A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to alcoholic liquor; to amend sections 1 2 53-117.07, 53-123.11, 53-130, 53-135, 53-167.02, 53-167.03, 53-1,111, and 53-1,113, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and 3 sections 29-431, 53-101, 53-103, 53-103.03, 53-117, 4 53-123, 5 53-123.15, 53-124, 53-124.01, 53-131, 53-133, and 53-177, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014; to define and redefine terms; 6 7 to prohibit powdered alcohol as prescribed; to provide penalties; to 8 provide for licensure and regulation of pedal-pub vehicles; to provide for manufacture, sale, and distribution of hard cider as 9 prescribed, a limited bottling endorsement, and a nonrefundable tax 10 11 credit for use of certain beer-related crops; to change and eliminate provisions relating to shipping licenses, application for 12 and renewal of licenses, location of licensees, keg sales, and 13 14 disposition of seized alcoholic liquor; to harmonize provisions; to provide operative dates; to provide severability; to repeal the 15 original sections; and to declare an emergency. 16

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Section 1. Section 29-431, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
 2014, is amended to read:

29-431 As used in sections 28-416, 29-422, 29-424, 29-425, 29-431 to 29-434, and 48-1231 and section 8 of this act, unless the context otherwise requires, infraction means the violation of any law, ordinance, order, rule, or regulation, not including those related to traffic, which is not otherwise declared to be a misdemeanor or a felony. Infraction includes violations of section 60-6,267.

9 Sec. 2. Section 53-101, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
10 2014, is amended to read:

53-101 Sections 53-101 to 53-1,122 <u>and sections 5 to 8, 14, 15, and</u>
<u>22 of this act shall be known and may be cited as the Nebraska Liquor</u>
Control Act.

Sec. 3. Section 53-103, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014, is amended to read:

16 53-103 For purposes of the Nebraska Liquor Control Act, the 17 definitions found in sections 53-103.01 to 53-103.43 <u>and sections 5 to 7</u> 18 <u>of this act</u> apply.

Sec. 4. Section 53-103.03, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,20 2014, is amended to read:

53-103.03 Beer means a beverage obtained by alcoholic fermentation of an infusion or concoction of barley or other grain, malt, and hops in water and includes, but is not limited to, beer, ale, stout, lager beer, porter, near beer, and flavored malt beverage, and hard cider.

Sec. 5. <u>Hard cider means still wine (1)(a)(i) derived primarily</u> <u>from apples or apple concentrate and water such that apple juice, or the</u> <u>equivalent amount of concentrate reconstituted to the original brix of</u> <u>the juice prior to concentration, represents more than fifty percent of</u> <u>the volume of the finished product and (ii) containing no other fruit</u> <u>product nor any artificial product which imparts a fruit flavor other</u> <u>than apple or (b)(i) derived primarily from pears or pear concentrate and</u>

1	water such that pear juice, or the equivalent amount of concentrate
2	reconstituted to the original brix of the juice prior to concentration,
3	represents more than fifty percent of the volume of the finished product
4	and (ii) containing no other fruit product nor any artificial product

6	one-half of one percent and less than eight and one-half percent alcohol

9	Sec. 6. <u>Pedal-pub vehicle means a multi-passenger, human-powered</u>
10	<u>vehicle.</u>
11	Sec. 7. Powdered alcohol means alcohol prepared in a powdered form
12	for either direct use or consumption after the powder is combined with a
13	<u>liquid.</u>
14	Sec. 8. <u>(1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (5) of this</u>
15	<u>section, a person shall not purchase, sell, offer to sell, use, or</u>
16	possess with intent to sell powdered alcohol.
17	<u>(2) A person holding a license under the Nebraska Liquor Control Act</u>
18	shall be subject to having the license suspended, canceled, or revoked
19	pursuant to the act for a violation of this section.
20	<u>(3) Any person, other than a person licensed under the act, who</u>
21	<u>sells a powdered alcohol product shall be guilty of a Class I</u>
22	<u>misdemeanor.</u>
23	<u>(4) Any person knowingly or intentionally possessing powdered</u>
24	alcohol shall:
25	<u>(a) For the first offense, be guilty of an infraction, receive a</u>
26	citation, and be fined three hundred dollars;
27	<u>(b) For the second offense, be guilty of a Class IV misdemeanor,</u>
28	receive a citation, and be fined four hundred dollars and may be
29	imprisoned not to exceed five days; and
30	<u>(c) For the third and all subsequent offenses, be guilty of a Class</u>
31	IIIA misdemeanor, receive a citation, be fined five hundred dollars, and

1 be imprisoned not to exceed seven days.

