- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to zoning; to provide for a committee and an
- 2 assessment matrix; and to provide powers and duties.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

LB106 2015

- 1 Section 1. (1) The Director of Agriculture shall appoint a
- 2 <u>committee of experts, not to exceed ten persons, to advise the Department</u>
- 3 of Agriculture on the development of the assessment matrix described in
- 4 subsection (2) of this section. Experts shall include representation from
- 5 <u>county board members, county zoning administrators, livestock production</u>
- 6 agriculture, the University of Nebraska, and other experts as may be
- 7 determined by the director. The committee shall review the matrix
- 8 annually and recommend to the department changes as needed.
- 9 (2) The Department of Agriculture shall, in consultation with the
- 10 committee created under subsection (1) of this section, develop an
- 11 assessment matrix which may be used by county officials to determine
- 12 <u>whether to approve or disapprove a conditional use permit or special</u>
- 13 exception application. The matrix shall be developed within one year
- 14 <u>after the effective date of this act. In the development of the</u>
- 15 assessment matrix, the department shall:
- 16 <u>(a) Consider matrices already developed by the counties and other</u>
- 17 states;
- 18 (b) Design the matrix to produce quantifiable results based on the
- 19 scoring of objective criteria according to an established value scale.
- 20 <u>Each criterion shall be assigned points corresponding to the value scale.</u>
- 21 The matrix shall consider risks and factors mitigating risks if the
- 22 livestock operation were constructed according to the application;
- 23 (c) Assure the matrix is a practical tool for use by persons when
- 24 completing permit applications and by county officials when scoring
- 25 conditional use permit or special exception applications. To every extent
- 26 feasible, the matrix shall include criteria that may be readily scored
- 27 <u>according to ascertainable data and upon which reasonable persons</u>
- 28 familiar with the location of a proposed construction site would not
- 29 ordinarily disagree; and
- 30 (d) Provide for definite point selections for all criteria included
- 31 in the matrix and provide for a minimum threshold total score required to

- 1 receive approval by county officials.
- 2 (3) The Department of Agriculture may develop criteria in the matrix
- 3 <u>which include factors referencing the following:</u>
- 4 (a) Size of operation;
- 5 (b) Type of operation;
- 6 (c) Whether the operation has received or is in the process of
- 7 applying for a permit from the Department of Environmental Quality, if
- 8 required by law;
- 9 (d) Environmental practices adopted by the operation operator which
- 10 may exceed those required by the Department of Environmental Quality;
- 11 (e) Odor control practices;
- 12 <u>(f) Consideration of proximity of a livestock operation to</u>
- 13 <u>neighboring residences, public use areas, and critical public areas;</u>
- 14 (g) Community support and communication with neighbors and other
- 15 community members;
- 16 (h) Manure storage and land application sites and practices;
- 17 (i) Traffic;
- 18 (j) Economic impact to the community; and
- 19 (k) Landscape and aesthetic appearance.
- 20 (4) In developing the matrix, the Department of Agriculture shall
- 21 <u>consider whether the proposed criteria are:</u>
- 22 (a) Protective of public health or safety;
- 23 (b) Practical and workable;
- 24 (c) Cost effective;
- 25 (d) Objective;
- 26 <u>(e) Based on available scientific information that has been</u>
- 27 <u>subjected to peer review;</u>
- 28 <u>(f) Designed to promote the growth and viability of animal</u>
- 29 <u>agriculture in this state;</u>
- 30 (g) Designed to balance the economic viability of farm operations
- 31 with protecting natural resources and other community interests; and

1 (h) Usable by county officials.
