1	FOR AN ACT relating to the medical assistance program; to amend
2	section 68-901, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
3	2012; to change payment provisions relating to encounters
4	with multiple health care professionals at a federally
5	qualified health center; to harmonize provisions; and to
6	repeal the original section.
7	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 68-901, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2012, is amended to read:
- 3 68-901 Sections 68-901 to 68-974 <u>and section 2 of this</u>
- 4 <u>act</u>shall be known and may be cited as the Medical Assistance Act.
- 5 Sec. 2. (1) Encounters with more than one health care
- 6 professional and multiple encounters with the same health care
- 7 professional which take place on the same day at a federally
- 8 qualified health center constitute a single visit unless (a) one of
- 9 the additional health care professionals is a psychiatrist, clinical
- 10 psychologist, licensed mental health practitioner, licensed
- independent mental health practitioner, certified diabetes educator,
- 12 registered dietician, or pharmacist or (b) the patient, subsequent to
- 13 the first encounter, suffers an illness or injury requiring
- 14 additional diagnosis or treatment.
- 15 (2) For purposes of this section:
- 16 (a) Encounter means a face-to-face visit between a
- 17 medicaid-eligible patient and a physician, physician assistant,
- 18 psychiatrist, advanced practice registered nurse, visiting nurse,
- 19 <u>clinical psychologist, clinical social worker, licensed independent</u>
- 20 mental health practitioner, licensed mental health practitioner,
- 21 <u>certified diabetes educator, registered dietician, or pharmacist; and</u>
- 22 (b) Federally qualified health center has the definition
- found in section 1905(1)(2)(B) of the federal Social Security Act, 42
- 24 <u>U.S.C.</u> 1396d(1)(2)(B), as such section existed on January 1, 2014.
