1	FOR AN ACT relating to wildlife; to amend sections 37-202, 37-209.01,			
2	37-210.01, 37-246, and 37-478, Reissue Revised Statutes			
3	of Nebraska, and sections 29-818, 37-201, 37-477, 37-479,			
4	and 37-481, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2010;			
5	to change provisions relating to seized property,			
6	wildlife in captivity, and captive wildlife permits; to			
7	define and redefine terms; to harmonize provisions; and			
8	to repeal the original sections.			
9	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,			

1 Section 1. Section 29-818, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2010, is amended to read:
- 3 29-818 (1) Except for <u>wildlife</u>, pet animals, or equines
- 4 as provided in subsection (2) of this section, property seized under
- 5 a search warrant or validly seized without a warrant shall be safely
- 6 kept by the officer seizing the same unless otherwise directed by the
- 7 judge or magistrate, and shall be so kept so long as necessary for
- 8 the purpose of being produced as evidence on any trial. Property
- 9 seized may not be taken from the officer having it in custody by
- 10 replevin or other writ so long as it is or may be required as
- 11 evidence in any trial, nor may it be so taken in any event where a
- 12 complaint has been filed in connection with which the property was or
- 13 may be used as evidence, and the court in which such complaint was
- 14 filed shall have exclusive jurisdiction for disposition of the
- 15 property or funds and to determine rights therein, including
- 16 questions respecting the title, possession, control, and disposition
- 17 thereof.
- 18 (2)(a) Any wildlife, pet animal, or equine seized under a
- 19 search warrant or validly seized without a warrant may be kept by the
- 20 officer seizing the same on the property of the person who owns,
- 21 keeps, harbors, maintains, or controls such pet animal. or equine.
- 22 (b) When any wildlife, pet animal, or equine is seized or
- 23 held the court shall provide the person who owns, keeps, harbors,
- 24 maintains, or controls such pet animal or equine with notice that a
- 25 hearing will be had and specify the date, time, and place of such

hearing. Such notice shall be served by personal or residential service or by certified mail. If such notice cannot be served by such methods, service may be made by publication in the county where such pet animal or equine was seized. Such publication shall be made after application and order of the court. Unless otherwise determined and ordered by the court, the date of such hearing shall be no later than

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ten days after the seizure.

8 (c) At the hearing, the court shall determine the 9 disposition of the wildlife, pet animal, or equine, and if the court 10 determines that any pet animal or equine such animal shall not be returned, the court shall order the person from whom the pet animal 11 12 or equine such animal was seized to pay all expenses for the support 13 and maintenance of the pet-animal, or equine, including expenses for shelter, food, veterinary care, and board, necessitated by the 14 possession of the pet_animal. or equine.—At the hearing, the court 15 16 shall also consider the person's ability to pay for the expenses of the pet—animal or equine—and the amount of such payments. Payments 17 18 shall be for a succeeding thirty-day period with the first payment due on or before the tenth day following the hearing. Payments for 19 20 each subsequent succeeding thirty-day period, if any, shall be due on or before the tenth day of such period. 21

22 (d) If a person becomes delinquent in his or her payments 23 for the expenses of the <u>wildlife</u>, pet animal, or equine, the court 24 shall hold a hearing to determine the disposition of the seized pet 25 animal. or equine. Notice of such hearing shall be given to the

1 person who owns, keeps, harbors, maintains, or controls such pet

- 2 animal or equine and to any lienholder or security interest holder of
- 3 record as provided in subdivision (b) of this subsection.
- 4 (e) An appeal may be entered within ten days after a
- 5 hearing under subdivision (c) or (d) of this subsection. Any person
- 6 filing an appeal shall post a bond sufficient to pay all costs of
- 7 care of the wildlife, pet animal, or equine for thirty days. Such
- 8 payment will be required for each succeeding thirty-day period until
- 9 the appeal is final.
- 10 (f) Should the person be found not guilty, all funds paid
- 11 for the expenses of the $\underline{\text{wildlife}}$, pet animal, or equine shall be
- 12 returned to the person.
- 13 (g) For purposes of this subsection:
- (i) Pet animal means any domestic dog, domestic cat, mini
- 15 pig, domestic rabbit, domestic ferret, domestic rodent, bird except a
- 16 bird raised as an agricultural animal and specifically excluding any
- 17 bird possessed under a license issued by the State of Nebraska or the
- 18 United States Fish and Wildlife Service, nonlethal aquarium fish,
- 19 nonlethal invertebrate, amphibian, turtle, nonvenomous snake that
- 20 will not grow to more than eight feet in length at maturity, or such
- 21 other animal as may be specified and for which a permit shall be
- 22 issued by an animal control authority after inspection and approval,
- 23 except that any animal forbidden to be sold, owned, or possessed by
- 24 federal or state law is not a pet animal; and
- 25 (ii) Equine means a horse, pony, donkey, mule, hinny, or

- 1 llama; and -
- 2 (iii) Wildlife means animals that cannot be kept in
- 3 <u>captivity without a permit under section 37-477.</u>
- 4 (h) This section shall not preempt, and shall not be
- 5 construed to preempt, any ordinance of a city of the metropolitan
- 6 class.

- (c) Family Boidae, all species whose adult length has the
- 24 potential to exceed eight feet;

- 1 the potential to exceed eight feet;
- 2 (e) Family Colubridae, only boomslangs and African twig
- 3 snakes;
- 4 (f) Family Elapidae, all species, including coral snakes,
- 5 cobras, and mambas;
- 6 (g) Family Nactricidae, only keelback snakes; and
- 7 (h) Family Viperidae, all species, including copperheads,

- 14 <u>neglected</u>, <u>unwanted</u>, <u>impounded</u>, <u>abandoned</u>, <u>orphaned</u>, <u>or displaced</u>
- 15 wildlife are provided care for their lifetime or released back to
- 16 their natural habitat and is a facility with the following
- 17 characteristics:
- 18 (1) No activity that is not inherent to the animal's
- 19 nature, natural conduct, or the animal in its natural habitat is
- 20 conducted except as needed for routine animal husbandry;
- 21 (2) No commercial activity involving animals occurs
- 22 including, but not limited to, the sale of or trade in animals,
- 23 animal parts, animal by-products or animal offspring; the sale of
- 24 photographic opportunities involving animals; or the use of animals
- 25 <u>for any type of entertainment purpose;</u>

1 (3) No unescorted public visitations or direct contact 2 between the public and the animals occurs; or 3 (4) No breeding of animals occurs in the facility. Sec. 9.
