights-of-way acquired by the department
- 4 shall be held inviolate for state highway and departmental purposes
- 5 and no physical or functional encroachments, structures, or uses
- 6 shall be permitted within such right-of-way limits, except by written
- 7 consent of the department.
- 8 (2) Encroachments on the state highway system by a
- 9 county, city, or village, including full and partial lane closures,
- 10 shall be allowed for special events, as designated by a county, city,
- or village, under the following conditions:
- 12 <u>(a) The roadway is located within the official corporate</u>
- 13 limits or zoning jurisdiction of the county, city, or village; and
- 14 (b) The county, city, or village encroaching on the state
- 15 <u>highway system for a special event has formally, by official</u>
- 16 governing body action, waived any and all rights of recovery against
- 17 the Department of Roads for damages or liability that may arise from
- 18 <u>the special event.</u>
- 19 (3) If a county, city, or village has met the
- 20 requirements of subsection (2) of this section for holding a special
- 21 event, the department shall issue a permit authorizing the
- 22 <u>encroachment on the state highway system.</u>
