Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB815 would amend 71-963 to clarify the process for removal of restrictions on firearm possession for an individual who has been civilly committed.

The bill provides that the burden of proof is on the petitioner to show that (A) he or she is not likely to act in a manner dangerous to public safety; and (B) removing the petitioner's firearms-related disqualification would not be contrary to the public interest. The bill would require the petitioner to meet the "clear and convincing evidence" standard of proof.
