## A BILL

1	FOR AN ACT	relating to the	Motor Vehicle Oper	ator's License Act; to
2		amend section	60-4,124, Reissue	Revised Statutes of
3		Nebraska; to	change provisions	relating to school
4		permits; and to	repeal the original	section.

5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 60-4,124, Reissue Revised Statutes of
 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 60-4,124 (1)(a) A person who is younger than sixteen years and three months of age but is older than fourteen years and 4 5 two months of age may be issued a school permit if (i) such person lives a distance of one and one-half miles or more from the school he 6 7 or she attends and either resides outside a city of the metropolitan, primary, or first class or attends a school which is outside a city 8 9 of the metropolitan, primary, or first class and if such person has held an LPE-learner's permit for two months or (ii) such person lives 10 a distance of one and one-half miles or more from the school he or 11 12 she attends and resides in a city of the first class and if such 13 person has held an LPE-learner's permit for two months.

14 (b) A school permit shall not be issued until such person 15 has demonstrated that he or she is capable of successfully operating 16 a motor vehicle, moped, or motorcycle and has in his or her possession an issuance certificate authorizing the county treasurer 17 to issue a school permit. In order to obtain an issuance certificate, 18 the applicant shall present (a) (i) proof of successful completion of 19 20 a department-approved driver safety course which includes behind-the-21 wheel driving specifically emphasizing (i) (A) the effects of the 22 consumption of alcohol on a person operating a motor vehicle, (ii) 23 (B) occupant protection systems, (iii) (C) risk assessment, and (iv) 24 (D) railroad crossing safety and (b)(i) (ii)(A) proof of successful 25 completion of a written examination and driving test administered by

a driver safety course instructor or (ii) (B) a certificate in a form 1 2 prescribed by the department, signed by a parent, guardian, or 3 licensed driver at least twenty-one years of age, verifying that the applicant has completed fifty hours of lawful motor vehicle 4 5 operation, under conditions that reflect department-approved driver safety course curriculum, with a parent, guardian, or adult at least 6 7 twenty-one years of age, who has a current Nebraska operator's 8 license or who is licensed in another state. The department may waive the written examination if the applicant has been issued an LPE-9 learner's permit or LPD-learner's permit and if such permit is valid 10 11 or has expired no more than one year prior to application. The 12 written examination shall not be waived if the permit being applied 13 for contains a class or endorsement which is different from the class 14 or endorsement of the LPE-learner's permit.

15 (2) A person holding a school permit may operate a motor 16 vehicle, moped, or motorcycle:

17 (a) To and from where he or she attends school and 18 between schools of enrollment over the most direct and accessible 19 route by the nearest highway from his or her place of residence to 20 transport such person or any family member who resides with such 21 person to attend duly scheduled courses of instruction and 22 extracurricular or school-related activities at the school he or she 23 attends; or

(b) Under the personal supervision of a licensedoperator. Such licensed operator shall be at least twenty-one years

of age and licensed by this state or another state and shall actually occupy the seat beside the permitholder or, in the case of a motorcycle or moped, if the permitholder is within visual contact of and under the supervision of, in the case of a motorcycle, a licensed motorcycle operator or, in the case of a moped, a licensed motor vehicle operator.

7 (3) The holder of a school permit shall not use any type 8 of interactive wireless communication device while operating a motor 9 vehicle on the highways of this state. Enforcement of this subsection 10 shall be accomplished only as a secondary action when the holder of 11 the school permit has been cited or charged with a violation of some 12 other law.

(4) A person who is younger than sixteen years of age but is over fourteen years of age may be issued an LPE-learner's permit, which permit shall be valid for a period of three months. An LPElearner's permit shall not be issued until such person successfully completes a written examination prescribed by the department and demonstrates that he or she has sufficient powers of eyesight to safely operate a motor vehicle, moped, or motorcycle.

(5)(a) While holding the LPE-learner's permit, the person may operate a motor vehicle on the highways of this state if he or she has seated next to him or her a person who is a licensed operator or, in the case of a motorcycle or moped, if he or she is within visual contact of and is under the supervision of a person who, in the case of a motorcycle, is a licensed motorcycle operator or, in

1 the case of a moped, is a licensed motor vehicle operator. Such 2 licensed motor vehicle or motorcycle operator shall be at least 3 twenty-one years of age and licensed by this state or another state.

4 (b) The holder of an LPE-learner's permit shall not use 5 any type of interactive wireless communication device while operating 6 a motor vehicle on the highways of this state. Enforcement of this 7 subdivision shall be accomplished only as a secondary action when the 8 holder of the LPE-learner's permit has been cited or charged with a 9 violation of some other law.

(6) The county treasurer shall collect the fee and 10 11 surcharge prescribed in section 60-4,115 from each successful 12 applicant for a school or LPE-learner's permit. All school permits 13 shall be subject to impoundment or revocation under the terms of 14 section 60-496. Any person who violates the terms of a school permit shall be guilty of an infraction and shall not be eligible for 15 another school, farm, LPD-learner's, or LPE-learner's permit until he 16 17 or she has attained the age of sixteen years.
