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1 Section 1. Section 68-901, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2012, is amended to read:
- 3 68-901 Sections 68-901 to 68-974 <u>and section 2 of this</u>
- 4 <u>act</u>shall be known and may be cited as the Medical Assistance Act.
- 5 Sec. 2. (1) The Legislature finds that:
- 6 (a) The federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care
- 7 Act of 2010, Public Law 111-148, provides for medicaid reimbursement
- 8 for programs to permit disabled adults and the elderly to continue
- 9 living in their homes and not in long-term care facilities;
- 10 (b) States may apply for federal funds to implement such
- 11 programs which are intended to enhance opportunities for living in
- 12 <u>community-based settings rather than long-term care facilities</u>,
- 13 improve systems' performance and efficiency, create tools to help
- 14 consumers with care planning and assessment, and improve quality
- 15 <u>measurement and oversight; and</u>
- 16 (c) A number of states are participating in such
- 17 programs, and when completed the results of the programs will be
- 18 <u>available to all states.</u>
- 19 (2) Effective January 1, 2014, for medicaid authorization
- 20 and payment for home health care services, there shall be no
- 21 reduction in reimbursement rates and no limitation on services,
- 22 including, but not limited to, extended-home nursing services,
- 23 <u>limitations and requirements for skilled nursing services, second</u>
- 24 visit on same day, and nursing services for adults twenty-one years
- 25 of age and older until Balancing Incentives Programs pursuant to

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- 1 section 10202 of the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care
- 2 Act of 2010, as such section existed on January 1, 2014, have been
- 3 completed and the Department of Health and Human Services can review
- 4 the results of these programs with the goal of assessing and
- 5 improving Nebraska's provision of medicaid home health services.
- 6 Sec. 3. This act becomes operative on January 1, 2014.
- 7 Sec. 4. Original section 68-901, Revised Statutes
- 8 Cumulative Supplement, 2012, is repealed.
- 9 Sec. 5. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
- 10 when passed and approved according to law.
