# A BILL

- FOR AN ACT relating to immunizations; to amend section 79-217,
  Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2012; to change
  provisions relating to booster immunizations; to
  harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 79-217, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2012, is amended to read:
- 3 79-217 (1) Except as provided in sections 79-221 and
- 4 79-222, the school board or board of education of each school
- 5 district and the governing authority of each private, denominational,
- 6 or parochial school in this state shall require each student to be
- 7 protected against measles, mumps, rubella, poliomyelitis, diphtheria,
- 8 pertussis, and tetanus by immunization prior to enrollment. Any
- 9 student who does not comply with this section shall not be permitted
- 10 to continue in school until he or she so complies, except as provided
- 11 by section 79-222. Each school district shall make diligent efforts
- 12 to inform families prior to the date of school registration of the
- immunization requirements of this section.
- 14 (2) Except as provided in sections 79-221 and 79-222, on
- 15 and after July 1, 2010, every student entering the seventh grade
- 16 shall have a booster immunization containing diphtheria and tetanus
- 17 toxoids and an acellular pertussis vaccine which meets the standards
- 18 approved by the United States Public Health Service for such
- 19 biological products, as such standards existed on January 1, 2009.
- 20 (3) Except as provided in sections 79-221 and 79-222, on
- 21 and after July 1, 2014, every student entering the seventh grade and
- 22 <u>at age sixteen shall have a booster immunization containing</u>
- 23 meningococcal conjugate vaccine which meets the standards approved by
- 24 the United States Public Health Service for such biological products,
- 25 <u>as such standards existed on January 1, 2013.</u>

- 1  $\frac{(3)}{(4)}$  Except as provided in the Childhood Vaccine Act,
- 2 the cost of such immunizations shall be borne by the parent or
- 3 guardian of each student who is immunized or by the Department of
- 4 Health and Human Services for those students whose parent or guardian
- 5 is financially unable to meet such cost.
