5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 68-1207, Reissue Revised Statutes of
 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 68-1207 The Department of Health and Human Services shall 4 supervise all public child welfare services as described by law. The 5 department shall establish and maintain caseloads to carry out child 6 welfare services which provide for adequate, timely, and indepth 7 investigations and services to children and families. In establishing 8 the standards for such caseloads, the department shall (1) include workload factors 9 the that may differ due to geographic 10 responsibilities, office location, and the travel required to provide a timely response in the investigation of abuse and neglect, the 11 12 protection of children, and the provision of services to children and 13 families in a uniform and consistent statewide manner and (2) consider workload standards recommended by national child welfare 14 15 organizations and factors related to the attainment of such 16 standards, except that no caseload shall exceed by more than two cases the caseload standard recommended by a national organization 17 the primary purpose of which is advocating public policies to aid 18 children and youth who have experienced abuse, neglect, family 19 20 disruption, or a range of other factors that jeopardize their safety, 21 permanence, or well-being and for their families and caregivers. The 22 department shall consult with the appropriate employee representative 23 in establishing such standards.

To carry out the provisions of this section, the Legislature shall provide funds for additional staff.

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Sec. 2. Section 68-1207.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of
 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 68-1207.01 (1) The Department of Health and Human 4 Services shall annually provide a report to the Legislature and 5 Governor outlining the caseloads of child protective services <u>and all</u> 6 private entities under contract with the State of Nebraska to provide 7 <u>such services</u>, the factors considered in their establishment, and the 8 fiscal resources necessary for their maintenance. Such report shall 9 include:

10 (1)—(a) A comparison of caseloads established by the 11 department and all private entities under contract with the State of 12 Nebraska to provide such services with the workload standards 13 recommended by national child welfare organizations along with the 14 amount of fiscal resources necessary to maintain such caseloads in 15 Nebraska;

(2)(a) (b)(i) The number of child welfare services 16 caseworkers and case managers employed by the State of Nebraska and 17 child welfare services workers, providing services directly to 18 children and families, who are under contract with the State of 19 20 Nebraska or employed by a private entity under contract with the 21 State of Nebraska and (b) (ii) statistics on the average length of employment in such positions, statewide and by health and human 22 23 services area;

24 (3)(a) (c)(i) The average caseload of child welfare
25 services caseworkers and case managers employed by the State of

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Nebraska and child welfare services workers, providing services 1 2 directly to children and families, who are under contract with the 3 State of Nebraska or employed by a private entity under contract with the State of Nebraska and (b) (ii) the outcomes of such cases, 4 5 including the number of children reunited with their families, б children adopted, children in guardianships, placement of children 7 with relatives, and other permanent resolutions established, 8 statewide and by health and human services area; and

9 <u>(4) (d)</u> The average cost of training child welfare 10 services caseworkers and case managers employed by the State of 11 Nebraska and child welfare services workers, providing services 12 directly to children and families, who are under contract with the 13 State of Nebraska or employed by a private entity under contract with 14 the State of Nebraska, statewide and by health and human services 15 area.

16 (5) Failure to issue the report required by subsection 17 (1) of this section by July 1 of each year shall result in the unpaid 18 suspension of the chief executive officer of the department until the 19 report is issued.
