A BILL

1	FOR AN ACT	relating to insurance; to amend section 44-785, Reissue
2		Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to require the provision of
3		breast density information to a mammography patient as
4		prescribed; and to repeal the original section.

5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 44-785, Reissue Revised Statutes of
 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 44-785 (1) Notwithstanding section 44-3,131, (a) any individual or group sickness and accident insurance policy or 4 5 subscriber contract delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed in this state and any hospital, medical, or surgical expense-incurred б 7 policy, except for policies that provide coverage for a specified 8 disease or other limited-benefit coverage, and (b) any self-funded 9 employee benefit plan to the extent not preempted by federal law 10 shall include coverage for screening mammography as follows:

(i) For women who are thirty-five years of age and older but younger than forty years of age, one base-line mammogram between thirty-five and forty years of age;

(ii) For women who are forty years of age and older but younger than fifty years of age, one mammogram every two years or more frequently based on the patient's physician's recommendation; and

18 (iii) For women who are fifty years of age or older, one19 mammogram every year.

20 (2) On and after the effective date of this act, each 21 mammography report provided to a patient shall include information 22 about breast density based on the Breast Imaging Reporting and Data 23 System established by the American College of Radiology. Where 24 applicable, such report shall include the following notice: "If your 25 mammogram demonstrates that you have dense breast tissue, which could

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hide small abnormalities, you might benefit from supplementary screening tests, which can include a breast ultrasound screening or a breast magnetic resonance imaging examination, or both, depending on your individual risk factors. A report of your mammography results, which contains information about your breast density, has been sent to your physician's office and you should contact your physician if you have any questions or concerns about this report.".

8 (2) This section does not prevent application of 9 deductible or copayment provisions contained in the policy or health benefit plan or require that coverage under an individual or group 10 policy or health benefit plan be extended to any other procedures. 11 12 The coverage provided by this section shall not be less favorable 13 than for other radiological examinations. This section does not apply if the covered individuals are provided an ongoing screening 14 15 mammography program which at a minimum meets the requirements of this 16 section as a separate benefit.

17 (3) (4) For purposes of this section, screening 18 mammography shall mean radiological examination of the breast of 19 asymptomatic women for the early detection of breast cancer, which 20 examination shall include (a) a cranio-caudal and a medial lateral 21 oblique view of each breast and (b) a licensed radiologist's interpretation of the results of the procedure. Screening mammography 22 shall not include diagnostic mammography, additional projections 23 required for lesion definition, breast ultrasound, or any breast 24 25 interventional procedure. Screening mammography shall be performed by

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- a mammogram supplier who meets the standards of the federal
