- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to unsworn declarations; to amend section
- 2 28-915, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 28-915.01,
- 3 Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014; to adopt the Uniform
- 4 Unsworn Foreign Declarations Act; to change provisions relating to
- 5 perjury; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original
- 6 sections.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 28-915, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 2 amended to read:
- 3 28-915 (1) A person is guilty of perjury, a Class III felony, if, in
- 4 any official proceeding, or in any unsworn declaration meeting the
- 5 <u>requirements of the Uniform Unsworn Foreign Declarations Act</u>, he or she
- 6 makes a false statement under oath or equivalent affirmation, or swears
- 7 or affirms the truth of a statement previously made, when the statement
- 8 is material and he or she does not believe it to be true. Perjury is a
- 9 Class III felony.
- 10 (2) A person is guilty of subornation of perjury, a Class III
- 11 felony, if he or she persuades, procures, or suborns any other person to
- commit perjury. <u>Subornation of perjury is a Class III felony.</u>
- 13 (3) A falsification shall be material, regardless of the
- 14 admissibility of the statement under rules of evidence, if it could have
- 15 affected the course or outcome of the proceeding. It shall not be a
- 16 defense that the declarant mistakenly believed the falsification to be
- 17 immaterial. Whether a falsification is material in a given factual
- 18 situation shall be a question of law.
- 19 (4) It shall not be a defense to prosecution under this section that
- 20 the oath or affirmation was administered or taken in an irregular manner
- 21 or that the declarant was not competent to make the statement. A document
- 22 purporting to be made upon oath or affirmation at any time when the actor
- 23 presents it as being so verified, or any unsworn declaration meeting the
- 24 requirements of the Uniform Unsworn Foreign Declarations Act, shall be
- 25 deemed to have been duly sworn or affirmed.
- 26 (5) No person shall be guilty of an offense under this section if he
- 27 or she retracted the falsification in the course of the proceeding in
- 28 which it was made before it became manifest that the falsification was or
- 29 would be exposed and before the falsification substantially affected the
- 30 proceeding.
- 31 (6) When the defendant made inconsistent statements under oath or

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- 1 equivalent affirmation, both having been made within the period of the
- 2 statute of limitations, the prosecution may proceed by setting forth the
- 3 inconsistent statements in a single count alleging in the alternative
- 4 that one or the other was false and not believed by the defendant. In
- 5 such case it shall not be necessary for the prosecution to prove which
- 6 statement was false but only that one or the other was false and not
- 7 believed by the defendant to be true.
- 8 (7) No person shall be convicted of an offense under this section
- 9 when proof of falsity rests solely upon contradiction by testimony of a
- 10 single person other than the defendant.
- 11 Sec. 2. Section 28-915.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 12 2014, is amended to read:
- 13 28-915.01 (1) A person who makes a false statement under oath or
- 14 equivalent affirmation, or swears or affirms the truth of such a
- 15 statement previously made, <u>including an oath or affirmation made that</u>
- 16 meets the requirements of the Uniform Unsworn Foreign Declarations Act,
- 17 when he or she does not believe the statement to be true, is guilty of a
- 18 Class I misdemeanor if the falsification:
- 19 (a) Occurs in an official proceeding; or
- 20 (b) Is intended to mislead a public servant in performing his or her
- 21 official function.
- 22 (2) A person who makes a false statement under oath or equivalent
- 23 affirmation, or swears or affirms the truth of such a statement
- 24 previously made, including an oath or affirmation made that meets the
- 25 requirements of the Uniform Unsworn Foreign Declarations Act, when he or
- 26 she does not believe the statement to be true, is guilty of a Class II
- 27 misdemeanor if the statement is one which is required by law to be sworn
- 28 or affirmed before a notary or other person authorized to administer
- 29 oaths.
- 30 (3) Subsections (4) through (7) of section 28-915 shall apply to
- 31 subsections (1) and (2) of this section.

- 1 (4) This section shall not apply to reports, statements, affidavits,
- 2 or other documents made or filed pursuant to the Nebraska Political
- 3 Accountability and Disclosure Act.
- 4 Sec. 3. <u>Sections 3 to 10 of this act shall be known and may be</u>
- 5 <u>cited as the Uniform Unsworn Foreign Declarations Act.</u>
- 6 Sec. 4. In the Uniform Unsworn Foreign Declarations Act:
- 7 (1) Boundaries of the United States means the geographic boundaries
- 8 of the United States, Puerto Rico, the United States Virgin Islands, and
- 9 any territory or insular possession subject to the jurisdiction of the
- 10 United States.
- 11 (2) Law includes the federal or a state constitution, a federal or
- 12 <u>state statute, a judicial decision or order, a rule of court, an</u>
- 13 executive order, and an administrative rule, regulation, or order.
- 14 (3) Record means information that is inscribed on a tangible medium
- or that is stored in an electronic or other medium and is retrievable in
- 16 perceivable form.
- 17 <u>(4) Sign means, with present intent to authenticate or adopt a</u>
- 18 record:
- 19 (A) to execute or adopt a tangible symbol; or
- 20 (B) to attach to or logically associate with the record an
- 21 <u>electronic symbol, sound, or process.</u>
- 22 (5) State means a state of the United States, the District of
- 23 <u>Columbia, Puerto Rico, the United States Virgin Islands, or any territory</u>
- 24 or insular possession subject to the jurisdiction of the United States.
- 25 (6) Sworn declaration means a declaration in a signed record given
- 26 under oath. The term includes a sworn statement, verification,
- 27 <u>certificate</u>, and affidavit.
- 28 <u>(7) Unsworn declaration means a declaration in a signed record that</u>
- 29 <u>is not given under oath, but is given under penalty of perjury.</u>
- 30 Sec. 5. The Uniform Unsworn Foreign Declarations Act applies to an
- 31 unsworn declaration by a declarant who at the time of making the

- 1 declaration is physically located outside the boundaries of the United
- 2 States whether or not the location is subject to the jurisdiction of the
- 3 United States. The act does not apply to a declaration by a declarant who
- 4 is physically located on property that is within the boundaries of the
- 5 United States and subject to the jurisdiction of another country or a
- 6 federally recognized Indian tribe.
- 7 Sec. 6. (a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) of this
- 8 <u>section</u>, if a law of this state requires or permits use of a sworn
- 9 declaration, an unsworn declaration meeting the requirements of the
- 10 <u>Uniform Unsworn Foreign Declarations Act has the same effect as a sworn</u>
- 11 declaration.
- (b) The act does not apply to:
- 13 <u>(1) a deposition;</u>
- 14 (2) an oath of office;
- 15 (3) an oath required to be given before a specified official other
- 16 than a notary public;
- 17 (4) a declaration to be recorded pursuant to a filing of a lien on
- 18 real estate; or
- 19 <u>(5) an oath required by section 30-2329.</u>
- 20 Sec. 7. <u>If a law of this state requires that a sworn declaration be</u>
- 21 presented in a particular medium, an unsworn declaration must be
- 22 presented in that medium.
- 23 Sec. 8. An unsworn declaration under the Uniform Unsworn Foreign
- 24 Declarations Act must be in substantially the following form:
- 25 I declare under penalty of perjury under the law of the State of
- 26 <u>Nebraska that the foregoing is true and correct, and that I am physically</u>
- 27 <u>located outside the geographic boundaries of the United States, Puerto</u>
- 28 Rico, the United States Virgin Islands, and any territory or insular
- 29 <u>possession subject to the jurisdiction of the United States.</u>
