6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 60-3,122, Reissue Revised Statutes of 2 Nebraska, is amended to read: 3 60-3,122 (1) Any person may, in addition to the application required by section 60-385, apply to the department for 4 5 license plates designed by the department to indicate that he or she 6 is a survivor of the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor if he or she: 7 (a) Was a member of the United States Armed Forces on 8 December 7, 1941; 9 (b) Was on station on December 7, 1941, during the hours 10 of 7:55 a.m. to 9:45 a.m. Hawaii time at Pearl Harbor, the island of Oahu, or offshore at a distance not to exceed three miles; 11 12 (c) Was discharged or otherwise separated with a 13 characterization of honorable from the United States Armed Forces; 14 and (d) Holds a current membership in a Nebraska Chapter of 15 16 the Pearl Harbor Survivors Association. 17 (2) The license plates shall be issued upon the applicant paying the regular license fee and an additional fee of five dollars 18 and furnishing proof satisfactory to the department that the 19 20 applicant fulfills the requirements provided by subsection (1) of this section. The additional fee shall be remitted to the State 21 Treasurer for credit to the Nebraska Veteran Cemetery System 22 23 Operation Fund. Any number of motor vehicles, trailers, semitrailers, or cabin trailers owned by the applicant may be so licensed at any 24 one time. Motor vehicles and trailers registered under section 25

2 (3) The surviving spouse of a person who was issued 3 license plates under this section may continue to use or apply for 4 and use the plates for a vehicle registered in the surviving spouse's 5 name upon payment of the appropriate fee.

6 (3) (4) If the license plates issued pursuant to this
7 section are lost, stolen, or mutilated, the recipient of the plates
8 shall be issued replacement license plates upon request and without
9 charge.

Sec. 2. Section 60-3,123, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read:

12 60-3,123 (1) Any person who was captured and incarcerated 13 by an enemy of the United States during a period of conflict with such enemy and who was discharged or otherwise separated with a 14 characterization of honorable from or is currently serving in the 15 United States Armed Forces may, in addition to the application 16 required in section 60-385, apply to the department for license 17 plates designed to indicate that he or she is a former prisoner of 18 19 war.

20 (2) The license plates shall be issued upon the applicant 21 paying the regular license fee and an additional fee of five dollars 22 and furnishing proof satisfactory to the department that the 23 applicant was formerly a prisoner of war. The additional fee shall be 24 remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the Nebraska Veteran 25 Cemetery System Operation Fund. Any number of motor vehicles,

trailers, semitrailers, or cabin trailers owned by the applicant may be so licensed at any one time. Motor vehicles and trailers registered under section 60-3,198 shall not be so licensed.

4 (3) The surviving spouse of a person who was issued 5 plates under this section may continue to use or apply for and use 6 the plates for a vehicle registered in the surviving spouse's name 7 and upon payment of the appropriate fee.

8 (3) (4) If the license plates issued under this section 9 are lost, stolen, or mutilated, the recipient of the license plates 10 shall be issued replacement license plates upon request and without 11 charge.

Sec. 3. Section 60-3,124, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read:

14 60-3,124 (1) Any person who is a veteran of the United States Armed Forces, who was discharged or otherwise separated with a 15 16 characterization of honorable or general (under honorable conditions), and who is classified by the United States Department of 17 Veterans Affairs as one hundred percent service-connected disabled 18 19 may, in addition to the application required in section 60-385, apply 20 to the Department of Motor Vehicles for license plates designed by 21 the department to indicate that the applicant is a disabled veteran. The inscription on the license plates shall be D.A.V. immediately 22 23 below the license plate number to indicate that the holder of the license plates is a disabled veteran. 24

25 (2) The plates shall be issued upon the applicant paying

the regular license fee and an additional fee of five dollars and 1 2 furnishing proof satisfactory to the department that the applicant is 3 a disabled veteran. The additional fee shall be remitted to the State 4 Treasurer for credit to the Nebraska Veteran Cemetery System 5 Operation Fund. Any number of motor vehicles, trailers, semitrailers, or cabin trailers owned by the applicant may be so licensed at any 6 7 one time. Motor vehicles and trailers registered under section 8 60-3,198 shall not be so licensed.

9 (3) The surviving spouse of a person who was issued 10 plates under this section may continue to use or apply for and use 11 the plates for a vehicle registered in the surviving spouse's name 12 and upon payment of the appropriate fee.

13 (3) (4) If the license plates issued under this section 14 are lost, stolen, or mutilated, the recipient of the plates shall be 15 issued replacement license plates as provided in section 60-3,157.

Sec. 4. Section 60-3,125, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read:

60-3,125 (1) Any person may, in addition to 18 the application required by section 60-385, apply to the department for 19 20 license plates designed by the department to indicate that the 21 applicant has received from the federal government an award of a Purple Heart. The inscription of the plates shall be designed so as 22 23 to include a facsimile of the award and beneath any numerical designation upon the plates pursuant to section 60-370 the words 24 25 Purple Heart separately on one line and the words Combat Wounded on

1 the line below.

2 (2) The license plates shall be issued upon payment of 3 the regular license fee and an additional fee of five dollars and furnishing proof satisfactory to the department that the applicant 4 5 was awarded the Purple Heart. The additional fee shall be remitted to б the State Treasurer for credit to the Nebraska Veteran Cemetery 7 System Operation Fund. Any number of motor vehicles, trailers, 8 semitrailers, or cabin trailers owned by the applicant may be so 9 licensed at any one time. Motor vehicles and trailers registered under section 60-3,198 shall not be so licensed. 10

11 (3) The surviving spouse of a person who was issued 12 plates under this section may continue to use or apply for and use 13 the plates for a vehicle registered in the surviving spouse's name 14 and upon payment of the appropriate fee.

15 (3) (4) If license plates issued pursuant to this section 16 are lost, stolen, or mutilated, the recipient of the plates shall be 17 issued replacement license plates upon request and without charge.

 19 and 60-3,125, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
