Members serve without compensation, but they are allowed to be reimbursed for their expenses. The Crime Commission estimates expenses at \$3,930 for FY14 and \$7,860 for FY15. See their response following for additional details.

COMMENTS: The Revised Crime Commission analysis estimates travel costs for two additional members of the Nebraska Police Standards Advisory Council. Since the monthly meetings of the Council are held at the Law Enforcement Training Center in Grand Island and the two new members could be appointed from anywhere in the state, the Crime Commission estimates provide for the possibility of one member coming from western Nebraska and one coming from eastern Nebraska. FY 2013-14 estimates are based on LB 350 going into effect on January 1, 2014. Given these parameters, the fiscal impact noted by the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice (Crime Commission) appears reasonable.