2 (5) This section does not apply to a hospital that operates
3 primarily for the purpose of conducting scientific research, a state
4 institution conducting bona fide research, a private college or
5 university conducting bona fide research, or a pharmaceutical company or
6 biotechnology company conducting bona fide research.

7 Sec. 9. Section 53-117, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,8 2014, is amended to read:

9 53-117 The commission has the following powers, functions, and 10 duties:

(1) To receive applications for and to issue licenses to and
 suspend, cancel, and revoke licenses of manufacturers, wholesalers,
 nonbeverage users, retailers, railroads including owners and lessees of
 sleeping, dining, and cafe cars, airlines, and boats, and pedal-pub
 vehicles in accordance with the Nebraska Liquor Control Act;

16 (2) To fix by rules and regulations the standards of manufacture of 17 alcoholic liquor not inconsistent with federal laws in order to insure the use of proper ingredients and methods in the manufacture and 18 distribution thereof and to adopt and promulgate rules and regulations 19 not inconsistent with federal laws for the proper labeling of containers, 20 barrels, casks, or other bulk containers or of bottles of alcoholic 21 liquor manufactured or sold in this state. The Legislature intends, by 22 23 the grant of power to adopt and promulgate rules and regulations, that 24 the commission have broad discretionary powers to govern the traffic in 25 alcoholic liquor and to enforce strictly all provisions of the act in the interest of sanitation, purity of products, truthful representations, and 26 honest dealings in a manner that generally will promote the public health 27 28 and welfare. All such rules and regulations shall be absolutely binding upon all licensees and enforceable by the commission through the power of 29 suspension or cancellation of licenses, except that all rules and 30 31 regulations of the commission affecting a club possessing any form of

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retail license shall have equal application to all such licenses or shall
 be void;

3 (3) To call upon other administrative departments of the state, 4 county and municipal governments, county sheriffs, city police departments, village marshals, peace officers, and prosecuting officers 5 for such information and assistance as the commission deems necessary in 6 the performance of its duties. The commission shall enter into an 7 agreement with the Nebraska State Patrol in which the Nebraska State 8 9 Patrol shall hire six new patrol officers and, from the entire Nebraska 10 State Patrol, shall designate a minimum of six patrol officers who will spend a majority of their time in administration and enforcement of the 11 Nebraska Liquor Control Act; 12

(4) To recommend to local governing bodies rules and regulations not
inconsistent with law for the distribution and sale of alcoholic liquor
throughout the state;

(5) To inspect or cause to be inspected any premises where alcoholic
liquor is manufactured, distributed, or sold and, when sold on unlicensed
premises or on any premises in violation of law, to bring an action to
enjoin the use of the property for such purpose;

20 (6) To hear and determine appeals from orders of a local governing
21 body in accordance with the act;

(7) To conduct or cause to be conducted an audit to inspect any
licensee's records and books;

(8) In the conduct of any hearing or audit authorized to be held by the commission (a) to examine or cause to be examined, under oath, any licensee and to examine or cause to be examined the books and records of such licensee, (b) to hear testimony and take proof material for its information in the discharge of its duties under the act, and (c) to administer or cause to be administered oaths;

30 (9) To investigate the administration of laws in relation to 31 alcoholic liquor in this and other states and to recommend to the

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Governor and through him or her to the Legislature amendments to the act;
 and

3 (10) To receive, account for, and remit to the State Treasurer state
4 license fees and taxes provided for in the act.

