- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to appropriations; to amend section 85-1412,
- 2 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 71-7611, Revised
- 3 Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014; to state intent relating to
- 4 appropriations for education and training in high-need fields; to
- 5 provide duties for the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary
- 6 Education; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original
- 7 sections.
- 8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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- 1 Section 1. It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate (1)
- 2 three million dollars from the General Fund, one million dollars from the
- 3 Health Care Cash Fund, and one million dollars from the Job Training Cash
- 4 Fund for fiscal year 2015-16 and (2) three million dollars from the
- 5 General Fund, one million dollars from the Health Care Cash Fund, and one
- 6 million dollars from the Job Training Cash Fund for fiscal year 2016-17
- 7 to the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education for the
- 8 purpose of providing financial support for training and education
- 9 programs in high-need fields to public and private nonprofit two-year and
- 10 four-year postsecondary educational institutions in Nebraska.
- 11 For purposes of this section and section 2 of this act, high-need
- 12 fields means: Construction trades; transportation, warehousing, and
- 13 <u>distribution logistics; science, technology, engineering, and mathematics</u>
- 14 (STEM) education; health care and health services; business
- 15 administration; and teacher education.
- 16 Sec. 2. The Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education
- 17 <u>shall distribute one-half of the funds appropriated pursuant to section 1</u>
- 18 of this act to two-year postsecondary educational institutions and shall
- 19 distribute one-half of such funds to four-year postsecondary educational
- 20 institutions. The funds shall be distributed to students enrolled in
- 21 <u>high-need fields at a postsecondary educational institution based on the</u>
- 22 <u>number of certificates, awards, and degrees awarded during the preceding</u>
- 23 fiscal year in high-need fields at that postsecondary educational
- 24 institution. In order to reduce the administrative costs, the commission
- 25 shall distribute such funds to the postsecondary educational institutions
- 26 which shall act as agents of the commission in the distribution of the
- 27 <u>funds to such students. The commission may adopt and promulgate rules and</u>
- 28 regulations to carry out this section.
- 29 Sec. 3. Section 71-7611, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 30 2014, is amended to read:
- 31 71-7611 (1) The Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund is created. The State

- Treasurer shall transfer (a) fifty-six million one hundred thousand 1 dollars no later than July 15, 2009, (b) fifty-nine million one hundred 2 thousand dollars on or before July 15, 2010, July 15, 2011, July 15, 3 4 2012, and July 15, 2013, and (c) sixty million one hundred thousand dollars on or before July 15, 2014, and on or before every July 15 5 thereafter from the Nebraska Medicaid Intergovernmental Trust Fund and 6 the Nebraska Tobacco Settlement Trust Fund to the Nebraska Health Care 7 Cash Fund, except that such amount shall be reduced by the amount of the 8 9 unobligated balance in the Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund at the time the transfer is made. The state investment officer upon consultation with the 10 Nebraska Investment Council shall advise the State Treasurer on the 11 amounts to be transferred from the Nebraska Medicaid Intergovernmental 12 Trust Fund and from the Nebraska Tobacco Settlement Trust Fund under this 13 14 section in order to sustain such transfers in perpetuity. The state investment officer shall report electronically to the Legislature on or 15 16 before October 1 of every even-numbered year on the sustainability of such transfers. Except as otherwise provided by law, no more than the 17 amount specified in this subsection may be appropriated or transferred 18 from the Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund in any fiscal year. 19
- Except as provided in section 1 of this act, it It is the intent of the Legislature that no additional programs are funded through the Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund until funding for all programs with an appropriation from the fund during FY2012-13 are restored to their FY2012-13 levels.
- (2) Any money in the Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund available for investment shall be invested by the state investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.
- 29 (3) The University of Nebraska and postsecondary educational 30 institutions having colleges of medicine in Nebraska and their affiliated 31 research hospitals in Nebraska, as a condition of receiving any funds

