1	FOR AN ACT relating to the Uniform Credentialing Act; to amend
2	section 38-131, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and
3	section 38-3301, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
4	2010; to provide for issuance of a veterinarian locum
5	tenens; to harmonize provisions; to repeal the original
6	sections; and to declare an emergency.
7	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 38-131, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 38-131 (1) An applicant for an initial license to
- 4 practice a profession which is authorized to prescribe controlled
- 5 substances shall be subject to a criminal background check. Except as
- 6 provided in subsection (3) of this section, the applicant shall
- 7 submit with the application a full set of fingerprints which shall be
- 8 forwarded to the Nebraska State Patrol to be submitted to the Federal
- 9 Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history record
- 10 information check. The applicant shall authorize release of the
- 11 results of the national criminal history record information check to
- 12 the department. The applicant shall pay the actual cost of the
- 13 fingerprinting and criminal background check.
- 14 (2) This section shall not apply to a dentist who is an
- 15 applicant for a dental locum tenens under section 38-1122, or to a
- 16 physician or osteopathic physician who is an applicant for a
- 17 physician locum tenens under section 38-2036, or to a veterinarian
- 18 who is an applicant for a veterinarian locum tenens under section 3
- 19 of this act.
- 20 (3) An applicant for a temporary educational permit as
- 21 defined in section 38-2019 shall have ninety days from the issuance
- 22 of the permit to comply with subsection (1) of this section and shall
- 23 have his or her permit suspended after such ninety-day period if the
- 24 criminal background check is not complete or revoked if the criminal
- 25 background check reveals that the applicant was not qualified for the

- 4 38-3301 Sections 38-3301 to 38-3334 and section 3 of this
- 5 <u>act</u> shall be known and may be cited as the Veterinary Medicine and
- 6 Surgery Practice Act.
- 7 Sec. 3. When circumstances indicate a need for the
- 8 issuance of a veterinarian locum tenens in the State of Nebraska, the
- 9 department, with the recommendation of the board, may issue a
- 10 veterinarian locum tenens to an individual who holds an active
- 11 license to practice veterinary medicine and surgery in another state
- 12 <u>if the requirements regarding education and examination for licensure</u>
- 13 in that state are equal to or exceed the requirements regarding
- 14 <u>education and examination for licensure in Nebraska. A veterinarian</u>
- 15 locum tenens may be issued for a period not to exceed ninety days in
- 16 <u>any twelve-month period</u>.
- 17 Sec. 4. Original section 38-131, Reissue Revised Statutes
- 18 of Nebraska, and section 38-3301, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 19 Supplement, 2010, are repealed.
- 20 Sec. 5. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
- 21 when passed and approved according to law.
