A BILL

FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Chemigation Act; to amend sections 46-1101, 46-1103, 46-1119, and 46-1121, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to define a term; to change provisions relating to permit approval and fees; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original sections.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 46-1101, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 46-1101 Sections 46-1101 to 46-1148 <u>and section 3 of this</u>
- 4 <u>act</u>shall be known and may be cited as the Nebraska Chemigation Act.
- 5 Sec. 2. Section 46-1103, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 6 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 7 46-1103 For purposes of the Nebraska Chemigation Act,
- 8 unless the context otherwise requires, the definitions found in
- 9 sections 46-1104 to 46-1116 and section 3 of this act shall apply.
- 10 Sec. 3. Working day shall mean Monday through Friday but
- 11 <u>shall not include Saturday, Sunday, or a federal or state holiday. In</u>
- 12 computing two working days, the day of receipt of the permit is not
- 13 included and the last day of the two working days is included.
- 14 Sec. 4. Section 46-1119, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 15 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 16 46-1119 (1) A person may file an application with the
- 17 district for an emergency permit on forms provided by the district.
- 18 The district shall review each emergency application and approve or
- 19 deny the application within forty-eight hours two working days after
- 20 the application is filed. An emergency application shall be approved
- 21 and a permit issued by the district if the irrigation distribution
- 22 system complies with the equipment requirements of section 46-1127
- 23 and the applicator has been certified under sections 46-1128 and
- 24 46-1129. If the district has not denied an emergency permit within
- 25 forty-eight hours, two working days, it shall be deemed approved.

1 Such permit shall be valid for a period of forty-five days from the

- 2 date of issuance.
- 3 (2) The application for an emergency permit shall be
- 4 accompanied by a fee of one hundred dollars payable to the district.
- 5 Ninety dollars of the fee shall be retained by the district, and ten
- 6 dollars shall be paid by the district to the department. The
- 7 application shall contain the same information as required in section
- 8 46-1120.
- 9 (2) The application for an emergency permit shall be
- 10 accompanied by a fee as established in 46-1121 not to exceed five
- 11 <u>hundred dollars payable to the district.</u> For each permit, ten dollars
- 12 shall be paid by the district to the department. The application
- 13 shall contain the same information as required in section 46-1120.
- 14 (3) Any holder of an emergency permit or an applicator
- 15 applying chemicals pursuant thereto who violates any of the
- 16 provisions of this section shall have such permit automatically
- 17 revoked without a hearing and shall be guilty of a Class II
- 18 misdemeanor.
- 19 Sec. 5. Section 46-1121, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 20 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 21 46-1121 (1) The fee for initial application for a permit
- 22 or special permit shall be thirty dollars payable to the district.
- 23 Twenty-five dollars of the fee shall be retained by the district and
- 24 five dollars paid by the district to the department.
- 25 The annual fee for renewal of a permit or special permit

1 shall be ten dollars paid to the district. Two dollars of the annual

- 2 fee shall be paid by the district to the department.
- 3 (1) To aid in defraying the cost of administration of the
- 4 Nebraska Chemigation Act, the district shall collect an initial
- 5 application fee for a permit, a special permit fee, an annual renewal
- 6 fee, and an emergency permit fee. The fees shall be established by
- 7 the district and shall be sufficient to cover the ongoing
- 8 administrative costs and the costs of annual inspection programs by
- 9 the district and department. The fees collected pursuant to this
- 10 section shall be established by the district in the amount necessary
- 11 to pay reasonable costs of administering the permit program pursuant
- 12 to the act. The fee for a permit and special permit shall not exceed
- 13 one hundred fifty dollars. The fee for a renewal permit shall not
- 14 exceed one hundred dollars. The fees for an emergency permit under
- 15 <u>section 46-1119 shall not exceed five hundred dollars. The district</u>
- 16 shall adopt and promulgate rules and regulations establishing a fee
- 17 schedule to be paid to the district by a person or persons applying
- 18 for a permit to operate a chemigation system.
- 19 (2) The fee for initial application for a permit or
- 20 special permit shall be payable to the district. For each permit,
- 21 five dollars shall be paid by the district to the department.
- 22 (3) The annual fee for renewal of a permit or special
- 23 permit shall be payable to the district. For each permit, two dollars
- of the annual fee shall be paid by the district to the department.
- 25 (4) All fees shall be used by the district and the

1 department to administer the Nebraska Chemigation Act. The

- 2 department's fee shall be credited to the Chemigation Costs Fund
- 3 which is hereby created. All fees collected by the department
- 4 pursuant to the act shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for
- 5 credit to the fund. Transfers may be made from the fund to the
- 6 General Fund at the direction of the Legislature. Any money in the
- 7 Chemigation Costs Fund available for investment shall be invested by
- 8 the state investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital
- 9 Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.
- 10 (2) (5) All permits issued pursuant to sections 46-1117
- 11 and 46-1117.01 shall be annual permits and shall expire each year on
- 12 June 1. A permit may be renewed each year upon payment of the annual
- 13 renewal fee and completion of a form provided by the district which
- 14 lists the names of all chemicals used in chemigation the previous
- 15 year. Once a permit has expired, it shall not be reinstated without
- 16 meeting all of the requirements for a new permit including an
- 17 inspection and payment of the initial application fee.
- 18 Sec. 6. Original sections 46-1101, 46-1103, 46-1119, and
- 19 46-1121, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