Sec. 10. Section 53-117.07, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, isamended to read:

7 53-117.07 All proceedings for the suspension, cancellation, or revocation of licenses of manufacturers, wholesalers, nonbeverage users, 8 9 craft breweries, microdistilleries, railroads, airlines, shippers, and 10 boats, and pedal-pub vehicles shall be before the commission, and the proceedings shall be in accordance with rules and regulations adopted and 11 promulgated by it not inconsistent with law. No such license shall be so 12 suspended, canceled, or revoked except after a hearing by the commission 13 with reasonable notice to the licensee and opportunity to appear and 14 defend. 15

Sec. 11. Section 53-123, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
2014, is amended to read:

53-123 Licenses issued by the commission shall be of the following 18 types: (1) Manufacturer's license; (2) alcoholic liquor wholesale 19 license, except beer; (3) beer wholesale license; (4) retail license; (5) 20 railroad license; (6) airline license; (7) boat license; (8) nonbeverage 21 22 user's license; (9) farm winery license; (10) craft brewery license; (11) shipping license; (12) special designated license; (13) catering license; 23 24 (14) microdistillery license; and (15) entertainment district license; 25 and (16) pedal-pub vehicle license.

26 Sec. 12. Section 53-123.11, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is 27 amended to read:

28 53-123.11 (1) A farm winery license shall entitle the holder to:

(a) Sell wines produced at the farm winery onsite at wholesale and
retail and to sell wines produced at the farm winery at off-premises
sites holding the appropriate retail license;

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(b) Sell wines produced at the farm winery at retail for consumption
 on the premises;

3 (c)(i) Permit a customer to remove one unsealed bottle of wine for 4 consumption off the premises. The licensee or his or her agent shall (A) 5 securely reseal such bottle and place the bottle in a bag designed so 6 that it is visibly apparent that the resealed bottle of wine has not been 7 opened or tampered with and (B) provide a dated receipt to the customer 8 and attach to such bag a copy of the dated receipt for the resealed 9 bottle of wine.

10 (ii) If the resealed bottle of wine is transported in a motor 11 vehicle, it must be placed in the trunk of the motor vehicle or the area 12 behind the last upright seat of such motor vehicle if the area is not 13 normally occupied by the driver or a passenger and the motor vehicle is 14 not equipped with a trunk;

(d) Ship wines produced at the farm winery by common carrier and 15 16 sold at retail to recipients in and outside the State of Nebraska, if the output of such farm winery for each calendar year as reported to the 17 commission by December 31 of each year does not exceed thirty thousand 18 gallons. In the event such amount exceeds thirty thousand gallons, the 19 farm winery shall be required to use a licensed wholesaler to distribute 20 its wines for the following calendar year, except that this requirement 21 shall not apply to wines produced and sold onsite at the farm winery 22 pursuant to subdivision (1)(a) of this section; 23

(e) Allow sampling of the wine at the farm winery and at one branchoutlet in the state in reasonable amounts;

(f) Sell wines produced at the farm winery to other Nebraska farm
winery licensees, in bulk, bottled, labeled, or unlabeled, in accordance
with 27 C.F.R. 24.308, 27 C.F.R. 24.309, and 27 C.F.R. 24.314, as such
regulations existed on January 1, 2008;

30 (g) Purchase distilled spirits from licensed microdistilleries in
 31 Nebraska, in bulk or bottled, made entirely from Nebraska-licensed farm

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winery wine to be used in the production of fortified wine at the
 purchasing licensed farm winery; and

3 (h) Store and warehouse products produced at the farm winery in a 4 designated, secure, offsite storage facility if the holder of the farm 5 winery license notifies the commission of the location of the facility 6 and maintains, at the farm winery and at the facility, a separate 7 perpetual inventory of the product stored at the facility. Consumption of 8 alcoholic liquor at the facility is strictly prohibited.

9 (2) No farm winery shall manufacture wine in excess of fifty 10 thousand gallons per year.

(3) A farm winery may manufacture and sell hard cider on its
 licensed premises. A farm winery shall not otherwise distribute the hard
 cider it manufactures except by sale to a wholesaler licensed under the
 Nebraska Liquor Control Act.

