A BILL

- 1 FOR AN ACT relating to insurance; to adopt the Nebraska Exchange
- 2 Transparency Act; and to declare an emergency.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 5 of this act shall be known and

- 2 may be cited as the Nebraska Exchange Transparency Act.
- 3 Sec. 2. The purposes of the Nebraska Exchange
- 4 Transparency Act are to provide state-based oversight,
- 5 recommendations, and transparency regarding the implementation and
- 6 operation of an affordable insurance exchange, as required by the
- 7 <u>federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, 42 U.S.C. 18001,</u>
- 8 <u>et. seq.</u>, by creating the Nebraska Exchange Stakeholder Commission.
- 9 Sec. 3. (1) The Nebraska Exchange Stakeholder Commission
- 10 is created. For administrative and budgetary purposes only, the
- 11 commission shall be housed within the Department of Insurance. The
- 12 <u>commission shall be composed of twelve members as follows:</u>
- 13 (a) Nine members shall be appointed by the Governor in
- 14 the following manner:
- 15 (i) Three members who are health care consumer advocates,
- 16 one from each congressional district, to represent the interests of
- 17 individual consumers who will access health insurance in the
- 18 exchange. These members shall be appointed from a list of at least
- 19 five individuals from each congressional district submitted to the
- 20 Governor by the Executive Board of the Legislative Council;
- 21 (ii) One member to represent the interests of small
- 22 businesses who are qualified to purchase health insurance in the
- 23 <u>exchange</u>. This member shall be appointed from a list of at least five
- 24 <u>individuals submitted to the Governor by the executive board;</u>
- 25 (iii) Two members to represent the interests of health

1 care providers in the state. These members shall be appointed from a

- 2 list of at least ten individuals submitted to the Governor by the
- 3 <u>Health and Human Services Committee of the Legislature;</u>
- 4 (iv) One member to represent the interests of health
- 5 insurance carriers who are eligible to offer health insurance in the
- 6 exchange. This member shall be appointed from a list of at least five
- 7 individuals submitted to the Governor by the Banking, Commerce and
- 8 Insurance Committee of the Legislature;
- 9 (v) One member to represent the interests of health
- 10 insurance agents. This member shall not be a captive agent of any
- 11 health insurance carrier. This member shall be appointed from a list
- 12 of at least five individuals submitted to the Governor by the
- 13 Banking, Commerce and Insurance Committee of the Legislature; and
- 14 <u>(vi) One member who serves on the Nebraska Rural Health</u>
- 15 <u>Advisory Commission;</u>
- 16 (b) The Director of Insurance or his or her designee will
- be a nonvoting, ex officio member of the commission;
- 18 (c) The director of the Division of Medicaid and Long-
- 19 Term Care of the Department of Health and Human services or his or
- 20 her designee will be a nonvoting, ex officio member of the
- 21 commission; and
- 22 (d) The director of the Division of Children and Family
- 23 Services of the Department of Health and Human Services or his or her
- 24 <u>designee will be a nonvoting, ex officio member of the commission.</u>
- 25 (2) The initial lists submitted by the executive board

1 and committees of the Legislature pursuant to subsection (1) of this

- 2 section shall be submitted to the Governor by July 31, 2013. The
- 3 Governor shall make the initial appointments by September 1, 2013.
- 4 (3) The appointed members of the commission shall serve
- 5 for terms of four years, except that of the members first appointed
- 6 <u>the Governor shall designate:</u>
- 7 (a) One of the members representing the interests of
- 8 health care providers in the state to serve a term of three years and
- 9 the other to serve terms of two years;
- 10 <u>(b) The member representing the interests of health</u>
- insurance carriers to serve a term of two years;
- 12 <u>(c) The member representing the interests of health</u>
- insurance agents to serve a term of three years; and
- 14 <u>(d) All other members will serve for terms of four years.</u>
- 15 (4) A member may be reappointed at the expiration of his
- 16 or her term. All succeeding appointments to the commission shall be
- 17 made in the same manner as the original appointments are made and
- 18 succeeding appointees shall have the same qualifications as their
- 19 predecessors.
- 20 (5) An individual appointed to fill a vacancy occurring
- 21 other than by the expiration of a term of office shall be appointed
- 22 for the unexpired term of the member such individual succeeds and
- 23 <u>shall be eligible for appointment to subsequent full four-year terms</u>
- 24 <u>thereafter</u>.
- 25 (6) All appointments whether initial or subsequent shall

