The following constitutes the Report of the Council on Student Attendance including attendance data from the 2015-2016 school year.

The Council shall study and evaluate the data contained in the reports required by section 79-527(2) and develop recommendations to reduce incidents of absenteeism. In addition, the Council shall review school district policies developed under Section 79-209, and consider whether school district policies and practices for addressing absenteeism are operational and effective.

### Report:

A summary report of the 2015-2016 attendance data is attached. As the report shows, the overall number of students who were absent more than twenty school days increased slightly for the fourth consecutive year to 23,245 students, or 7.75% of the total membership in public schools. Last year, the total number was 21,031 students, or 7.10% of the total membership in public schools. Also attached is a chart with NeSA test scores correlated to student attendance. The Council is not suggesting causation between attendance and the achievement data as the specificity of the attendance data does not allow for such analysis.

### Meetings in 2015-2016:

The Council on Student Attendance met quarterly in the 2015-2016 school year, and met both as a full council and in sub-committees to carry out its work: Data, Policy, and Recommendations.

Throughout the year, the work of the council included the following:

- Reviewing and discussing attendance data and reports collected by the Department of Education.
- Revising and developing resources on the Nebraska Department of Education website to support districts in reviewing collaborative plans and reducing incidents of absenteeism.
- Collecting 245 district attendance policies for review.
- Developing board policy recommendations and adopting a local board attendance policy review document disseminated to district superintendents in August 2016.
- Representing the council on a Nebraska team at the Every Student, Every Day Conference, a cross-collaborative meeting hosted by the U.S. Department of Education.
- Council members presenting at the AQuESTT Conference and Administrators' Days to promote attendance and provide resources to support districts in reducing chronic absenteeism.

In August 2016, the State Board of Education reappointed superintendent representative, Tim DeWaard and community advocacy representative, Treva Haugaard, and appointed a new parent representative, Ashley Pano for three year terms.

The Council on Student Attendance will meet quarterly in the 2016-2017 school year. The Council's work in the upcoming year will include reviewing district attendance policies and collaborative plan processes, reviewing 2015-2016 attendance data, continuing work to develop resources and support for schools and districts in an effort to support student attendance, and making specific data recommendations and common definitions to support future data collections. The Council will promote systemic solutions, develop knowledge about the underlying causes of absenteeism, and develop partnerships among schools, families, and communities to decrease referrals to County Attorney offices as much as possible.

As students make their way back into your classrooms and another year commences, I cannot help but think what an exciting time it is to be an educator in Nebraska. We have an opportunity ahead with the reauthorization of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) and the continued development of AQUESTT to chart the future of a system that provides accountability as well as strategic support for continuous improvement aligned to local contexts.

Ensuring the success of every student, every day means identifying unique student needs and tailoring the right solutions. We know that chronic absence is a challenge that has a significant impact on student achievement and that cultivating positive partnerships and relationships with family and community partners is important in overcoming barriers to attendance.

Over the past two years, the Council on Student Attendance has worked toward fulfilling its statutory duty to examine student attendance policies and has developed recommendations to reduce absenteeism. Last year the Council released a resource guide and example collaborative plan to support districts in fulfilling the requirements of Neb. Rev. Stat. § 79-209. This year, the Council is promoting <a href="Attendance Awareness Month">Attendance Awareness Month</a> in September and has adopted an attendance policy review tool that is attached to this email. 

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
# Absences by gender










