- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Wage and Hour Act; to amend section
- 2 48-1203, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended by section
- 3 1, Initiative Law 2014, No. 425; to provide a minimum wage for
- 4 certain young student workers; to provide an operative date; and to
- 5 repeal the original section.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 48-1203, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as
- 2 amended by section 1, Initiative Law 2014, No. 425, is amended to read:
- 3 48-1203 (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section and section
- 4 48-1203.01, every employer shall pay to each of his or her employees a
- 5 minimum wage of:
- 6 (a) Seven dollars and twenty-five cents per hour through December
- 7 31, 2014;
- 8 (b) Eight dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2015, through
- 9 December 31, 2015; and
- (c) Nine dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2016.
- 11 (2) For persons compensated by way of gratuities such as waitresses,
- 12 waiters, hotel bellhops, porters, and shoeshine persons, the employer
- 13 shall pay wages at the minimum rate of two dollars and thirteen cents per
- 14 hour, plus all gratuities given to them for services rendered. The sum of
- 15 wages and gratuities received by each person compensated by way of
- 16 gratuities shall equal or exceed the minimum wage rate provided in
- 17 subsection (1) of this section. In determining whether or not the
- 18 individual is compensated by way of gratuities, the burden of proof shall
- 19 be upon the employer.
- 20 (3) Any employer employing student-learners as part of a bona fide
- 21 vocational training program shall pay such student-learners' wages at a
- 22 rate of at least seventy-five percent of the minimum wage rate which
- 23 would otherwise be applicable.
- 24 (4)(a) Any employer employing young student workers shall pay such
- 25 young student workers wages at a rate of at least eight dollars per hour
- 26 or eighty-five percent of the federal minimum wage, whichever is higher.
- 27 <u>No more than one-fourth of the total hours paid by the employer shall be</u>
- 28 at the wage rate prescribed in this subsection.
- 29 (b) For purposes of this subsection, young student worker means any
- 30 person who (i) is eighteen years of age or younger, (ii) does not have a
- 31 high school diploma, (iii) does not have a dependent child as defined in

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1 section 43-504, and (iv) does not qualify for the wage rate prescribed in

- 2 <u>subsection (3) of this section or section 48-1203.01.</u>
- 3 Sec. 2. This act becomes operative on January 1, 2016.
