1 Section 1. Section 49-1446.02, Reissue Revised Statutes

- of Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 49-1446.02 Notwithstanding any other provision of the
- 4 Nebraska Political Accountability and Disclosure Act, no committee
- 5 shall expend funds for the purchase or payment of:
- 6 (1) Clothes or medical or dental expenses of a candidate
- 7 or the members of his or her immediate family;
- 8 (2) Installment payments for an automobile owned by a
- 9 candidate;
- 10 (3) Mortgage or rental payments for a permanent residence
- 11 of a candidate;
- 12 (4) The satisfaction of personal debts, including
- 13 installment payments on personal loans, except campaign loans subject
- 14 to reporting required by subsection (2) of section 49-1456;
- 15 (5) Personal services, including the services of a lawyer
- 16 or accountant, except that this subdivision does not prohibit
- 17 <u>expenditures for personal services for campaign services subject to</u>
- 18 reporting pursuant to the provisions of section 49-1455 unless the
- 19 personal services are performed by the holder of an elective office;

- 21 (6) Office supplies, staff, or furnishings for the public
- 22 office for which an individual is a candidate for nomination or
- 23 election except as set out in subsection (2) of section 49-1446.01.
