- 11 Any federal funds not otherwise appropriated, any

- 15 reappropriated to the agency and project for which the funds were
- 16 allocated by the federal government.
- 17 Sec. 53. GIFTS, BEQUESTS, AND DEVISES.
- 18 Any gift, bequest, or devise made available to the State
- 19 of Nebraska for any purpose or purposes, together with the income
- 20 thereof, shall be allocated to the expending agency designated
- 21 by such donor or, if none is designated by such donor, by the
