## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 595**

Introduced by Davis, 43.

Read first time January 21, 2015

Committee: Education

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to create the Task Force on School
- 2 Construction Assistance; to provide duties for the task force; to
- 3 provide a duty to the State Department of Education to establish a
- 4 data base; and to declare an emergency.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. (1) The Task Force on School Construction Assistance is
- 2 created. The task force shall consist of ten members appointed by the
- 3 Governor with approval of the Legislature, and two nonvoting members of
- 4 the Legislature appointed by the Executive Board of the Legislature. All
- 5 appointments to the task force shall be completed within ninety days
- 6 after the effective date of this act.
- 7 (2) The members of the task force appointed by the Governor shall
- 8 include representatives of education, business, the local community,
- 9 government, and at least one expert on capital construction. At least one
- 10 member representing education shall represent a school district with
- 11 preschool through twelfth grade and if there are additional members
- 12 <u>appointed representing education, the additional members shall represent</u>
- 13 school districts with grades kindergarten through twelfth and reflect a
- 14 diverse range of school district sizes. To the extent practicable, the
- 15 <u>members shall represent a geographic diversity.</u>
- 16 (3) The task force shall meet and investigate issues regarding
- 17 <u>school construction assistance. The task force shall make recommendations</u>
- 18 on the following:
- 19 (a) Capital infrastructure systems and funding sources to provide
- 20 school districts with state financial assistance for qualifying
- 21 construction projects, including new construction and repair and
- 22 replacement of existing facilities. The recommended systems and funding
- 23 sources shall (i) allow providers of public education to respond to
- 24 evolving methods of delivering education and to the funding and
- 25 maintaining of capital infrastructures, (ii) reduce the reliance of
- 26 school districts on property taxes for the retirement of bonded
- 27 <u>indebtedness</u>, and (iii) consider the feasibility of debt pooling to
- 28 reduce interest rates; and
- 29 <u>(b) The types and amounts of technical assistance that may be</u>
- 30 required by public schools for school capital construction programs.
- 31 (4) When recommending the capital infrastructure systems described

- 1 in subdivision (a) of subsection (3) and the technical assistance
- 2 <u>described in subdivision (a) of subsection (3), the task force shall</u>
- 3 recommend the appropriate role of the State Department of Education in
- 4 supporting the capital infrastructure systems and providing the technical
- 5 <u>assistance.</u>
- 6 (5) A majority of the members of the task force shall constitute a
- 7 quorum for the transaction of business. Official action by the task force
- 8 requires the approval of a majority of the members of the task force. The
- 9 task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson. If
- 10 there is a vacancy for any cause, the Governor shall make an appointment
- 11 <u>to become effective immediately. The task force shall meet at times and</u>
- 12 places specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the
- 13 members of the task force. The department shall provide staff support to
- 14 the task force and shall, if requested by the task force, enter into a
- 15 <u>contract for staff support with a public or private entity.</u>
- 16 (6) The task force shall submit a report electronically, including
- 17 recommendations, to the Education Committee and Appropriations Committee
- 18 of the Legislature and the department no later than November 1, 2016.
- 19 (7) Members of the task force are not entitled to compensation, but
- 20 <u>may be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses as provided in</u>
- 21 <u>sections 81-1174 to 81-1177.</u>
- 22 (8) All agencies of state government are directed to assist the task
- 23 force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by
- 24 laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice
- 25 to the members of the task force for the purpose of performing their
- 26 duties.
- 27 Sec. 2. <u>(1) The State Department of Education shall establish and</u>
- 28 maintain a public education facility information data base.
- 29 (2) The data base shall provide information on preschool facilities,
- 30 facilities serving any grades kindergarten through twelfth, and any
- 31 related auxiliary buildings and properties. The department may require

1 school districts and educational service units to provide the following

- 2 <u>information to the department for inclusion in the data base:</u>
- 3 (a) The name of the facility;
- 4 (b) The square footage of the facility;
- 5 (c) The year the facility was built;
- 6 (d) The major renovations made to the facility in the preceding
- 7 thirty years;
- 8 <u>(e) The outstanding bonded indebtedness of the school district or</u>
- 9 <u>educational service unit;</u>
- 10 (f) The year, amount, and purpose of the last bond request approved
- 11 by voters of the school district or educational service unit;
- 12 (g) Operations and maintenance costs of the facility;
- 13 (h) Technical upgrades needed for the facility;
- (i) Health and safety upgrades needed for the facility;
- 15 (j) Energy conservation projects that have been implemented in the
- 16 facility within the last twenty years;
- 17 (k) Energy usage of the facility; and
- 18 (1) Other publicly available information about the facility.
- 19 (3) In addition to the requirements of subsection (2) of this
- 20 <u>section, the data base shall be made available to the public by the</u>
- 21 <u>department and may include functions and other options that are available</u>
- 22 only to the department and school districts.
- 23 (4) If a school district or educational service unit is unable to
- 24 provide any of the information required under subsection (2) of this
- 25 section from existing data or without acquiring additional resources, the
- 26 school district or educational service unit may request a waiver of the
- 27 requirement for that information from the Commissioner of Education.
- 28 (5) The department may enter into a contract with a public or
- 29 private entity for the purpose of maintaining the facility information
- 30 <u>data base described in this section.</u>
- 31 Sec. 3. The intent of the Legislature is to appropriate \$100,000

- 4 Sec. 4. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
- 5 passed and approved according to law.