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- 1 appropriated or transferred from the Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund,
- 2 shall not discriminate against any person on the basis of sexual
- 3 orientation.
- 4 Sec. 4. Section 85-1412, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 5 amended to read:
- 6 85-1412 The commission shall have the following additional powers
- 7 and duties:
- 8 (1) Conduct surveys and studies as may be necessary to undertake the
- 9 coordination function of the commission pursuant to section 85-1403 and
- 10 request information from governing boards and appropriate administrators
- 11 of public institutions and other governmental agencies for research
- 12 projects. All public institutions and governmental agencies receiving
- 13 state funds shall comply with reasonable requests for information under
- 14 this subdivision. Public institutions may comply with such requests
- 15 pursuant to section 85-1417;
- 16 (2) Recommend to the Legislature and the Governor legislation it
- 17 deems necessary or appropriate to improve postsecondary education in
- 18 Nebraska and any other legislation it deems appropriate to change the
- 19 role and mission provisions in sections 85-917 to 85-966.01. The
- 20 recommendations submitted to the Legislature shall be submitted
- 21 electronically;
- 22 (3) Establish any advisory committees as may be necessary to
- 23 undertake the coordination function of the commission pursuant to section
- 24 85-1403 or to solicit input from affected parties such as students,
- 25 faculty, governing boards, administrators of the public institutions,
- 26 administrators of the private nonprofit institutions of postsecondary
- 27 education and proprietary institutions in the state, and community and
- 28 business leaders regarding the coordination function of the commission;
- 29 (4) Participate in or designate an employee or employees to
- 30 participate in any committee which may be created to prepare a
- 31 coordinated plan for the delivery of educational programs and services in

- 1 Nebraska through the telecommunications system;
- 2 (5) Seek a close liaison with the State Board of Education and the
- 3 State Department of Education in recognition of the need for close
- 4 coordination of activities between elementary and secondary education and
- 5 postsecondary education;
- 6 (6) Administer the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System or
- 7 other information system or systems to provide the commission with
- 8 timely, comprehensive, and meaningful information pertinent to the
- 9 exercise of its duties. The information system shall be designed to
- 10 provide comparable data on each public institution. The commission shall
- 11 also administer the uniform information system prescribed in sections
- 12 85-1421 to 85-1427 known as the Nebraska Educational Data System. Public
- 13 institutions shall supply the appropriate data for the information system
- 14 or systems required by the commission;
- 15 (7) Administer (a) the Access College Early Scholarship Program Act,
- 16 (b) the Community College Aid Act, (c) the Nebraska Community College
- 17 Student Performance and Occupational Education Grant Fund under the
- 18 direction of the Nebraska Community College Student Performance and
- 19 Occupational Education Grant Committee, (d) the Nebraska Opportunity
- 20 Grant Act, and (e) the Postsecondary Institution Act;
- 21 (8) Accept and administer loans, grants, and programs from the
- 22 federal or state government and from other sources, public and private,
- 23 for carrying out any of its functions, including the administration of
- 24 privately endowed scholarship programs and administration of aid pursuant
- 25 to section 2 of this act. Such loans and grants shall not be expended for
- 26 any other purposes than those for which the loans and grants were
- 27 provided. The commission shall determine eligibility for such loans,
- 28 grants, and programs, and such loans and grants shall not be expended
- 29 unless approved by the Governor;
- 30 (9) On or before December 1 of each even-numbered year, submit to
- 31 the Legislature and the Governor a report of its objectives and

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- 1 activities and any new private colleges in Nebraska and the
- 2 implementation of any recommendations of the commission for the preceding
- 3 two calendar years. The report submitted to the Legislature shall be
- 4 submitted electronically;
- 5 (10) Provide staff support for interstate compacts on postsecondary
- 6 education; and
- 7 (11) Request inclusion of the commission in any existing grant
- 8 review process and information system.
- 9 Sec. 5. Original section 85-1412, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 10 Nebraska, and section 71-7611, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 11 2014, are repealed.