15 (<u>4</u> <del>3</del>) A holder of a farm winery license may obtain a special
16 designated license pursuant to section 53-124.11.

17 (<u>5</u> 4) A holder of a farm winery license may obtain an annual
 18 catering license pursuant to section 53-124.12.

Sec. 13. Section 53-123.15, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
20 2014, is amended to read:

53-123.15 (1) No person shall order or receive alcoholic liquor in this state which has been shipped directly to him or her from outside this state by any person other than a holder of a shipping license issued by the commission, except that a licensed wholesaler may receive not more than three gallons of wine in any calendar year from any person who is not a holder of a shipping license.

(2) The commission may issue a shipping license to a manufacturer.
Such license shall allow the licensee to ship alcoholic liquor only to a
licensed wholesaler, except that a licensed wholesaler may, without a
shipping license and for the purposes of subdivision (2) of section
53-161, receive beer in this state which has been shipped from outside

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the state by a manufacturer in accordance with the Nebraska Liquor 1 2 Control Act to the wholesaler, then transported by the wholesaler to another state for retail distribution, and then returned by the retailer 3 4 to such wholesaler. A person who receives a license pursuant to this 5 subsection shall pay the fee required in sections 53-124 and 53-124.01 for a manufacturer's shipping license. Such fee shall be collected by the 6 commission and be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the 7 8 General Fund.

9 (3) The commission may issue a shipping license to any person who 10 deals with vintage wines, which shipping license shall allow the licensee to distribute such wines to a licensed wholesaler in the state. For 11 purposes of distributing vintage wines, a licensed shipper must utilize a 12 13 designated wholesaler if the manufacturer has a designated wholesaler. For purposes of this section, vintage wine shall mean a wine verified to 14 be ten years of age or older and not available from a primary American 15 16 source of supply. A person who receives a license pursuant to this 17 subsection shall pay the fee required in sections 53-124 and 53-124.01 for a vintage wine dealer's shipping license. Such fee shall be collected 18 by the commission and be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to 19 the General Fund. 20

(4) The commission may issue a shipping license to any manufacturer 21 who sells and ships alcoholic liquor from another state directly to a 22 consumer in this state if the manufacturer satisfies the requirements of 23 24 subsections (7) through (9) of this section. A manufacturer who receives 25 a license pursuant to this subsection shall pay the fee required in sections 53-124 and 53-124.01 for a manufacture direct sales shipping 26 license. Such fee shall be collected by the commission and remitted to 27 28 the State Treasurer for credit to the Winery and Grape Producers Promotional Fund. 29

30 (5) The commission may issue a shipping license to any retailer who 31 is licensed within or outside Nebraska, who is authorized to sell

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alcoholic liquor at retail in the state of domicile of the retailer, and 1 who is not a manufacturer if such retailer satisfies the requirements of 2 subsections (7) through (9) of this section to ship alcoholic liquor from 3 4 another state directly to a consumer in this state. A retailer who receives a license pursuant to this subsection shall pay the fee required 5 in sections 53-124 and 53-124.01 for a retail direct sales shipping 6 license. Such fee shall be collected by the commission and remitted to 7 the State Treasurer for credit to the Winery and Grape Producers 8 9 Promotional Fund.

10 (6) The application for a shipping license under subsection (2) or 11 (3) of this section shall be in such form as the commission prescribes. 12 The application shall contain all provisions the commission deems proper 13 and necessary to effectuate the purpose of any section of the act and the 14 rules and regulations of the commission that apply to manufacturers and 15 shall include, but not be limited to, provisions that the applicant, in 16 consideration of the issuance of such shipping license, agrees:

17 (a) To comply with and be bound by sections 53-162 and 53-164.01 in
18 making and filing reports, paying taxes, penalties, and interest, and
19 keeping records;

(b) To permit and be subject to all of the powers granted by section 53-164.01 to the commission or its duly authorized employees or agents for inspection and examination of the applicant's premises and records and to pay the actual expenses, excluding salary, reasonably attributable to such inspections and examinations made by duly authorized employees of the commission if within the United States; and

(c) That if the applicant violates any of the provisions of the application or the license, any section of the act, or any of the rules and regulations of the commission that apply to manufacturers, the commission may suspend, cancel, or revoke such shipping license for such period of time as it may determine.

