A BILL

FOR AN ACT relating to political subdivisions; to amend section
2 29-215, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2012; to
3 change provisions relating to contracts for joint law
4 enforcement services; to require creation of a separate
5 entity; and to repeal the original section.
6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 29-215, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2012, is amended to read:
- 3 29-215 (1) A law enforcement officer has the power and
- 4 authority to enforce the laws of this state and of the political
- 5 subdivision which employs the law enforcement officer or otherwise
- 6 perform the functions of that office anywhere within his or her
- 7 primary jurisdiction.
- 8 (2) Any law enforcement officer who is within this state,
- 9 but beyond his or her primary jurisdiction, has the power and
- 10 authority to enforce the laws of this state or any legal ordinance of
- 11 any city or incorporated village or otherwise perform the functions
- 12 of his or her office, including the authority to arrest and detain
- 13 suspects, as if enforcing the laws or performing the functions within
- 14 his or her primary jurisdiction in the following cases:
- 15 (a) Any such law enforcement officer, if in a fresh
- 16 attempt to apprehend a person suspected of committing a felony, may
- 17 follow such person into any other jurisdiction in this state and
- 18 there arrest and detain such person and return such person to the law
- 19 enforcement officer's primary jurisdiction;
- 20 (b) Any such law enforcement officer, if in a fresh
- 21 attempt to apprehend a person suspected of committing a misdemeanor
- 22 or a traffic infraction, may follow such person anywhere in an area
- 23 within twenty-five miles of the boundaries of the law enforcement
- 24 officer's primary jurisdiction and there arrest and detain such
- 25 person and return such person to the law enforcement officer's

1 primary jurisdiction;

2 (c) Any such law enforcement officer shall have such enforcement and arrest and detention authority when responding to a 3 call in which a local, state, or federal law enforcement officer is 4 5 in need of assistance. A law enforcement officer in need of assistance shall mean (i) a law enforcement officer whose life is in 6 7 danger or (ii) a law enforcement officer who needs assistance in 8 making an arrest and the suspect (A) will not be apprehended unless 9 immediately arrested, (B) may cause injury to himself or herself or 10 others or damage to property unless immediately arrested, or (C) may destroy or conceal evidence of the commission of a crime; and 11 12 (d) Any municipality or county may, under the provisions 13 of the Interlocal Cooperation Act or the Joint Public Agency Act, enter into a contract with any other municipality or county for law 14 15 enforcement services or joint law enforcement services. Under such an 16 agreement, law enforcement personnel may have such enforcement authority within the jurisdiction of each of the participating 17 18 political subdivisions if provided for in the agreement. Unless 19 otherwise provided in the agreement, each participating political 20 subdivision shall provide liability insurance coverage for its own 21 law enforcement personnel as provided in section 13-1802. 22 (d) Any municipality, county, law enforcement agency, or department of a state or local government may enter into a contract 23 with any other such entity or public agency for law enforcement 24 services or joint law enforcement services if the contract is entered 25

1 into under the Interlocal Cooperation Act or the Joint Public Agency

- 2 Act. Any contract for joint law enforcement services entered into
- 3 under the Interlocal Cooperation Act shall establish a separate legal
- 4 entity to conduct the joint or cooperative undertaking. Under such a
- 5 contract, law enforcement personnel may have such enforcement
- 6 authority within the jurisdiction of each of the participating public
- 7 agencies if provided for in the contract. Notwithstanding any other
- 8 provision of law, the legal entities for joint law enforcement
- 9 services shall provide liability insurance coverage for joint law
- 10 enforcement personnel and activities that is separate and distinct
- 11 from any liability coverage provided by each participating public
- 12 agency.
- 13 (3) When probable cause exists to believe that a person
- 14 is operating or in the actual physical control of any motor vehicle,
- 15 motorboat, personal watercraft, or aircraft while under the influence
- 16 of alcoholic liquor or of any drug or otherwise in violation of
- 17 section 28-1465, 28-1466, 28-1472, 37-1254.01, 37-1254.02, 60-4,163,
- 18 60-4,164, 60-6,196, 60-6,197, 60-6,211.01, or 60-6,211.02, the law
- 19 enforcement officer has the power and authority to do any of the
- 20 following or any combination thereof:
- 21 (a) Transport such person to a facility outside of the
- 22 law enforcement officer's primary jurisdiction for appropriate
- 23 chemical testing of the person;
- 24 (b) Administer outside of the law enforcement officer's
- 25 primary jurisdiction any post-arrest test advisement to the person;

- 2 (c) With respect to such person, perform other procedures
- 3 or functions outside of the law enforcement officer's primary
- 4 jurisdiction which are directly and solely related to enforcing the
- 5 laws that concern a person operating or being in the actual physical
- 6 control of any motor vehicle, motorboat, personal watercraft, or
- 7 aircraft while under the influence of alcoholic liquor or of any
- 8 other drug or otherwise in violation of section 28-1465, 28-1466,
- 9 28-1472, 37-1254.01, 37-1254.02, 60-4,163, 60-4,164, 60-6,196,
- 10 60-6,197, 60-6,211.01, or 60-6,211.02.
- 11 (4) For purposes of this section:
- 12 (a) Law enforcement officer has the same meaning as peace
- 13 officer as defined in section 49-801 and also includes conservation
- 14 officers of the Game and Parks Commission; and
- 15 (b) Primary jurisdiction means the geographic area within
- 16 the territorial limits of the state or political subdivision which
- 17 employs the law enforcement officer.
