FOR AN ACT relating to land surveying; to amend sections 81-8,114,

81-8,115, 81-8,117, and 81-8,120, Reissue Revised

Statutes of Nebraska; to change provisions relating to

application for registration and a required examination;

and to repeal the original sections.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 81-8,114, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 3 81-8,114 Applications for registration shall be on forms
- 4 prescribed and furnished by the examining board which and shall be

- 19 81-8,117 (1) No person shall be eligible for registration
- 20 unless:
- 21 (1) (a) He or she has successfully passed a written an
- 22 examination, designed to determine his or her proficiency and
- 23 qualification to engage in the practice of land surveying. No
- 24 applicant shall be entitled to take such examination until he or she
- 25 shows the necessary practical experience in land surveying work; and

(2) He or she (i) has not less than six years of 1 2 surveying experience of which five years must be as defined in subdivision (4) of section 81-8,109. Three of such five years must 3 4 have been in a responsible position as a subordinate to a licensed 5 land surveyor, and for the purpose of this section, responsible 6 position shall mean a position that requires initiative, skill, and 7 independent judgment; this term excludes chainman, rodman, instrument 8 person, ordinary drafter, and others doing routine work, or (ii) has 9 graduated, after a course of not less than four years in surveying, 10 engineering, or other approved curriculum, with proportionate credit for lesser time, from a school or college approved by the examining 11 12 board as of satisfactory standing, and has an additional two years of 13 practice in a responsible position. 14 (2) For purposes of this section, responsible position 15 means a position that requires initiative, skill, and independent 16 judgment and does not include the position of chainman, rodman, instrument person, ordinary drafter, or other position performing 17 18 routine work. Sec. 4. Section 81-8,120, Reissue Revised Statutes of 19 20 Nebraska, is amended to read: 81-8,120 A nonresident of this state who is registered as 21 a land surveyor in another state may be registered under sections 22 23 81-8,108 to 81-8,127 by filing an application with the secretary of 24 the examining board and making payment to the examining board of a 25 fee in the sum of not less than twenty-five dollars and not more than

one hundred fifty dollars as set forth in the rules or bylaws. He or 1 2 she-The applicant shall be required to take such examinations as the 3 examining board deems necessary to determine his 4 qualifications, but in any event he or she shall be required to pass 5 a written an examination of not less than four hours' duration which 6 shall include questions on laws, procedures, and practices pertaining 7 to the practice of land surveying in this state. Before a nonresident 8 of this state is registered under sections 81-8,108 to 81-8,127, he 9 or she shall first file a written consent that actions and suits at law may be commenced against him or her in any county of this state 10 11 in which any cause of action may arise because of any survey 12 commenced or conducted by such nonresident surveyor or his or her 13 agent or employees in such county.