31 (7) The application for a shipping license under subsection (4) or

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1 (5) of this section shall be in such form as the commission prescribes. 2 The application shall require an applicant which is a manufacturer, a craft brewery, a craft distillery, or a farm winery to identify the 3 4 brands of alcoholic liquor that the applicant is requesting the authority to ship either into or within Nebraska. For all applicants, unless 5 otherwise provided in this section, the application shall contain all 6 provisions the commission deems proper and necessary to effectuate the 7 purpose of any section of the act and the rules and regulations of the 8 9 commission that apply to manufacturers or retailers and shall include, but not be limited to, provisions that the applicant, in consideration of 10 the issuance of such shipping license, agrees: 11

(a) To comply with and be bound by sections 53-162 and 53-164.01 in
making and filing reports, paying taxes, penalties, and interest, and
keeping records;

(b) To permit and be subject to all of the powers granted by section 53-164.01 to the commission or its duly authorized employees or agents for inspection and examination of the applicant's premises and records and to pay the actual expenses, excluding salary, reasonably attributable to such inspections and examinations made by duly authorized employees of the commission if within the United States;

(c) That if the applicant violates any of the provisions of the application or the license, any section of the act, or any of the rules and regulations of the commission that apply to manufacturers or retailers, the commission may suspend, cancel, or revoke such shipping license for such period of time as it may determine;

(d) That the applicant agrees to notify the commission of any violations in the state in which he or she is domiciled and any violations of the direct shipping laws of any other states. Failure to notify the commission within thirty days after such a violation may result in a hearing before the commission pursuant to which the license may be suspended, canceled, or revoked; and

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1 (e) That the applicant, if a manufacturer, craft brewery, craft 2 distillery, or farm winery, agrees to notify any wholesaler licensed in Nebraska that has been authorized to distribute such brands that the 3 application has been filed for a shipping license. The notice shall be in 4 writing and in a form prescribed by the commission. The commission may 5 adopt and promulgate rules and regulations as it reasonably deems 6 necessary to implement this subdivision, including rules and regulations 7 that permit the holder of a shipping license under this subdivision to 8 9 amend the shipping license by, among other things, adding or deleting any brands of alcoholic liquor identified in the shipping license. 10

(8) Any manufacturer or retailer who is granted a shipping license
 under subsection (4) or (5) of this section shall:

(a) Only ship the brands of alcoholic liquor identified on theapplication;

(b) Only ship alcoholic liquor that is owned by the holder of theshipping license;

(c) Only ship alcoholic liquor that is properly registered with the
Alcohol and Tobacco Tax and Trade Bureau of the United States Department
of the Treasury;

(d) Not ship any alcoholic liquor products that the manufacturers or
wholesalers licensed in Nebraska have voluntarily agreed not to bring
into Nebraska at the request of the commission;

(e) Not ship more than nine liters of alcoholic liquor per month to
any person in Nebraska to whom alcoholic beverages may be lawfully sold.
All such sales and shipments shall be for personal consumption only and
not for resale; and

(f) Cause the direct shipment of alcoholic liquor to be by approved common carrier only. The commission shall adopt and promulgate rules and regulations pursuant to which common carriers may apply for approval to provide common carriage of alcoholic liquor shipped by a holder of a shipping license issued pursuant to subsection (4) or (5) of this

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section. The rules and regulations shall include provisions that require 1 2 (i) the recipient to demonstrate, upon delivery, that he or she is at least twenty-one years of age, (ii) the recipient to sign an electronic 3 4 or paper form or other acknowledgement of receipt as approved by the 5 commission, and (iii) the commission-approved common carrier to submit to the commission such information as the commission may prescribe. The 6 7 commission-approved common carrier shall refuse delivery when the proposed recipient appears to be under the age of twenty-one years and 8 9 refuses to present valid identification. All holders of shipping licenses 10 shipping alcoholic liquor pursuant to this subdivision shall affix a conspicuous notice in sixteen-point type or larger to the outside of each 11 package of alcoholic liquor shipped within or into the State of Nebraska, 12 13 in a conspicuous location, stating: CONTAINS ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES; SIGNATURE OF PERSON AT LEAST 21 YEARS OF AGE REQUIRED FOR DELIVERY. Any 14 delivery of alcoholic beverages to a minor by a common carrier shall 15 16 constitute a violation by the common carrier. The common carrier and the holder of the shipping license shall be liable only for their independent 17 18 acts.

