# A BILL

- 1 FOR AN ACT relating to outdoor outfitters and guides; to adopt the
- 2 Outdoor Outfitters and Guides Registration Act; and to
- 3 provide penalties.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as

- 2 the Outdoor Outfitters and Guides Registration Act.
- 3 Sec. 2. (1) The Legislature finds that: (a) Nebraska has
- 4 a tremendous amount of pristine land; (b) that the vast expanses of
- 5 prairie, sandhills, and waterways provide unique habitat for numerous
- 6 species of birds, fish, and wildlife; and (c) and that the economic
- 7 development provided through the outdoor outfitters and guides
- 8 <u>industry</u> is of vital importance to the State of Nebraska and
- 9 contributes substantially to the economy of the state.
- 10 (2) It is the intent of the Legislature to promote and
- 11 <u>encourage utilization of the vast natural resources of this state</u>
- 12 through travel and tourism activities enhanced by the outdoor
- 13 outfitters and guides industry.
- Sec. 3. (1) The purpose of the Outdoor Outfitters and
- 15 Guides Registration Act is to provide for registration of persons who
- 16 undertake for compensation the business of providing equipment,
- 17 <u>facilities</u>, or services to individuals for the purposes of taking or
- 18 attempting to take fish, birds, or wildlife or of navigation of
- 19 waters of the state.
- 20 (2) The Outdoor Outfitters and Guides Registration Act
- 21 shall not be interpreted to (a) interfere with any privately owned
- 22 livestock business operations, (b) prevent the general public from
- 23 <u>enjoying recreational activities on public and private lands when a</u>
- 24 registered outfitter or guide is not utilized, (c) interfere with any
- 25 <u>fishing or hunting seasons, permits, stamps, certifications, daily</u>

1 bag limits, or possession limits or fish and wildlife population

- 2 control strategies established by the Game and Parks Commission, or
- 3 (d) interfere with the right of the United States to manage federal
- 4 lands and waters under its control.
- 5 Sec. 4. For purposes of the Outdoor Outfitters and Guides
- 6 Registration Act, the definitions found in sections 5 to 14 of this
- 7 <u>act apply.</u>
- 8 Sec. 5. Advertise means attempting by any means to induce
- 9 individuals to enter into an agreement with a registered outdoor
- 10 outfitter or quide for purposes of taking or attempting to take fish,
- 11 birds, or wildlife on any public or private lands or of navigation of
- 12 waters on any public or private lake, reservoir, river, or stream.
- 13 Sec. 6. Client means an individual who uses the services,
- 14 facilities, or equipment of a registered outdoor outfitter or guide.
- Sec. 7. <u>Commission means the Game and Parks Commission</u>.
- 16 Sec. 8. <u>Guide means an individual not employed by an</u>
- 17 outdoor outfitter who advertises or holds himself or herself out to
- 18 the public for purposes of providing personal services consisting of
- 19 accompanying, supervising, instructing, or training clients in
- 20 outdoor recreational activities. Guide does not include:
- 21 (1) A bona fide camp the purpose of which is to provide
- 22 outdoor experiences for persons under nineteen years of age and its
- 23 <u>employees;</u>
- 24 (2) A nonprofit organization that is exempt from the
- 25 payment of federal income taxes under the provisions of section

- 1 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code;
- 2 (3) An individual who provides services, equipment, or
- 3 <u>facilities for recreational activities to a direct family member; and</u>
- 4 (4) An individual or organization who or which makes
- 5 travel arrangements only and is not associated with or employed by an
- 6 <u>outdoor outfitter.</u>
- 7 Sec. 9. <u>Hunting club means a formal private association</u>
- 8 of hunters who hold membership through the payment of fees to the
- 9 club.
- 10 Sec. 10. <u>Navigation of waters means the use of any vessel</u>
- 11 <u>as defined in section 37-1203 which is rented or leased for</u>
- 12 <u>recreational purposes.</u>
- Sec. 11. <u>Outdoor outfitter means a person, firm,</u>
- 14 partnership, hunting club, or corporation who or which advertises or
- 15 <u>holds himself, herself, or itself out to the public for purposes of</u>
- 16 providing facilities or services or maintaining, leasing, or
- 17 otherwise using equipment or accommodations privately owned by the
- 18 outdoor outfitter, for compensation, for taking or attempting to take
- 19 fish, birds, or wildlife on any public or private lands or for
- 20 <u>navigation of waters on any public or private lake, reservoir, river,</u>
- 21 <u>or stream. Outdoor outfitter does not include:</u>
- 22 (1) A bona fide camp the purpose of which is to provide
- 23 outdoor experiences for persons under nineteen years of age and its
- 24 <u>employees;</u>
- 25 (2) A nonprofit organization that is exempt from the

