

AMENDMENTS TO LB 198

Introduced by Appropriations

1 1. Strike the original sections and insert the following
2 new sections:

3 Section 1. DEFINITION OF APPROPRIATION PERIOD.

4 For purposes of this act and any other legislative bill
5 passed by the One Hundred Third Legislature, First or Second
6 Session, which appropriates funds, FY2012-13 means the period July
7 1, 2012, through June 30, 2013, FY2013-14 means the period July 1,
8 2013, through June 30, 2014, FY2014-15 means the period July 1,
9 2014, through June 30, 2015, FY2015-16 means the period July 1,
10 2015, through June 30, 2016, and FY2016-17 means the period July 1,
11 2016, through June 30, 2017.

12 Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION LANGUAGE.

13 There are hereby appropriated, for FY2013-14 and
14 FY2014-15, the sums set forth in this act to each agency for
15 each program from the respective funds for capital construction
16 projects, land acquisition, lease-purchase arrangements, and major
17 equipment acquisition, except as otherwise appropriated.

18 Sec. 3. REAPPROPRIATION OF BALANCE, FY2013-14 to
19 FY2014-15.

20 In addition to the appropriations set forth in this
21 act, there are hereby reappropriated all unexpended appropriation
22 balances existing on June 30, 2014, for FY2014-15 to the respective
23 agencies, programs, and funds listed in this act, except as

1 otherwise provided in this act.

2 Sec. 4. NEBRASKA ACCOUNTING SYSTEM MANUAL DEFINITIONS.

3 The definitions contained in the Nebraska Accounting
4 System Manual, and any amendments thereto, on file with the Clerk
5 of the Legislature are hereby adopted by the Legislature as the
6 definitions for this act.

7 Sec. 5. DRAWING AND PAYING WARRANTS.

8 The Director of Administrative Services shall draw
9 warrants upon the proper fund in the state treasury for an amount
10 not to exceed the appropriations set forth in this act upon
11 presentation of proper documentation. The State Treasurer shall pay
12 the warrants out of the appropriate funds.

13 Sec. 6. It is the intent of the Legislature that
14 the appropriations for capital facilities follow an orderly and
15 reasonable process based upon defined and documented need and an
16 analysis of the utilization of existing facilities.

17 The biennial appropriations contained in this act
18 covering FY2013-14 and FY2014-15, which have been designated for
19 planning, require from the agency a complete program statement
20 prepared in accordance with the Procedural Manual for Capital
21 Construction as approved by the state building division of
22 the Department of Administrative Services. Projects directly
23 related to program continuation such as fire and life safety,
24 maintenance, utility improvements, handicapped access, and master
25 planning require a statement of needs prepared in accordance with
26 the manual. An appropriation for drawings and construction may
27 be recommended only after submission of an acceptable program

1 statement or statement of needs on or before September 15 to the
2 state building division, the budget division of the Department of
3 Administrative Services, and the Legislative Fiscal Analyst.

4 Program statements that have been submitted prior to
5 FY2013-14 shall be updated if necessary and resubmitted during
6 the period July 1, 2013, to September 1, 2013. Program statements
7 that have been submitted prior to FY2014-15 shall be updated
8 if necessary and resubmitted during the period July 1, 2014, to
9 September 1, 2014, by agency priority. Such priority shall be
10 subject to final modification by the governing authority of each
11 agency on or before September 15, 2014.

12 Sec. 7. It is the intent of the Legislature that agencies
13 should construct or renovate facilities in such a manner as
14 to provide the greatest cost-effective energy savings possible.
15 Design criteria emphasizing efficiency, functionality, and energy
16 conservation shall be reflected in program statements, schematic
17 design documents, design development documents, and construction
18 documents. The state building division of the Department of
19 Administrative Services and the State Energy Office shall provide
20 technical assistance to the state agencies, upon request, to assist
21 them in providing for energy-efficient new or renovated facilities.

14 The Department of Health and Human Services is hereby
15 authorized to acquire land to serve as the site for a new veterans'
16 home to be located in central Nebraska and to construct the new

19 funding sources shall not exceed \$121,020,313.

20 There is included in the appropriation to this program

23 complete the project.

24 The Nebraska Capital Construction Funds appropriated in
25 this section may be used as matching funds for available federal or
26 other funds. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit
27 use of any private, local, or internally reallocated funds as a

1 match for any available federal or other funds.

2 It is the intent of the Legislature that the Department
3 of Health and Human Services shall provide a report to the
4 Legislature outlining the process and criteria used to select a
5 site for the new veterans' home. The report shall include, but
6 not be limited to: Identification of the communities submitting
7 offers to be a site for the new facility; written responses of
8 interested communities to questions posed by the site selection
9 committee; the process used by the selection committee to evaluate
10 offers; the criteria used by the site selection committee to make
11 a recommendation to the Director of Veterans' Homes; and the final
12 site selected. The report shall be provided to the Legislature
13 within three weeks after site selection. It is the intent of the
14 Legislature that the site shall not be selected prior to June 5,
15 2013.

12 Sec. 55. This act becomes operative on July 1, 2013.

13 Sec. 56. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
14 when passed and approved according to law.
