A BILL

- FOR AN ACT relating to crimes and offenses; to amend section 28-318,
 Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2010; to change
 the definition of sexual contact to include kissing
 without consent; and to repeal the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 28-318, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2010, is amended to read:
- 3 28-318 As used in sections 28-317 to 28-322.04, unless
- 4 the context otherwise requires:
- 5 (1) Actor means a person accused of sexual assault;
- 6 (2) Intimate parts means the genital area, groin, inner
- 7 thighs, buttocks, or breasts;
- 8 (3) Past sexual behavior means sexual behavior other than
- 9 the sexual behavior upon which the sexual assault is alleged;
- 10 (4) Serious personal injury means great bodily injury or
- 11 disfigurement, extreme mental anguish or mental trauma, pregnancy,
- 12 disease, or loss or impairment of a sexual or reproductive organ;
- 13 (5) Sexual contact means the intentional touching of the
- 14 victim's sexual or intimate parts or the intentional touching of the
- 15 victim's clothing covering the immediate area of the victim's sexual
- 16 or intimate parts. Sexual contact shall also mean the touching by the
- 17 victim of the actor's sexual or intimate parts or the clothing
- 18 covering the immediate area of the actor's sexual or intimate parts
- 19 when such touching is intentionally caused by the actor. Sexual
- 20 contact also includes kissing by the actor with his or her mouth on
- 21 the victim's mouth without the victim's consent. Sexual contact shall
- 22 include only such conduct which can be reasonably construed as being
- 23 for the purpose of sexual arousal or gratification of either party.
- 24 Sexual contact shall also include the touching of a child with the
- 25 actor's sexual or intimate parts on any part of the child's body for

1 purposes of sexual assault of a child under sections 28-319.01 and

- 2 28-320.01;
- 3 (6) Sexual penetration means sexual intercourse in its
- 4 ordinary meaning, cunnilingus, fellatio, anal intercourse, or any
- 5 intrusion, however slight, of any part of the actor's or victim's
- 6 body or any object manipulated by the actor into the genital or anal
- 7 openings of the victim's body which can be reasonably construed as
- 8 being for nonmedical or nonhealth purposes. Sexual penetration shall
- 9 not require emission of semen;
- 10 (7) Victim means the person alleging to have been
- 11 sexually assaulted;
- 12 (8) Without consent means:
- 13 (a)(i) The victim was compelled to submit due to the use
- 14 of force or threat of force or coercion, or (ii) the victim expressed
- 15 a lack of consent through words, or (iii) the victim expressed a lack
- 16 of consent through conduct, or (iv) the consent, if any was actually
- 17 given, was the result of the actor's deception as to the identity of
- 18 the actor or the nature or purpose of the act on the part of the
- 19 actor;
- 20 (b) The victim need only resist, either verbally or
- 21 physically, so as to make the victim's refusal to consent genuine and
- 22 real and so as to reasonably make known to the actor the victim's
- 23 refusal to consent; and
- 24 (c) A victim need not resist verbally or physically where
- 25 it would be useless or futile to do so; and

1 (9) Force or threat of force means (a) the use of

- 2 physical force which overcomes the victim's resistance or (b) the
- 3 threat of physical force, express or implied, against the victim or a
- 4 third person that places the victim in fear of death or in fear of
- 5 serious personal injury to the victim or a third person where the
- 6 victim reasonably believes that the actor has the present or future
- 7 ability to execute the threat.