1 be subject to the approval of a majority of the members of the

- 2 Legislature, if the Legislature is in session, and, if the
- 3 Legislature is not in session, any appointment shall be temporary
- 4 until the next session of the Legislature, at which time a majority
- 5 of the members of the Legislature may approve or disapprove such
- 6 <u>appointment</u>.
- 7 (7) A member shall have his or her membership terminated
- 8 if he or she ceases to meet the qualification for his or her
- 9 appointment. A member may be removed from the commission for good
- 10 cause upon written notice and upon an opportunity to be heard before
- 11 the Governor. After the hearing, the Governor shall file in the
- 12 office of the Secretary of State a complete statement of the charges
- 13 and the findings and disposition together with a complete record of
- 14 the proceedings.
- 15 Sec. 4. (1) The Nebraska Exchange Stakeholder Commission
- 16 <u>shall organize by selecting a chairperson and a vice-chairperson who</u>
- 17 shall hold office at the pleasure of the commission. The vice-
- 18 chairperson shall act as chairperson in the absence of the
- 19 chairperson or in the event of a vacancy in that position.
- 20 (2) The commission shall hold at least four meetings
- 21 annually, at times and places fixed by the chairperson.
- 22 (3) A majority of the members of the commission shall
- 23 <u>constitute a quorum.</u>
- 24 (4) Members of the commission shall be reimbursed for
- 25 their actual and necessary expenses as provided in sections 81-1174

- 1 to 81-1177.
- 2 Sec. 5. The Nebraska Exchange Stakeholder Commission
- 3 shall:
- 4 (1) Work with state and federal agencies and policymakers
- 5 to provide oversight and recommendations regarding implementation and
- 6 operation of an affordable insurance exchange, including, but not
- 7 limited to:
- 8 (a) Improving access to high-quality, affordable health
- 9 coverage options and to improve policies and processes on the
- 10 <u>exchange to ensure a positive and seamless consumer experience;</u>
- 11 (b) Promoting competitiveness of the exchange, minimize
- 12 administrative burden for issuers, and ensure consumer protections;
- 13 (c) Incorporating existing state policies, capabilities,
- 14 and infrastructure that can also assist in exchange implementation
- 15 <u>and operations;</u>
- 16 (d) Ensuring the effectiveness of the navigator grant
- 17 program;
- 18 (e) Promoting a seamless integration with the medicaid
- 19 program and continuity of care for those transitioning between
- 20 publicly funded coverage and private coverage; and
- 21 (f) Ensuring the small business health options program or
- 22 SHOP Exchange meets the needs and provides value to small businesses.
- 23 (2) Create technical and advisory groups as needed to
- 24 discuss issues related to the exchange and make recommendations to
- 25 the commission, state or federal agencies, and the Legislature;

1 (3) Assist the exchange in meeting the stakeholder

- 2 consultation requirements established in 45 C.F.R. 155.130, as it
- 3 <u>existed on January 1, 2013;</u>
- 4 (4) Identify challenges and problems in the
- 5 implementation and operation of the exchange and prepare
- 6 recommendations to alleviate the problems identified; and
- 7 (5) Provide a written report on or before December 1,
- 8 2013, and each December 1 thereafter, to the Governor and the
- 9 Legislature concerning the implementation and operation of the
- 10 <u>exchange</u>, challenges and problems identified in the implementation
- 11 and operation of the exchange, and recommendations to address such
- 12 problems and challenges.
- Sec. 6. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
- 14 when passed and approved according to law.
