A BILL

- FOR AN ACT relating to educational entities; to amend sections 79-526
 and 79-1201, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to
 authorize emergency expenditures as prescribed; to
 harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original
 sections.
- Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 79-526, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 79-526 (1) The school board or board of education of a
- 4 Class I, II, III, IV, or VI school district has responsibility for
- 5 the general care and upkeep of the schools, shall provide the
- 6 necessary supplies and equipment, and, except as otherwise provided,
- 7 has the power to cause pupils to be taught in such branches and
- 8 classified in such grades or departments as may seem best adapted to
- 9 a course of study which the board shall establish with the consent
- 10 and advice of the State Department of Education. The board shall make
- 11 provision for pupils that may enter at any time during the school
- 12 year. The board shall have a record kept of the advancement of all
- 13 pupils in each branch of study. The board shall make rules and
- 14 regulations as it deems necessary for the government and health of
- 15 the pupils and devise any means as may seem best to secure the
- 16 regular attendance and progress of children at school.
- 17 (2) In the event of a disaster or emergency impacting
- 18 school district personnel, students, property, or operations, the
- 19 school board or board of education of the impacted Class I, II, III,
- 20 IV, or VI school district may make emergency expenditures, enter into
- 21 contracts, and incur obligations for emergency management purposes
- 22 <u>regardless of existing statutory limitations and requirements</u>
- 23 pertaining to appropriations, budgeting, levies, or the manner of
- 24 entering into contracts. If any such expenditure, contract, or
- 25 <u>obligation will be in excess of or in violation of existing statutory</u>

1 limitations or requirements, then before any such expenditure,

- 2 contract, or obligation is undertaken it shall be approved by a
- 3 majority vote of the school board or board of education of the
- 4 impacted Class I, II, III, IV, or VI school district, and such
- 5 governing body may not vote its approval unless it has secured the
- 6 certificate of a city, village, county, or interjurisdictional
- 7 emergency management director under the Emergency Management Act that
- 8 such action is necessary in the public interest for emergency
- 9 management purposes. For purposes of this subsection, (a) disaster
- 10 means any event or the imminent threat thereof causing widespread or
- 11 severe damage, injury, or loss of life or property resulting from any
- 12 natural or manmade cause and (b) emergency means any event or the
- 13 imminent threat thereof causing serious damage, injury, or loss of
- 14 life or property resulting from any natural or manmade cause which
- 15 requires immediate action to accomplish the school district's
- 16 <u>educational purposes and to effectively respond to the event or</u>
- 17 threat of the event.
- 18 Sec. 2. Section 79-1201, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 19 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 20 79-1201 Sections 79-1201 to 79-1249 and section 3 of this
- 21 <u>act</u>shall be known and may be cited as the Educational Service Units
- 22 Act.
- Sec. 3. <u>In the event of a disaster or emergency impacting</u>
- 24 educational service unit personnel, property, or operations, the
- 25 <u>educational service unit board may make emergency expenditures, enter</u>

into contracts, and incur obligations for emergency management 1 2 purposes regardless of existing statutory limitations and 3 requirements pertaining to appropriations, budgeting, levies, or the 4 manner of entering into contracts. If any such expenditure, contract, 5 or obligation will be in excess of or in violation of existing statutory limitations or requirements, then before any such 6 7 expenditure, contract, or obligation is undertaken it shall be 8 approved by a majority vote of the board, and such board may not vote 9 its approval unless it has secured the certificate of a city, 10 village, county, or interjurisdictional emergency management director under the Emergency Management Act that such action is necessary in 11 12 the public interest for emergency management purposes. For purposes 13 of this section, (1) disaster means any event or the imminent threat thereof causing widespread or severe damage, injury, or loss of life 14 15 or property resulting from any natural or manmade cause and (2) 16 emergency means any event or the imminent threat thereof causing serious damage, injury, or loss of life or property resulting from 17 18 any natural or manmade cause which requires immediate action to accomplish the educational service unit's purposes and to effectively 19 20 respond to the event or threat of the event. 21 Sec. 4. Original sections 79-526 and 79-1201, Reissue 22 Revised Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
