1 Section 1. Section 66-1214, Reissue Revised Statutes of 2 Nebraska, is amended to read: 3 66-1214 Commencing January 1, 1986, motor Motor fuel 4 dispensers shall be labeled on both faces with the product identity 5 using the most descriptive terms commercially practicable. In addition, all alcohol blended fuel dispensers shall have a label 6 7 stating: With or containing ethanol, methanol, or ethanol and 8 methanol or with similar wording if the motor fuel being dispensed 9 contains one percent or more by volume of alcohol. Any person who 10 owns or controls such a motor fuel dispenser and does not attach the notice required by this section shall be guilty of an infraction. 11 12 Sec. 2. Section 89-186, Reissue Revised Statutes of 13 Nebraska, is amended to read: 14 89-186 (1) The Legislature hereby adopts by reference the 15 following: 16 (a) The standards of the National Conference on Weights and Measures published in National Institute of Standards and 17 Technology Handbook 44 entitled Specifications, Tolerances, and Other 18 Technical Requirements for Weighing and Measuring Devices as it 19 20 existed on January 1, 2003, except Section 3.31. Vehicle - Tank meters. UR.2.2. Ticket Printers; Customer Ticket, Section 2.20. 21 Scales, N.3. Minimum Test Weights and Test Loads; and Table 4, are 22 23 not adopted. In addition to the language found in Section 3.30. Liquid-Measuring Devices, S.1.6.4., S.1.6.5., UR.3.2., and UR.3.3. of 24 25 such handbook, any computing device in which a product or grade is

offered for sale at more than one unit price may also compute at the lowest possible unit price for such transaction. All prices shall still be displayed or posted on the face of the dispenser. Such handbook shall govern all commercial and law enforcement weighing and measuring devices in the state;

6 (b) The Uniform Regulation for the Method of Sale of 7 Commodities of the National Conference on Weights and Measures 8 published in National Institute of Standards and Technology Handbook 9 130 entitled Uniform Laws and Regulations as it existed on January 1, 10 2003, except section 2.20. Such handbook shall be used to determine 11 the proper units of measurement to be used in the keeping for sale or 12 sale of commodities;

(c) The Uniform Packaging and Labeling Regulation of the National Conference on Weights and Measures published in National Institute of Standards and Technology Handbook 130 entitled Uniform Laws and Regulations as it existed on January 1, 2003. Such handbook shall govern the packaging and labeling by weight, measure, or count of commodities kept for sale or sold in this state; and

(d) The procedures designated in National Institute of
Standards and Technology Handbook 133 entitled Checking the Net
Contents of Packaged Goods as it existed on January 1, 2003.

(2) Copies of the handbooks adopted by reference in this
section shall be filed with the Secretary of State, Clerk of the
Legislature, and Department of Agriculture.

25 (3) Whenever there exists an inconsistency between the

1 provisions of the Weights and Measures Act other than this section 2 and any of the handbooks adopted by reference, the requirements of 3 such provisions of the act shall control.