(9) For purposes of sections 53-160, 77-2703, and 77-27,142, each shipment of alcoholic liquor by the holder of a shipping license under subsection (3), (4), or (5) of this section shall constitute a sale in Nebraska by establishing a nexus in the state. The holder of the shipping license shall collect all the taxes due to the State of Nebraska and any political subdivision and remit any excise taxes monthly to the commission and any sales taxes to the Department of Revenue.

(10) By July 1, 2014, the commission shall report to the General
Affairs Committee of the Legislature the number of shipping licenses
issued for license years 2013-14 and 2014-15. The report shall be made
electronically.

30 Sec. 14. (1) The holder of a Class C license may obtain a limited 31 bottling endorsement for such license as prescribed in this section. The

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endorsement shall be issued for the same period and may be renewed in the 1 2 same manner as the Class C license. A limited bottling endorsement may not be used in conjunction with a special designated license. 3 4 (2) A licensee desiring to obtain a limited bottling endorsement for a license shall file with the commission an application upon such forms 5 as the commission prescribes and a fee of three hundred dollars payable 6 7 to the commission. (3) The holder of a limited bottling endorsement may sell beer for 8 9 consumption off the licensed premises in sealed containers filled as 10 provided in this subsection if: (a) The sale occurs on the licensed premises of the licensee during 11 12 the hours the licensee is authorized to sell beer; 13 (b) The licensee uses sanitary containers purchased by the customer from the licensee or exchanged for containers previously purchased by the 14 15 customer from the licensee. The containers shall prominently display the endorsement holder's trade name or logo or some other mark that is unique 16 17 to the endorsement holder and shall hold no more than thirty-two ounces; 18 (c) The licensee seals the container in a manner designed so that it is visibly apparent whether the sealed container has been tampered with 19 or opened or seals the container and places the container in a bag 20 21 designed so that it is visibly apparent whether the sealed container has 22 been tampered with or opened; and (d) The licensee provides a dated receipt to the customer and 23 attaches a copy of the dated receipt to the sealed container or, if the 24 25 sealed container is placed in a bag, to the bag. 26 Sec. 15. (1) The commission may issue a license to a person to 27 operate a pedal-pub vehicle in this state. Each pedal-pub vehicle license 28 shall expire on April 30 of each year. Each license shall be good throughout this state as a state license. Only one license shall be 29 30 required for all pedal-pub vehicles operated in this state by the same owner. Each owner shall keep a duplicate of such license posted in each 31

pedal-pub vehicle where alcoholic liquor is sold or consumed. No further
license shall be required or tax levied by any county, city, or village
for the privilege of operating a pedal-pub vehicle for the purpose of
selling and allowing the consumption of alcoholic liquor while on or in a
pedal-pub vehicle.

(2) The holder of a pedal-pub vehicle license may sell alcoholic 6 7 liquor in individual drinks to customers who are twenty-one years of age or older to consume while they are on or in the pedal-pub vehicle and may 8 9 allow such customers to consume alcoholic liquor not purchased from the 10 licensee while the customers are on or in the pedal-pub vehicle. The licensee shall serve alcoholic liquor in opaque plastic containers that 11 12 prominently display the licensee's trade name or logo or some other mark 13 that is unique to the licensee under the licensee's pedal-pub vehicle license and shall require the use of such containers for the consumption 14 15 of alcoholic liquor not purchased from the licensee.

16 <u>(3) No customer shall take any open container of alcoholic liquor</u> 17 <u>from the pedal-pub vehicle or consume the alcoholic liquor after leaving</u> 18 <u>the pedal-pub vehicle.
