## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 29**

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to amend section 79-248, Reissue
- 2 Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change provisions relating to
- 3 health inspections as prescribed; to harmonize provisions; and to
- 4 repeal the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 79-248, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read:

(1) Every school district shall cause children under its 79-248 jurisdiction to be separately and carefully inspected, except as otherwise provided in this section, to ascertain if a child is suffering from (1) defective sight or hearing or , (2) dental defects, or (3) other conditions as prescribed by the Department of Health and Human Services. Such inspections shall be conducted on a schedule prescribed by the department and shall be based on current medical and public health practice. If such inspection determines that any child has such condition, the school shall notify the parent of the child in writing of such condition and explain to such parent the necessity of professional attendance for such child. 

(2) Whenever a child apparently shows symptoms of any contagious or infectious disease, such child shall be sent home immediately or as soon as safe and proper conveyance can be found and the proper school authority, school board, or board of education shall be at once notified. Such student may be excluded from school as provided in section 79-264.

(3) A child shall not be required to submit to an inspection required by <u>subsection (1) of</u> this section if his or her parent or guardian provides school authorities with <u>a written statement signed by the parent or guardian stating that the parent or guardian objects to the child's <u>submitting to such inspection or</u> a statement signed by a physician, a physician assistant, er an advanced practice registered nurse, <u>a dentist</u>, or an optometrist practicing under and in accordance with his or her respective credentialing act or other qualified provider as identified by the department in rules and regulations adopted pursuant to section 79-249, stating that such child has undergone such required inspection <u>on or after May 1 immediately preceding the first day of the school year during which such health inspections are conducted by the school district within the past six months.
