1	FOR AN ACT relating to the Access College Early Scholarship Program
2	Act; to amend section 85-2102, Reissue Revised Statutes
3	of Nebraska, and section 85-2105, Revised Statutes
4	Cumulative Supplement, 2012; to define a term; to change
5	provisions relating to awards; to harmonize provisions;
6	and to repeal the original sections.
7	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 85-2102, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 3 85-2102 For purposes of the Access College Early
- 4 Scholarship Program Act:
- 5 (1) Commission means the Coordinating Commission for
- 6 Postsecondary Education;
- 7 (2) Extreme hardship means any event, including fire,
- 8 illness, accident, or job loss, that has recently resulted in a
- 9 significant financial difficulty for a student or the student's
- 10 parent or legal guardian;
- 11 (3) Postsecondary educational institution means a two-
- 12 year or four-year college or university which is a member institution
- 13 of an accrediting body recognized by the United States Department of
- 14 Education;
- 15 (4) Qualified postsecondary educational institution means
- 16 a postsecondary educational institution located in Nebraska which has
- 17 agreed, on a form developed and provided by the commission, to comply
- 18 with the requirements of the act; and
- 19 <u>(5) Skilled and technical sciences program means a</u>
- 20 <u>curriculum of instruction that includes, but is not limited to:</u>
- 21 Housing and home furnishings; woods and construction; construction-
- 22 electricity; construction-home maintenance; computer-assisted
- 23 <u>drafting; metals and welding; manufacturing-metalworking;</u>
- 24 <u>manufacturing-woodworking; millwork and cabinetmaking; electronics;</u>
- 25 <u>technology engineering education; principles of technology;</u>

- 4 (5) (6) Student means a student attending a Nebraska high
- 5 school with a reasonable expectation that such student will meet the
- 6 residency requirements of section 85-502 upon graduation from a
- 7 Nebraska high school.

- 9 Supplement, 2012, is amended to read:
- 10 85-2105 (1) An applicant for the Access College Early
- 11 Scholarship Program shall complete an application form developed and
- 12 provided by the commission and shall forward the form to his or her
- 13 guidance counselor. Such application shall include, but not be
- 14 limited to, the applicant's high school, social security number, date
- 15 of birth, grade point average, grade level, qualified postsecondary
- 16 educational institution, and information necessary to determine the
- 17 student's eligibility for an award. The guidance counselor shall
- 18 verify the student's eligibility under the Access College Early
- 19 Scholarship Program Act and shall forward the application to the
- 20 commission for review within fifteen days following receipt of the
- 21 form from the student. Notification of tuition and mandatory fees to
- 22 be accrued by the student shall be provided to the commission by the
- 23 student, high school, or qualified postsecondary educational
- 24 institution as determined by the commission.
- 25 (2) The commission shall review the application and

verify the student's eligibility under the act. The commission shall 1 2 notify the student and the student's guidance counselor of the 3 verification of eligibility and the estimated award amount in writing 4 within thirty days following receipt of the form from the student's 5 guidance counselor. The scholarship award shall equal the lesser of tuition and mandatory fees accrued by the student after any discounts 6 7 applicable to such student from the qualified postsecondary 8 educational institution or the tuition and mandatory fees that would have been accrued by the student for the same number of credit hours 9 if the student were taking the course as a full-time, resident, 10 undergraduate student from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. The 11 12 commission shall forward such amount directly to the qualified 13 postsecondary educational institution as payment of such student's

(3) The commission shall make such payments in the order the applications are received, except that the at least twenty-five percent of the award recipients shall be enrolled in a skilled and technical sciences program. The commission may limit the number of scholarships awarded in each term.

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- 20 (4) The commission may limit the number of scholarships a 21 student may receive.
- (5) For any student receiving a scholarship pursuant to
 the act for tuition and mandatory fees, the qualified postsecondary
 educational institution receiving the payment shall report either the
 student's grade for the course or the student's failure to complete

1 the course to the commission within thirty days after the end of the

- 2 course or within one hundred eighty days after receipt of a payment
- 3 pursuant to the act if the course for which the scholarship was
- 4 awarded does not have a specified ending date. The commission shall
- 5 keep the identity of students receiving scholarships confidential,
- 6 except as necessary to comply with the requirements of the act.
