A BILL

- FOR AN ACT relating to public health and welfare; to amend section
 68-911, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to provide
 for a medicaid state plan amendment or waiver; to repeal
 the original section; and to declare an emergency.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 68-911, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 68-911 (1) Medical assistance shall include coverage for
- 4 health care and related services as required under Title XIX of the
- 5 federal Social Security Act, including, but not limited to:
- 6 (a) Inpatient and outpatient hospital services;
- 7 (b) Laboratory and X-ray services;
- 8 (c) Nursing facility services;
- 9 (d) Home health services;
- 10 (e) Nursing services;
- 11 (f) Clinic services;
- 12 (g) Physician services;
- (h) Medical and surgical services of a dentist;
- 14 (i) Nurse practitioner services;
- 15 (j) Nurse midwife services;
- 16 (k) Pregnancy-related services;
- 17 (1) Medical supplies; and
- 18 (m) Early and periodic screening and diagnosis and
- 19 treatment services for children.
- 20 (2) In addition to coverage otherwise required under this
- 21 section, medical assistance may include coverage for health care and
- 22 related services as permitted but not required under Title XIX of the
- 23 federal Social Security Act, including, but not limited to:
- 24 (a) Prescribed drugs;
- 25 (b) Intermediate care facilities for the mentally

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retarded;
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                 (c) Home and community-based services for aged persons
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     and persons with disabilities;
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                 (d) Dental services;
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                 (e) Rehabilitation services;
                 (f) Personal care services;
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                 (g) Durable medical equipment;
                 (h) Medical transportation services;
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                 (i) Vision-related services;
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                 (j) Speech therapy services;
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                 (k) Physical therapy services;
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                 (1) Chiropractic services;
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                 (m) Occupational therapy services;
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                 (n) Optometric services;
                 (o) Podiatric services;
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                 (p) Hospice services;
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                 (q) Mental health and substance abuse services;
                 (r) Hearing screening services for newborn and infant
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     children; and
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                 (s) Administrative expenses related to administrative
     activities, including outreach services, provided by school districts
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     and educational service units to students who are eligible or
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    potentially eligible for medical assistance.
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                 (3) No later than July 1, 2009, the department shall
     submit a state plan amendment or waiver to the federal Centers for
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1 Medicare and Medicaid Services to provide coverage under the medical

- 2 assistance program for community-based secure residential and
- 3 subacute behavioral health services for all eligible recipients,
- 4 without regard to whether the recipient has been ordered by a mental
- 5 health board under the Nebraska Mental Health Commitment Act to
- 6 receive such services.
- 7 (4) No later than September 1, 2013, the department shall
- 8 submit a state plan amendment or waiver under section 1915(c) of the
- 9 federal Social Security Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. 1396n(c), to the
- 10 federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to provide
- 11 coverage under the medical assistance program for home and community-
- 12 <u>based services for children with serious emotional disturbance. Such</u>
- 13 amendment or waiver shall provide for serving children four years of
- 14 age or older and younger than twenty-one years of age who have been
- 15 <u>deinstitutionalized or diverted from a psychiatric hospital level of</u>
- 16 care. Services under the waiver shall include, but not be limited to,
- 17 attendant care, independent living and skills building, short-term
- 18 respite care, parent support and training, professional resource
- 19 family care, and facilitation of wrap-around services. For purposes
- 20 of this subsection, wrap-around services means strength-based,
- 21 individualized community-based services for a family with a child
- 22 with a serious emotional disturbance.
- Sec. 2. Original section 68-911, Reissue Revised Statutes
- 24 of Nebraska, is repealed.
- 25 Sec. 3. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect

1 when passed and approved according to law.