1 payment of federal income taxes under the provisions of section

- 2 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code;
- 3 (3) An individual who provides services, equipment, or
- 4 facilities for recreational activities to a direct family member; and
- 5 (4) An individual or organization who or which makes
- 6 travel arrangements only and is not associated with or employed by an
- 7 <u>outdoor outfitter.</u>
- 8 Sec. 12. <u>Registration number means a unique number or</u>
- 9 code on a registration certificate issued under the Outdoor
- 10 <u>Outfitters and Guides Registration Act.</u>
- 11 Sec. 13. <u>Registration year means the period of time</u>
- 12 starting on the date a registration certificate is issued under the
- 13 Outdoor Outfitters and Guides Registration Act and ending on the
- 14 <u>anniversary date of issuance in the following year.</u>
- 15 Sec. 14. Take has the definition found in section 37-242.
- 16 Sec. 15. (1) An applicant for a registration certificate
- 17 shall apply on a form prescribed by the commission. The application
- 18 shall be made at least four weeks prior to providing service to
- 19 clients. The application shall include, but is not limited to:
- 20 <u>(a) The name, address, telephone number, and driver's</u>
- 21 license number of the applicant, if an individual, or the corporate
- 22 business or trade name authorized under the Nebraska Business
- 23 Corporation Act of the applicant and the name and address of each
- 24 <u>corporate officer; and</u>
- 25 (b) Proof of liability insurance coverage of not less

- 1 than fifty thousand dollars per one person in a single accident.
- 2 (2) The application shall be signed by the applicant
- 3 <u>under oath or affirmation, shall be duly notarized, and shall be</u>
- 4 accompanied by the license fee of one hundred dollars.
- 5 Sec. 16. Upon receipt of the application and the license
- 6 fee, the commission shall issue a registration certificate to the
- 7 applicant. The registration certificate shall be valid for one
- 8 registration year following issuance and shall be assigned a unique
- 9 <u>registration number</u>.
- 10 Sec. 17. The commission shall create a digital list on
- 11 its web site of all outdoor outfitters and guides registered under
- 12 the Outdoor Outfitters and Guides Registration Act. The list shall
- 13 <u>include the name, corporate name if applicable, address, and</u>
- 14 telephone number of each registrant under the act.
- 15 Sec. 18. The Outdoor Outfitters and Guides Cash Fund is
- 16 <u>created</u>. All fees collected under the Outdoor Outfitters and Guides
- 17 Registration Act shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit
- 18 to the fund. Money in the fund shall be used by the commission to
- 19 carry out the Outdoor Outfitters and Guides Registration Act. Money
- 20 in the fund available for investment shall be invested by the state
- 21 investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and
- 22 the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.
- Sec. 19. <u>Any Nebraska-based outdoor outfitter or guide</u>
- 24 incorporated under the Business Corporation Act and doing business in
- 25 <u>another state or country shall be registered under the Outdoor</u>

- 1 Outfitters and Guides Registration Act.
- 2 Sec. 20. Any person convicted of acting as a guide or
- 3 <u>outdoor</u> outfitter without registering pursuant to the Outdoor
- 4 Outfitters and Guides Registration Act is quilty of a Class IV
- 5 misdemeanor and shall not be eligible to receive a registration
- 6 <u>certificate for one year from the date of conviction.</u>
- 7 Sec. 21. The commission may adopt and promulgate rules
- 8 <u>and regulations to carry out the Outdoor Outfitters and Guides</u>
- 9 Registration Act.
