## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Under current law, Section 81-2113 allows an individual to register with the State Electrical Board and pay a fee to work as an apprentice electrician. LB 179 would allow an apprentice electrician to renew his or her registration after presenting documentation of successful completion of the requisite number of continuing education hours. If the applicant does not satisfy this requirement of renewal, then the State Electrical Board shall assess up to a 6- month reduction of required experience that is necessary in order to take the examination to

be licensed under the State Electrical Act.

Possible Committee Amendment - Following the bill's introduction, it was brought to my attention by Senator Brasch's office that the Senator would be suggesting a Committee Amendment to address an issue with the language on page 4, line 3. Rather than reading

"assess up to a six-month reduction . . .", it should read "assess up to a six-month increase . . ." since failure to provide documentation that the applicant completed the continuing education requirements should result in an increase in the required experience and not a reduction.

## **Explanation of amendments:**

The amendment strikes the word "reduction" and inserts the word "increase" on page 4, line 3.
